Hello everyone. I can't believe how quickly this year is going. This year 2020 is a year that we won't forget in a hurry with massive bushfires, drought, floods and now coronavirus to keep us all on our toes.

With this coronavirus spreading as fast as it seems to be, we must all ensure that personal hygiene is foremost in our minds and that we keep a safe distance from others if possible when in public areas. People who have travelled overseas are required to self isolate for a period of 14 days and we must ensure as a community that we



observe these requirements in order to guard against this pandemic. I for one am glad I don't live in a big city.

Council's year is progressing as usual with roadworks, parks and gardens in all Shire communities as well as ongoing flood mitigation works. At our Council meeting Councillors mentioned a number of roads that needed attention after recent rains and our engineer is inspecting these roads and endeavouring to rectify problem areas as quickly as possible.

With everything happening as mentioned it is easy to forget that many are still suffering as a result of drought. The criteria has been made much easier to qualify for "household assistance". Council's website has contact details for where you can obtain further information on the various forms of drought assistance available. A simple phone call may make a great deal of difference to your circumstances.

Remember Council elections are to be held in September this year and if you believe you would like a chance to represent your community, consider nominating yourself. Contact the Shire Council for more information.

Lastly as is the case for many public gatherings, Anzac Day remembrance services have been cancelled for this year due to the coronavirus.

Council Snippets 16 March 2020

Works

The current status of Council's works program is summarised below.

- Urana Road (MR 59): Approximately 9 kilometres of Urana Road shoulder widening works have been completed to date. Also completed table drains and • batters.
- Flood Detour Road: Culverts have been installed. Base and sub-base as well as drainage works are mostly completed.
- Western Road (R2R): Sealing of Western Road has been completed with batters and signage installed in February 2020.
- Henty-Pleasant Hills Road (R2R): Commenced rehabilitation works with seal completed in February 2020.
- The Rock-Mangoplah Road: To commence rehabilitation work in early March.
- Urana Road and Narrandera Road: To commence once Transport for NSW has • approved the designs.
- HVSPP culvert upgrades: Culverts installed at Flood Detour Road and culverts ordered and delivered at Grubben Road, The Rock-Bullenbong Road and The Rock-Lockhart
 Road.
- Grading and minor gravelling of unsealed roads: Continuing in accordance with the 12 -month programme.

Major Projects

Council is currently undertaking a number of major projects and the status of each of these is as follows:

 Demolition of Voluntary Purchase Properties: Council has been successful with its grant application to continue the Voluntary Purchase of properties in Lockhart for the next three years, commencing 1 July 2019. Council has secured another property and has signed contracts for the purchase and settlement has now been completed. A contractor has been appointed and demolition work will be starting during the first week of March.

- Mitigation Construction-Lockhart: Flood Council has been successful with the grant application for Stage 2 flood mitigation works in Lockhart, being the drainage system east of the Industrial Park. Council has engaged Mitchell Constructions (NSW) P/L to undertake the project, who has now completed the main drain component of the project, the installation of the new culverts on the Albury Road and the new culverts on The Rock-Lockhart Road Work has commenced on the rail culverts and the works are expected to be completed by 16 March 2020.
- Flood Detour Road Rail Culvert Construction-Lockhart: Work has commenced on the rail culverts and the works are expected to be completed by 16 March 2020.
- Flood Mitigation Construction-The Rock: Council has been notified that the grant application has been approved for Stage 2 flood mitigation works at The Rock, being the drainage works along Nicholas, Yerong and Urana Streets. Tenders were invited for the works. Following the assessment of the tenders received the cost of the works was found to be significantly higher than estimated in previous studies commissioned by Council and significantly higher than the funding received by Council. In view of the circumstances Council has resolved to make a fresh grant

to seek increased grant funding.

Road Safety

- the basis of Council's Strategic Road Safety driveway. Plan and will be used for grant applications in the future.
- RYDA young driver program held on 25 February 2020 at Leeton: Over 100 students attended with 8 from Lockhart.
- Road User Safety Network meeting was held on 10 & 11 March in Wagga Wagga.
- A Lockhart Shire Council outdoor staff training day is scheduled for 20 March 2020 with the Road Safety Officer presenting on safe driving practices.
- Road Safety Summit meeting: The Road Safety Officer will attend the meeting in Sydney on 23 March 2020 to discuss current campaigns and whether they have the desired impact.
- Active Transport Submissions: Submissions closed on 21 February 2020. Lockhart Shire Council submitted several shared path linkages for funding.

Traffic Committee:

The Local Traffic Committee recommended that due to the reduced sight distance from • large trees and the crest to the south of the intersection on Western Road, a "Stop Sign Ahead", "Stop" signs and supplemented pavement markings be installed to replace the "Giveway" and faded "Giveway Sign Ahead" signs.

Council has received a request from a local bus operator to install a SCHOOL BUS warning

application based on the tenders received sign on Osbourne Yerong Road YERONG CREEK at the property entrance named "Grubben". The bus operator picks up 3 school age children at this rural property address. Biosecurity and Environment

- Property Inspections: Inspections were carried out on residential, rural and commercial properties, which were selected due a change in ownership or, known past weed infestations.
- The weeds most commonly found were Privet (Ligustrum sp.), African boxthorn (Lycium ferocissimum), Bathurst burr (Xanthium spinosum), Coolatai arass (Hvparrhenia hirta). Green cestrum (Cestrum parqui), Horehound (Marrubium vulgare), Silverleaf nightshade (Solanum elaeagnifolium), and Willow (Salix sp.).
- Control Program: Priority has been given to the control of Bathurst burrs (Xanthium spinosum). Feathertop Rhodes grass (Chloris virgata), Silverleaf nightshade (Solanum elaeagnifolium), St John's wort (Hypericum perforatum), and burrgrass (Cenchrus spinifex) on roadside reserves
- drumMUSTER: The March drumMUSTER collection events were scheduled to occur at Lockhart on Tuesday, 10 March, managed by St Joseph's School, and at The Rock on Thursday, 12 managed by The Rock Men's Shed.
- Common White Snail Baiting Program: Snail baiting application occurred Fairview Lane on 4 February.

