

4.6% SPECIAL RATE VARIATION

Council will apply to the Independent Regulatory and Pricing Tribunal (IPART) for a Special Rate Variation to commence in the 2017/18 financial year. Council is seeking approval for a 4.6% rate increase for the next 10 years. The 4.6% Special Rate Variation will be inclusive of the annual Rate Peg amount which IPART determines each year that NSW Councils can currently increase their rates annually.

If the Special Rate Variation is successful, for 2017/18 this will result in the Rate Peg of 1.5% plus Rate Variation of 3.1% for a total Special Rate Variation of 4.6%.

Support from the community

As part of the Fit for the Future process in April 2015 the community were well informed on the process of a Special Rate Variation through local media, newsletters, emails and social media, with community meetings held throughout the Shire to ensure everyone had the opportunity to understand the process and express any concerns. Council received 80% support through the five community meetings that were held.

Additional community input was sought in October 2016 to inform the community about the Special Rate Variation and how this would impact on ratepayers. Five meetings were held throughout the Shire at different locations, with 72% supporting the proposed Special Rate Variation.

What is the Special Rate Variation?

THE Special Rate Variation (SRV) is an increase in rates above the rate peg set by the Independent Pricing and Regulatory Tribunal (IPART) each year. Lockhart Shire Council has applied for a one off Special Rate Variation of 4.6% which includes Rate Pegging to be applied in 2017/18 and maintained for 10 years.

When will we know if it has been successful?

It is expected that a decision on Councils application will be made by IPART in May 2017. This information will be made available on IPART's website, Council's website, newsletter and local media.

How does this impact my rates?

The impact on your rates will depend on what rate category your property is in and how much the land is valued. The percentage increase is the same for all rate categories though.

Indicative impact on the typical *General Rate* component for all categories is set out below:

What does this pay for?

- \$2.98 million of Flood Mitigation works
- \$4.2 million Lockhart Swimming Pool and The Rock Swimming Pool
- \$1 million Road Infrastructure

The rate increase will ensure that Lockhart Shire Council remains financially sustainable for the future and continue to be able to provide the services for the community, as well as providing suitable infrastructure that meets the needs of the community.

What is the benefit?

Upgrades to the roads, flood mitigation and swimming pool infrastructure will benefit the whole community and provide long term infrastructure for the community. After the unseasonably wet winter in 2016 the roads have deteriorated, which have created over \$2.2 million of works to get the roads back to standard.

The implementation of flood mitigation will provide security and reassurance for the residents of Lockhart Shire to minimise the effect of any future flooding.

The swimming pools in both Lockhart and The Rock are reaching end of life and require significant refurbishments to meet safety and operational obligations. The works will ensure the community has access to swimming facilities for another 50 years and will provide a safe and accessible facility for patrons.

What happens if SRV is not successful?

These projects will still have to occur, though the timing and scope of the projects may have to be changed for Council to be able to deliver them without impacting on the rest of the services that Council deliver.

BIOSECURITY AND ENVIRONMENTAL REPORT:

Priority for spraying has been given to the control of St John's Wort (Hypericum perforatum) on roadsides within the Shire. Other noxious weeds that have been controlled include Coolatai grass (Hyparrhenia hirta), Horehound (Marrumbium vulgare), Bridal Privet Creeper (Asparagus asparagoides). sp.). (Liqustrum Wild Radish (Raphanus raphanistrum), and Chilean Needle Grass (Nassella neesiana).

Detection of Chilean Needle Grass Infestation

Unfortunately an infestation of Chilean Needle Grass (Nassella neesiana) was discovered within the Lockhart Shire in early November. This infestation is located on the Olympic Highway, north of The Rock Township. Red guide posts are already located in this area, due to a previous presence of Coolatai Grass (Hyparrhenia hirta) within this section of road. Plants are scattered over 500 metres of the roadside with a dense incursion in the middle section. Immediately chemical application occurred and effective eradication has been achieved. In order to eliminate the potential seed bank within the soil at this site, controlled burning is scheduled for autumn next year.

