I, along with my wife Alison, moved into Lockhart township in 2008. We have three grown children who in turn have married and provided us with seven beautiful grandchildren.

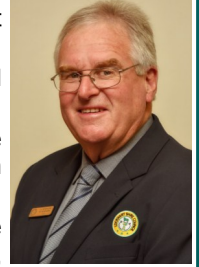

# Mayor's Report

Greetings to you all for the start of the new year. Council has started the year with our first meeting for 2018 being held on Monday, 5 February. The year started very well for our Shire with grants being made to various organisations by Daryl Maguire MP (our Local Member of State Parliament) for these projects:



- The Rock Regional Observatory - \$100,000
- The Rock Men's Shed - \$20,000
- The Rock Football Netball Club - \$6000
- The Greens Gunyah Museum, Lockhart - \$25,000
- The Lockhart Bowling Club - \$5000.

A very big "thank you" to Daryl for the monies that he has delivered to our Shire over the years.

Our pool upgrade projects are still progressing at The Rock and Lockhart and we are hopeful that funding can be obtained very soon so that work can commence. Fingers crossed.

Council held a workshop prior to our monthly meeting to discuss the forming and our inclusion in a Joint Organisation (JO) made up of a number of regional Councils. The State Government recently passed legislation enabling councils to form JOs for the purposes of setting regional priorities and advocating for those priorities. The Government hopes to have a number of JOs established across the State by 1 July 2018 and will be providing seed funding for their establishment.

The Council has resolved to join a JO with the councils which are currently members of the Riverina Eastern Regional Organisation of Councils (REROC). The final outcome however will depend on the other REROC member councils passing similar resolutions and we will need to monitor this situation.

On a different matter let me offer my congratulations to Rose Lehmann on her receiving the Order of Australia Medal for services to her community. Rose has served on many organisations and provided years of service from which we all benefit. Thank you and well done Rose.

Council's own Australia Day celebrations held at Osborne were an opportunity to recognise others for their significant contribution to the community. Congratulations to our 2018 Citizen of the Year, Kelly Forrest, and to the other Australia Day Award recipients Peter Angel and Petrina O'Connor. Congratulations also to our Sportsperson of the Year, Luke Mazzocchi.

This year we were fortunate to have as our Australia Day Ambassador, athlete, accessibility advocate and global adventurer Nick Gleeson, who spoke about overcoming the challenges of living with blindness. His address was both inspirational and humorous.

The Australia Day celebrations were hosted by the Osborne Recreation Ground Management Committee. A lot of time and effort goes into hosting this event so thank you to Osborne for putting on such a great family day.

Work has begun on the Flood Mitigation Project to the North of Lockhart (Government Dam) and will continue through March and April until the completion of stage one. I do hope that this project gives some comfort to the residents of Lockhart with regard to future flooding.

In the meantime tenders have been invited for The Rock Strevens Street drainage flood mitigation works.

## **BIOSECURITY AND ENVIRONMENTAL REPORT:**

### *Environmental Matters*

To enhance road user visibility around intersections and along blind spots, Council's Environmental Officer has been marking some trees and woody weed species for removal or trimming by staff. Careful identification and assessment is required during this process to avoid damage to or removal of hollow-bearing trees, vegetation in endangered ecological communities, and aboriginal significant items (scar trees and camp sites, tools, etc.).

## **ENGINEERING REPORT:**

*Works Report:* Two grader crews are on construction projects being shoulder widening on Western Road and various gravel re-sheets, with a third undertaking maintenance grading and gravel re-sheeting as required.

Grader crews will continue with construction and maintenance programmes, with Brookdale Hill on Wagga Road works now scheduled to commence in the next few weeks. The spray sealing program for 2017/18 year is also due to commence early February 2018.

We remind residents that the summer period is Council's main construction period and although we will try to avoid impact on local traffic it is not always possible. Residents' patience with construction crews is appreciated.

The concrete crew is undertaking drainage extension works for construction projects. The crew is also continuing with maintenance of footpaths, drainage structures, kerb and gutter as well as signs maintenance throughout the Shire as required.

Council has also been successful in securing a grant to install a new bus shelter at Lockhart Post Office and relocate the existing shelter donated by Rotary to Walter Day Park, with the existing information shelter at Walter Day Park to be relocated to Milbrulong as part of its heritage upgrade project.