 Autumn Fox Baiting Program: Fox baiting is scheduled to commence on 16 March on the Galore Hill Scenic Reserve and Kincaid's Reserve. Replacements of baits will continue through until mid-April.

Parks and Gardens

- Swimming Pools: The Rock Pool hosted another successful Australia Day Celebration with almost 300 people through the gate on the day. Both pools had attendances of around 3,000 patrons for January. February figures have dropped off with the temperatures. With mid 30's feeling much cooler than the 40 pluses of January and December and with kids heading back to school, numbers have reduced but are still around the historical average for February.
- Inclusive Playground, The Rock Recreation Ground: Playground equipment, rubber softfall and water fountain have been installed. The shelter extension for the BBQ and footpaths are underway. Landscaping, irrigation and installation of furniture has also commenced.
- Mowing and Slashing: The autumn mowing schedule has commenced. Lockhart

- entrances have been a priority leading up to the annual truck show at the showground. Irrigated areas have had good growth in February due to some decent showers of rain with some areas requiring extra mowing to be scheduled. The fortnightly mowing schedule should continue until the onset of cooler temperatures toward the end of autumn.
- Weed Control (Townships): Khaki and Cathead are being chipped and sprayed in known problem areas; recent rain has renewed growth and many areas will require follow up treatment. Any assistance from residents in the form of reporting infestations to controlling outbreaks adjacent to their properties is appreciated. Regular spraying and weeding of urban areas will continue throughout March.
 - Trees: Regular watering of street trees planted in the last two years has been scheduled throughout summer and will continue until trees enter dormancy.





LOCKHART LOCAL HEALTH ADVISORY COMMITTEE


It's full steam ahead for Lockhart Local Health Advisory Committee (LHAC), which held an election of office bearers and began discussing projects for 2020 earlier this week.

Well-known local woman and health advocate Fran Day was elected as the new LHAC Chair while new member Tanya Gleeson was elected Vice Chair. Larraine Hoffman was elected Secretary and Peter Veneris remains in the role of Communication Officer.

Members discussed some of the key priority areas for health service in the area and will meet again to determine their priority projects for the next 12-18 months. An initial priority will be to encourage local residents to provide feedback to the 2020 Community Survey, so that Murrumbidgee Local Health District (MLHD) has a better idea on how community likes to be communicated with, and to focus on working together to improve awareness and access to health services in the region.

LHACs play a key role in this, forming a link between the community and the health service and are a valued part of the MLHD and the Murrumbidgee Primary Health Network (MPHN) team. The LHAC is supported by Dean Marchioni (Lockhart MPS Manager, MLHD), Abrie Schutte (MPHN).

MLHD works in partnership with the MPHN to improve the health literacy of the community and to drive improvements in the regional health system in the provision of integrated, patient-centred care.



INSTALLATION OF SHIPPING CONTAINER IN RESIDENTIAL AREAS

Do I need approval from Council to install a shipping container?

Yes, Containers may only be installed with the prior consent of Council. This is a simple and effective method of ensuring that the all relevant planning considerations are addressed, and appropriate decisions made.

As the developer, you will be required to:

- 1. Lodge a Development Application and Statement of Environmental effects
- Submit a site plan, showing size and location of shipping container on your land
- 3. A development application fee applies, currently \$110.

In assessing your application, Council will require:

- 1. Notification by Council to adjacent property owners
- 2. The container to be installed plumb and true, installed on concrete blocks (or similar)
- 3. The container to be painted
- 4. The container to comply with Council's Development Control Plan Building line setback.
- 5. Any other conditions to be imposed that may be considered reasonable.

DEVIL'S CLAW—PURPLE FLOWERED



Proboscidea Iouisianica

Other Common Names: Louisiana devil's claw; Ram's horn; Unicorn plant; Proboscis flower.

Description: An annual low, spreading, bushy plant, growing up to 50 centimetres high. Native to America. Known to infest pastures, resulting in reduced carrying capacity.

Leaves: Large rounded, heart-shaped or lobed leaves, covered with glandular nectar.

Flowers: Trumpet-shaped or tubular, five- lobed flowers. Creamy-white or creamy-yellow to mauve or purple flowers with dark purple and orange markings, including spotting. Flowers appear in axillary clusters after summer rains.

Fruits: A fleshy, curved pod that becomes a woody seed capsules as it dries. The beak of the seed capsule splits lengthwise to form two long curved claws. This development enables the fruits to be easily caught on the legs of livestock and feral animals, and hooks in the wool of sheep, reducing wool quality as well as providing seed dispersal.

The woody seed capsules cause injury to livestock where lodged: restricting feeding if lodged on the face, leading to eventual death from starvation; and causing lameness if attached to hooves.

Priority weed: Devil's claw is considered a priority weed in the Lockhart Shire.



Any person who deals with any plant, who knows (or ought to know) of any biosecurity risk, has a duty to ensure the risk is prevented, eliminated or minimised, so far as is reasonably practicable.

From 1 April 2020, a new FOGO bin (Food Organics Garden Organics) will be added to kerbside collection.