Public Consultation on the Proposed Biosecurity Regulation 2016, under the Biosecurity Act 2015, and the Regulatory Impact Statement for the Biosecurity Act 2015

The Biosecurity Act 2015 and the proposed Regulation provide a framework for the prevention, elimination and minimization of biosecurity risks posed by pests, diseases, weeds and contaminants to the economy, environment and communities of NSW. The proposed Regulation and Regulatory Impact Statement became available for viewing on 14 November. These documents can be located at www.dpi.nsw.gov.au/biosecurity/biosecurity-act-

2015. The NSW Biosecurity manual, and various factsheets, is also available at this site. Council staff attended an information session regarding the proposed Biosecurity Regulation, at Albury, on 30 November. Public comment is available through submissions until 29 January 2017.

Environmental Law for Environmental Decision Makers

On 25 November council staff attended the Environmental Law for Environmental Decision Makers workshop, which was provide by EDO NSW, and presented by legal practitioners who specialise in environmental law. Information that was provided

was legislation-based, and aimed to define and explain legal obligations of Council and Local Land Services staff

As Council and Local Land Services staff are tasked with implementing a broad range of complex environmental laws, the workshop was focused on the application and enforcement of environmental laws, and covered topics such as governance issues for councils and Local Land Services, powers of Local Land Services staff under the Local Lands Service Act, pollution and waste, planning and development, public land management, and weeds, pests and biosecurity. The workshop also provided an update on the proposed changes to native vegetation management and threatened species protections.

MAJOR PROJECTS UPDATE:

Council is currently undertaking a number of major projects and the status of each of those are as follows:

- a) Swimming Pools Upgrade: Staff are close on finalising detailed design/scoping of the project. At time of writing this report second round of meetings have been scheduled with each town Pool Steering Committee to occur mid December 2016. Staff have been using information learnt from Greater Hume Shire Council regarding design and costing information. Council was advised recently that it was unsuccessful with grant application under the National Stronger Regional Fund for each pool. creating \$1M shortfall in funding model, however the new Building Better Regions Fund grants are now open. An updated report will be provided to December 2016 council meeting. It is expected that a further report will be provided to Council early in the New Year.
- b) The Rock Sewer Extension: Staff have engaged a consultant to undertake survey and design works, which are expected to be completed by April 2017.
- c) The Rock STP Tertiary Ponds Upgrade: Staff have received Section 60 approval for the works from DPI Water, with works scheduled for early in the New Year.
- d) Demolition of Voluntary Purchase Properties: The demolition of first round of homes in Lockhart and The Rock have been completed. First of the second round of homes has been purchased by Council, with negotiations occurring on second property in The Rock. These properties will be required to be demolished by end of April 2017.
- e) Flood Mitigation Construction: Council has

submitted grant applications for Stage 4 construction of flood mitigation structures in both Lockhart and The Rock for 2016/17 and 2017/18 years. Council has been successful with application for Lockhart being The Government Dams Upgrade/Levee works, with The Rock Streven Street Drainage placed on a reserve list pending availability of funding. It is expected the staff will call for tenders for the construction works in the New Year for Lockhart. There is some final tidy up administration works required regarding easements and Aboriginal Land Claim on the Commons that are need to be completed before construction works can commence.

f) Toilet/Shower Upgrade at The Rock Rec Ground: Investigations of options have been undertaken. A report is being submitted to Council December 2016 meeting. Plan is to have works completed before next football-netball season.

ENGINEERING REPORT:

Works Report: Construction projects are now well underway. The first construction projects at MR370 Rehabilitation north of Wattles Lane & Reid Street Widening, MR543 Heavy Patching and The Rock Mangoplah Road widening are nearing completion. These projects will be followed then by Western Road widening, Osborne Yerong Creek Road widening and Urana Lockhart Road Causeways Upgrade. Grubben Road Upgrade is a large project, is progressing well and is not scheduled to be completed till April 2017. At present all three grader crews are undertaking construction projects.