Council has also been successful in Round 3 of Fixing Country Roads program to repair and upgrade 9 bridge structures throughout the Shire. This will allow opening up the Shire road network to HML, as well as Livestock Loading and Grain Harvest Management Schemes. Works are not anticipated to commence until the end of the first quarter in 2018, and delays can be expected during these works.

*Traffic Committee:* The Traffic Committee has approved safety signage and works on Old Trunk Road, The Rock, as well as Woodend Fiveways Road. The new signage is to be installed shortly.

## MAJOR PROJECTS UPDATE:

Council is currently undertaking a number of major projects and the status of each of these is as follows:

a) *Swimming Pools Upgrade*: Development Approval (DA) has been granted for the amenities upgrade at Lockhart pool as well as The Rock pool new amenities building. Council recently submitted a grant application under the NSW Government's Regional Growth Fund – Stronger Country Communities. It is hoped Council will hear shortly on the outcome of this application. Council at its February 2018 meeting resolved to go to tender for both Lockhart and The Rock pools, with a further report to Council once tenders have been received and outcome of grant applications is known.

b) *The Rock Sewer Extension*: Construction work has been progressing well with the main pipeline nearly completed, including underbore of Highway and Main Southern Rail line. Installation of on property works has commenced. There have been 51 confirmed properties agreeing to connect to the scheme. It is anticipated that this project will be completed within the first quarter of 2018.

c) *Demolition of Voluntary Purchase Properties*: Current grant funding allows for one more property to be purchased at each of Lockhart and The Rock in 2017/18. Demolition work at 38 Day Street The Rock has been completed.

Negotiations with a third and fourth property owner in Lockhart did not reach an agreement. Council has now approached the fifth property. Council has resolved to apply for further funding for the Voluntary Purchase Scheme and Council will be applying for further funding in the next round which opens early February 2018.

d) *Flood Mitigation Construction-Lockhart*: The Office of Environment and Heritage (OEH) has approved the additional funding required and Scott Newbery Earthmoving Pty Ltd commenced construction work on the Lockhart Government Dam Levee with the works progressing well.

e) *Flood Mitigation Construction-The Rock*: The Rock Strevens Street drainage works funding from OEH has been received. Tenders for the works have been advertised with a further report to Council at the March 2018 meeting.

## PARKS AND GARDENS REPORT:

### *Sculpture Trail*

This year's Spirit of the Land winner, 'Magpie Song' by Stuart Taylor has been installed at the front of Lockhart Caravan Park and 2015 winner Rusty Cockatoo by Sean Meaney has taken up permanent residence at CWA Park.

## ***Pools***

Activities such as movies nights, pool inflatable, water aerobics, swimming club and lessons have all helped achieve good numbers through the gates again in December and January

## ***Caravan Park***

The Caravan Park Managers have had good feedback from patrons regarding the recently installed Wi-Fi and the television installed in the camp kitchen. With the planned addition of an extended seating area and fire pit it is hoped that the camp kitchen becomes a real social spot for the park and helps to encourage patrons to lengthen their stay in Lockhart. Wi-Fi availability is via password access from the Caravan Park Manager.

## ***Round-a-bout Street Lamp***

Elegance Stained Glass was consulted about replacing a broken glass panel in the lamp. The glass in the panel has been identified as a texture called Pyramid which is old and rare. Council was advised to try building recyclers in the hope that they may have a fanlight containing this glass that could be cut to size. If a suitable piece cannot be sourced suitable replacement glass will need to be chosen.

## **ON-SITE SEWERAGE MANAGEMENT INSPECTION PROGRAM:**

At the Council meeting held on 20 November 2017 Council endorsed an On-site Sewerage Management Inspection Program for the Lockhart Shire.

The inspection program targets on site sewerage management systems, including septics, aerated wastewater treatment systems, grey water systems and alternate designs, and will be rolled out on a risk-based approach – targeting high risk systems first.

Council considered the introduction of a fee which will be charged to recover the cost of administering the program. A proposed fee of \$100 was publicly exhibited for 28 days following the November Council meeting, along with information supporting the program. No submissions were received.

Section 68 of the Local Government Act 1993 regulates the operation of on-site sewerage management systems, including licensing and approvals. Council at its February 2018 meeting adopted the proposed new fee of \$100 for inspection of on-site sewerage management systems in the Lockhart Shire.

An education program/information will be provided to residents prior to inspections occurring to give residents opportunity to ensure their on-site sewer systems are up to standard.

