#### **Mayor's Report**

Hello everyone.

Well 2020 has started not the way we would have liked or could have imagined with fires never before seen ravaging vast areas of our State. We have to feel terribly for the people who in some cases have lost everything, and for the animals and wildlife so badly impacted by these



fires. Whole towns have been lost and the cost both to State and Federal governments will be enormous possibly impacting on funding available to local government in the future. One thing that has been clearly demonstrated is the willingness of the Australian people to GIVE both in the form of donations to assist future recovery, and time volunteering to fight fires (RFS) and help with logistics, feeding and housing those effected by this tragedy. We are yet to learn fully of the extent of this event, but be assured it will be like nothing we have seen before. Those affected will be in our thoughts.

So now to the year for the Lockhart Shire. In December our new Director of Engineering and Environmental Services Mr Johan Louw started work with us and immediately commenced making himself familiar with all the projects under way within the Shire. Work on the culvert and bridge upgrades are nearing completion as are the Lockhart flood mitigation works. Widening of MR59 (Lockhart/Urana Rd) continues and should near completion in between 12/18 months.

Lockhart Shire Council also won a Local Government NSW Excellence in the Environment Award for its recycling initiative involving the use of crushed glass in its road base. Our pug mill, a large piece of equipment which mixes the gravel and glass at the rate of 6 to 1 has proved invaluable as you can also add water at the time of mixing thus speeding up the compaction process on the widened road edges.

This September will also see local government elections being held and I would urge all residents within the Shire to give some thought as to whether they would consider standing for election as a councillor on the Lockhart Shire Council. Information on which Ward you reside in is available through contacting the Council office on 6920 5305.

Larger projects like our renewable energy project is progressing quite well with interest shown by other business's looking to relocate in Lockhart. Australia Day this year will be held at The Rock swimming pool. This refurbished facility is now complete and by all accounts is an outstanding success. Australia Day on 26th January will I'm sure be a huge day with everyone in attendance appreciating the new facility.

Our first Council meeting for the year will be held on the 3rd of February and I hope that this year will prove to be as successful in terms of projects as last year.

#### Council Snippets 16 December 2019

#### **ENGINEERING REPORT**

- Grading and minor gravelling of unsealed roads has continued in accordance with the 12-month programme. Heavy patching on Urana Lockhart Road has been completed. MR59
  Urana Road shoulder widening is progressing well with 2.5km of shoulder widening completed. Rocky Point Quarries have completed crushing in Thomo's Mine (The Rock) and have now moved onto Gooden's Mine where they are anticipated to finish late January.
- The last stage of the Higher Mass Limits (HML) bridges project is now complete. Roadwork has commenced to upgrade pavement widths and link up the three new culvert structures. It is anticipated that the project will be completed by mid-January 2020. All culverts have been delivered for the Flood Detour Road project, installation is well under way and scheduled for completion in February 2020. Minor traffic delays should be expected now that construction has commenced. This will then be followed by causeway replacement of Lockhart-The Rock Road and Bullenbong Road, then major culvert replacement on Grubben Road. All culverts have been ordered and deliveries to site have commenced.

#### MAJOR PROJECTS UPDATE – DECEMBER 2019

- Flood Mitigation Construction-Lockhart: The contractor engaged to undertake Stage 2 flood mitigation works in Lockhart, being the drainage system east of the Industrial Park has now completed the main drain component of the project. The installation of the new culverts on the Albury Road have been completed. The contractor has also completed the installation of the new culverts on The Rock-Lockhart Road. Staff are continuing to work with John Holland Rail regarding finalising the approval for the culverts under the branch line, along with the culverts as part of the Flood Detour Road upgrade. Due to the current time frame the rail culverts are now scheduled to be completed January-February 2020.
- Flood Mitigation Construction-The Rock: Council has been notified that the grant application
  has been approved for Stage 2 flood mitigation works at The Rock, being the drainage works
  along Nicholas, Yerong and Urana Streets. Council is required to submit a work plan to the
  funding body, and this is currently being drafted by Council's Project Officer.
- Playground The Rock Recreation Ground: The design for the new all-inclusive playground is
  finalised. Site preparation, including the repositioning of the Recreation Ground entrance is
  complete. Quotes have been assessed and purchase orders placed for the playground
  equipment and park furniture. Installation of the equipment is scheduled for January 2020.

#### PARKS AND GARDENS REPORT

- Swim season is well underway with swimming lessons, aqua aerobics and school visits.
- Watering of street trees planted in the last two years has recommenced.
- The summer mowing schedule has begun at Pleasant Hills and Milbrulong. Mowing of all
  urban areas is planned before Christmas. Extreme weather conditions will be taken into
  account.

#### Council Snippets 16 December 2019

- Regular weed control is being conducted on Council property including hand spraying and weeding of gardens.
- The Shire's rose gardens are in full autumn bloom and being deadheaded regularly to promote continued flowering.
- Irrigation systems are being checked and adjusted. Running times will be increased as weather warms up.
- Routine garden maintenance is being conducted including regular weeding, spraying, pruning and mulching.
- Other regular duties include inspections of parks and public facilities to remove litter, clean BBQ's, check for damage or vandalism, clear footpaths and empty public and roadside bins. Most areas undergo inspections twice per week, including Galore Hill, where crews also clean and check the toilet facilities. Contract cleaners attend to the public toilet facilities in Lockhart, The Rock and Yerong Creek. Playgrounds in the Shire are being inspected regularly as per Australian Standards, with any maintenance being noted and completed as necessary.