As previously reported there is some significant damage to some of Council's sealed and unsealed road network from the recent inclement weather. A contractor has been engaged to undertake heavy patching repairs of the sealed network, with works expected to commence just prior to Xmas 2016 and will take 4-6 weeks to complete. Another contractor will be undertaking last of the unsealed road restoration works over the next 6-8 weeks. Unfortunately, due to wet winter delaying the construction projects and additional road repairs required, Council staff will be working through the harvest period in several places at once. This may result in small delays, Council will however try to minimise any disruptions.

TRAFFIC COMMITTEE:

The traffic committee approved the installation of Give Way at intersection of Day and Davison Streets, The Rock.

SWIMMING POOL UPGRADE - LOCKHART & THE ROCK

Lockhart Shire Council operates two swimming pool complexes, one at Lockhart and one at The Rock. Both pool complexes need upgrading to bring into modern standards and community expectations. Both pools are currently in operation for the 2016/17 season, and it should be noted both pools have had to be closed at times due to operational issues. There is no certainty that the Lockhart pool will make it through the season without disruptions again.

Further to reports to Council at June and July 2016 meetings, Council has undertaken further consultation with respective pool steering committees regards to the proposed pools upgrade. Council staff have also engaged with Greater Hume Shire Council (GHSC) about its recently completed Henty pool upgrade and upcoming upgrade at Holbrook pool. GHSC could provide more robust expected project costings as they have recently gone to the market place, as well as good ideas and tips on designs based on what they have learnt as well as advice from contractors.

Council has developed Option 5 (plans can be viewed on Council's website) which is largely the same as Option 4 with some tweaks based on advice from steering committees and GHSC. This has also allowed staff to develop higher level of confidence costings for each project. This information will be presented to the steering committees mid-December, with expectation that a more detailed report be brought back to Council in the New Year.

With regards to funding staff have received feedback on short comings in its application under the National Stronger Regional Fund (NSRF). The Federal Government has just opened its replacement program, Building Better Regions Fund (BBRF), which has similar criteria to NSRF. Applications close on 28 February 2017 with quite a bit of work required for a fully compliant submission. Advice is that for each pool third party contributions to the project would greatly enhance chances of success.

Based on Option 5 plans to-date and further information gained:

- a) Budget estimates for Option 5, including upgrading of the facilities, are (i) Lockhart \$2.0M and (ii) The Rock \$2.2M: Total of \$4.2M, where earlier estimates indicated total costs of \$6.7M.
- b) Detail design and planning works are now expected to cost approximately \$30,000 as only concept plans and brief will be required as well as

Rock.

- c) The Building Better Regional Fund grant scheme can provide grant monies of \$1M. The balance of monies could be provided from loans. Council reserves or combination of both.
- d) Based on grant of \$0.5M and \$0.75M from reserves per pool would leave a loan with annual repayment of approximately \$86,000/year covering both pools. Councils Fit For The Future Improvement Plan rate increase of 4.6% would now only take 1 year before the rate increase would cover the repayment.

Council at its meeting 19 December 2016 resolved

- a) Continue undertaking detailed design and planning works for both Lockhart and The Rock pool upgrades to ensure project is shovel ready this year with works funded from Council reserves:
- b) Continue engaging with respective pool Steering Committees to assist and provide guidance to Council:
- c) Apply for funding of \$1M for the pools under the current round Building Better Regions Fund: and
- d) Commence upgrade of the pools in 2016/17, 2017/18 and 2018/19 years subject to confirmation of grant funding, with project funding being combination of grant funding, third party contributions, loan and Council reserves

DRAFT LOCKHART DEVELOPMENT CONTROL **PLAN 2016**

To satisfy the requirements of the Environmental Planning & Assessment Act 1979, and to facilitate fair and consistent planning in the shire, a draft Development Control Plan has been developed. The draft DCP prescribes a range of development controls for different development types and localities and includes provisions relating to subdivision. residential development, commercial development, industrial development, rural development, heritage conservation, natural hazards and infrastructure.