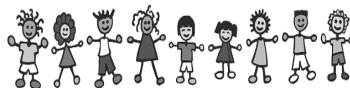

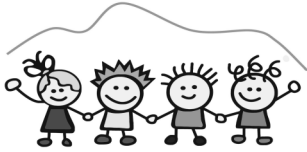

- Clean drums, rinsed to the Agsafe standard
- Drums larger than 1 litre and up to 205 litre;
- Drums that have been used for agricultural and livestock production, pest and weed control;
- Drums that are not hazardous substances, used in agricultural production
  - All pesticides
  - Seed dressings
  - Drenches
  - Wetters/Stickers/Adjuvants
  - Foam markers

Previously not accepted

### What will not be accepted

- Drums with any residue (including lid and neck)
- Drums containing more than 100mL of rinsate

### Drums that packaged the following;

- Liquid chlorine
- Household disinfectants
- Petroleum products

### Triple rinsing

1. Empty the contents of the container into the spray tank and allow the container to drain for an extra 30 seconds after the flow reduces to drops.
2. Fill the container with clean water to about 20% of its capacity and replace the cap securely.
3. Shake, rotate, roll or invert the container vigorously for at least 30 seconds, so that the rinse water reaches all inside surfaces.
4. Pour the rinsate (the rinsing water from step 3) into the spray tank. Let it drain for an extra 30 seconds after the flow reduces to drops.
5. Repeat until the container has been rinsed three times.

- \* Containers should have caps **removed** for easy access by inspectors.
- \* No container will be accepted if they are crushed because it makes them difficult to inspect.
- \* Steel drums **must be punctured**.
- \* Please do not puncture plastics as some are reused
- \* All persons delivering drums to the **drumMUSTER** must sign a Container Cleanliness Declaration, noting the exact number of drums for delivery to **drumMUSTER**.

To ensure the **DrumMUSTER** operates efficiently and without time delay, drums will only be accepted at the facility by appointment. You may book a time to dispose of your properly cleaned chemical containers by calling Lockhart Shire Council on 02 6920 5305. **Please count your drums** and let Council know how many you have so the time allocated to you will be sufficient for inspecting.

## WEED OF THE MONTH BRIDAL CREEPER



### *Asparagus asparagoides*

Bridal creeper is a **Weed of National Significance**. It is regarded as one of the worst weeds in Australia because of its invasiveness, potential for spread, and economic and environmental impacts.

**Description:** Has an annual, climbing shoot growth from a perennial root system consisting of many tubers grouped along a central rhizome. Its climbing stems and foliage smother other plants. It forms a thick mat of underground tubers which impedes the root growth of other plants and often prevents seedling establishment. Native to South Africa. Introduced to Australia as a garden plant.

**Leaves:** Are broadly ovate and end in a point. Shiny green, 4-30 mm wide and 10-70 mm long, which occur along the length of wiry green stems. Leaves are borne in groups on small side branches alternating along the stem. Plants defoliate and die back in early summer. Annual shoots emerge from the underground root mass in autumn.

**Flowers:** White scented flowers appear in late winter to early spring. 6 petalled flower, 5-8 mm in diameter.

**Seeds:** Produces pea-sized green berries which ripen to red and contain up to nine black ovoid seeds. Can produce more than 1000 berries per square metre. Birds feed on the berries and later excrete the

seeds at perch sites. It has a relatively short-lived seedbank.

**Control:** Bridal creeper has a number of features which make it difficult to control – its tuber reserves provide a buffer against adverse seasons, it has a wide germination range, and unlike some other weeds, it can invade undisturbed sites. Chemical translocation from the leaves to the tubers is essential for adequate control. Physical removal must include the removal of all underground tubers, and due to the resilience of the tubers, appropriate disposal is necessary to eliminate potential infestation into other areas.

**Priority weed:** Bridal creeper is considered a priority weed in the Lockhart Shire.

For **All of NSW: General Biosecurity Duty:** All plants are regulated with a general biosecurity duty to prevent, eliminate or minimise any biosecurity risk they may pose. Any person who deals with any plant, who knows (or ought to know) of any biosecurity risk, has a duty to ensure the risk is prevented, eliminated or minimised, so far as is reasonably practicable.

For **All of NSW: Prohibition on dealings:** Must not be imported into the State or sold. This requirement also applies to the Western Cape form of bridal creeper.