#### **WEEDS**

- Inspections were carried out on residential properties, which were selected due to a change of ownership or to assess the implementation of control measures.
- The weeds most commonly found were Bridal creeper (Asparagus asparagoides), Horehound (Marrubium vulgare), Asparagus weed (Asparagus sp.), and Giant reed (Arundo donax).
- Priority has been given to the control of St John's wort (Hypericum perforatum), Silverleaf nightshade (Solanum elaeagnifolium) and St Barnaby's thistle (Centaurea solstitialis) on roadside reserves.
- Paterson's Curse Through the implementation of the above control program, the substantial return of Paterson's curse (Echium plantagineum) within the roadside vegetation has been observed. Various biological controls have been released in the past, being quite effective in the abundance on populations across the state. As with all biological controls, they are the most effective in large populations over large areas and diminishes as the food source (weed) disappears.
- The crown weevil (Mogulones larvatus) has proven to be the most damaging agent, and has been aided by the root weevil (Mogulones geographicus), the flea beetle (Longitarsus echii), the flower beetle (Meligethes planiusculus), and the stem-boring beetle (Phytoecia coerulescens) in providing control.
- The plant structure of the Paterson's curse plant has changed since the release of the biological control agents, with current plants having very little crown or stem configuration. The plant may be adapting to the biological controls or responding to moisture stress. Continued lack of precipitation will influence the plant's potential to produce seed. Council's Environmental Officer will continue to monitor this species' population and observe the presence/absence of biological agents within the Shire.

#### **Stabilisation work at Historic Cemeteries**





#### What will be accepted;

- ☑ Clean drums, rinsed to the Agsafe standard
- Drums larger than 1 litre and up to 205 litre:
- ☑ Drums that have been used for agricultural and livestock production, pest and weed control;
- Drums that are not hazardous substances, used in agricultural production
  - ☑ All pesticides

  - ☑ Drenches
  - ☑ Wetters/Stickers/Adjuvants

  - ☑ Foam markers

#### What will not be accepted

- Drums with any residue (including lid and neck)
- Drums containing more than 100mL of rinsate

#### Drums that packaged the following:

- Liquid chlorine
- Household disinfectants
- Petroleum products

#### **Triple rinsing**

- 1. Empty the contents of the container into the spray tank and allow the container to drain for an extra 30 seconds after the flow reduces to drops.
- 2. Fill the container with clean water to about 20% of its capacity and replace the cap securely.
- 3. Shake, rotate, roll or invert the container vigorously for at least 30 seconds, so that the rinse water reaches all inside surfaces.
- 4. Pour the rinsate (the rinsing water from step 3) into the spray tank. Let it drain for an extra 30 seconds after the flow reduces to drops.
- 5. Repeat until the container has been rinsed three times.
- Containers should have caps removed for easy access by inspectors.
- No container will be accepted if they are crushed because it makes them difficult to inspect.
- Steel drums must be punctured.
- Please do not puncture plastics as some are reused
- All persons delivering drums to the drumMUSTER must sign a Container Cleanliness Declaration, noting the exact number of drums for delivery to drumMUSTER.

To ensure the **DrumMUSTER** operates efficiently and without time delay, drums will only be accepted at the facility by appointment. You may book a time to dispose of your properly cleaned chemical containers by calling Lockhart Shire Council on 02 6920 5305. Please count your drums and let Council know how many you have so the time allocated to you will be sufficient for inspecting.

#### FEATHERTOP RHODES GRASS



**Feathertop Rhodes Grass** Chloris virgata

Other common names:

Feathertop Chloris, Hairy Rhodes Grass. Woollytop Rhodes Grass, Feather Grass. Feather Windmill Grass.

Origin: A native of North America.

Description: A tufted annual grass that grows Control methods: Key practices to consider up to 1 metre tall. Stems can take root where the joints touch the ground. Has a preference heavier clavs. It is quick to mature. It can conditions are suitable.

**Leaves:** Leaf blades are bluish-green, 5–25 cm long and 3-6 mm wide. Seedlings are erect Environmental Officer on (02) 6920 5305, or and their stems have a flattened appearance. Leaf blades have tufts of hairs along the margins and where the blade joins the sheath. The stem joints are hairless and sometimes verv dark.

Flower: The seed heads or panicles have 7–19 feathery, white-silver spikes that are 3 to 9 mm long.

**Germination:** Seeds germinate temperatures of 20°C to 30°C but a preference is shown for 25°C and above with exposure to light. The seeds have innate dormancy. requiring an after-ripening period approximately six to 10 weeks. While prechilling assists in breaking dormancy, it is not essential. Seedlings emerge at 0 to 2 cm soil depth. Seeds appear to be short-lived (about 7 to 12 months) irrespective of burial depth, suggesting short field persistence. This means that although Feathertop Rhodes Grass is a

difficult weed to manage, if you are able to limit seed production, effective weed control can be achieved.

Weed classification: Feathertop Rhodes Grass is considered a priority weed in the Lockhart Shire Council. The presence of this weed is of concern as it has displayed tolerance to glyphosate. When alvphosate alone to control Feathertop Rhodes Grass, it is often difficult to achieve high levels of control, particularly after the early tillering stage. Seeds readily germinate unless buried. With minimal disturbance the seeds remain near the soil surface, which is ideal for emergence and perpetuation of the weed. Previously a weed of roadsides, fence lines and wasteland areas. Feathertop Rhodes Finger Grass has now become an issue in cropping country, particularly where minimum or zero tillage has been practised for several years.

Integrated Weed within an Management include: use of knockdown herbicides: the for lighter textured soils, but will also survive on double-knock tactic; use of residual herbicides; crop rotation; spot spraying/chip hoe; strategic produce seed heads within four weeks if tillage; planting of competitive crops and cultivars; and burning.