The purpose of the DCP is to:

- provide a detailed development assessment framework for the Lockhart Shire
- provide clear and concise development guidelines for various forms of development
- encourage innovation in design and development offices in Lockhart. by not over-specifying development outcomes, and

detailed architectural plans for building works at The - provide certainty in development outcomes for developers and the community.

> Essentially, the DCP has been prepared to provide quidance on the implementation of the aims. objectives, land uses and provisions of the Lockhart Local Environmental Plan 2012. The DCP will also consolidate, amend, update or repeal a number of existing Council policies, including:

- Policy 2.11 Flood Prone Land and Building Floor
- Policy 2.14 Relocation of Dwelling Houses
- Policy 2.15 Kennelling of dogs
- Policy 2.19 Building line setbacks
- Policy 2.37 Erection of sheds in residential areas
- Policy 2.38 Erection of fences to residential properties
- Policy 2.39 The erection of street numbers
- Policy 2.43 Development on flood control land.

The DCP applies to all development that may only be carried out with consent under Part 4 of the Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979. When determining a development application, the Council (or other relevant consent authority such as the Land and Environment Court) will take into consideration the extent to which any applicable objectives or development outcomes specified by the DCP will be satisfied or achieved by the design. construction or operation of the proposal.

The draft DCP was placed on public exhibition for a period of 28 days in accordance with Clause 18 of Environmental Planning and Assessment Regulation 2000. As part of the public exhibition process notices were placed in the local newspapers and on Council's website.

During the consultation period Council received no public submissions and the draft DCP was also subject to internal review by Council officers.

The internal review identified one (1) change to include additional information for the use of Council footpaths for street stalls.

It is recommended that Section 10 of the Activities in Public Places Chapter of the draft DCP include the following insertion as the first dot point:

· The organisation must first book their stall on Council's event calendar by contacting Council



Planning to build or subdivide?



All applications are to be reviewed in a pre-lodgement meeting with the Environmental Services Department, prior to lodgement. To make sure our planning staff will be able to assist you in preparing your application please phone to arrange an appointment.

Most types of development which will normally need a development application include:

- New buildings
- Alterations and additions to existing buildings, including swimming pools
- Most types of change of use of existing buildings or premises
- Demolition of buildings, including heritage items or buildings in the heritage conservations area
- Alterations or additions to heritage items or buildings in the heritage conservation area
- Subdivision of land
- Advertising signs
- Earthworks, filling and clearing.

You may also require approval from Council for certain activities as required under Section 68 of the *Local Government Act 1993*. Some examples of such activities include:

- Installation of manufactured homes or moveable dwellings.
- Sewerage and stormwater drainage work.
- Install a domestic oil or soil fuel heating appliance.

Information and forms are available on Council's website under the heading **Development – Building & Development forms.**

All Development Applications should be submitted with a Statement of Environmental Effects, all relevant Plans and payment.





Triple rinsing

- 1. Empty the contents of the container into the spray tank and allow the container to drain for an extra 30 seconds after the flow reduces to drops.
- 2. Fill the container with clean water to about 20% of its capacity and replace the cap securely.
- 3. Shake, rotate, roll or invert the container vigorously for at least 30 seconds, so that the rinse water reaches all inside surfaces.
- 4. Pour the rinsate (the rinsing water from step 3) into the spray tank. Let it drain for an extra 30 seconds after the flow reduces to drops.
- 5. Repeat until the container has been rinsed three times.
- : Containers should have caps **removed** for easy access by inspectors.
- .. No container will be accepted if they are crushed because it makes them difficult to inspect.
- Steel drums must be punctured.
- : Please do not puncture plastics as some are reused
- :. All persons delivering drums to the drumMUSTER must sign a Container Cleanliness Declaration, noting the exact number of drums for delivery to drumMUSTER.

To ensure the **DrumMUSTER** operates efficiently and without time delay, drums will only be accepted at the facility by appointment. You may book a time to dispose of your properly cleaned chemical containers by calling Lockhart Shire Council on 02 6920 5305. Please count your drums and let Council know how many you have so the time allocated to you will be sufficient for inspecting.
