Mayoral Report

Hello everyone, I am pleased to advise that Council has appointed a new Director of Engineering and Environmental Services (DEES). Austin Morris comes to us from Riverina Water where he was the Manager Works. He has had extensive experience in Local Government and is highly qualified in the areas of engineering, environment and project management. We welcome Austin and his family to Lockhart Shire and look forward to a mutually beneficial relationship.



I would also like to express our gratitude to Fred Groenewald who has acted in the position of DEES since Johan's departure. Fred has been a valuable resource and helped us through a difficult period, we thank him for his contribution.

Prior to our last Council meeting I had the privilege of officiating in a citizenship ceremony for Marie Pichler, she moved to Lockhart a few years ago and I was pleased to welcome her as a new Australian Citizen. Also prior to that meeting I had the honour of presenting awards from Local Government NSW to 3 former Councillors. Former Mayor Rodger Schirmer was given the title of Emeritus Mayor for 5 years continuous service as Mayor, Max Day and Derek Douglas were each awarded Certificates of Service for their contribution to the Shire and community. It was great to see family and friends there to help celebrate these awards.

I am also pleased that IPART has agreed to our request for a 2% rate rise. As you would be aware Council was originally granted a .07 rate rise which would have left a significant shortfall in Council's budget. Whilst no one likes rate increases it is important that Council can at least stay abreast with CPI.

It appears La Nina will be with us for a bit longer, whilst this is frustrating for farmers it is also impacting our works program especially in relation to roads. All Councillors have been issued with a schedule of grading for roads so if you have any concerns don't be afraid to contact your Councillor to ascertain when your road is scheduled.

In closing I would like to remind everyone that Covid is still very prevalent in the Community so please be careful. I would like to personally thank the General Manager and all the staff for their efforts in keeping the Shire functional through the pandemic. Special thanks also to Cr Fran Day for representing Council at the Ground Breaking Ceremony for the Avondale Place Respite Centre in Henty.

Council Snippets 20 June 2022

Digital Connectivity and Mobile Blackspots

Council has been making representations to the relevant authorities regarding digital connectivity issues in the Shire, including mobile blackspots and access to reliable internet services. To assist with its representations Council is collating information regarding connectivity issues in the Shire.

To facilitate the collection of relevant information a community survey is being undertaken by Council and distributed throughout the Shire. All residents and business owners are encouraged to complete and return the survey to a local post office or to Council's office, 65 Green Street, Lockhart. An online survey will also be made available on Council's website.

Works

Floods November 2021 and January 2022: Emergency works for the November 2021 flood event are completed with emergency works for the January 2022 flood event nearing completion. Damage Control Project Management (DCPM) was appointed to manage the flood reconstruction works. Their project management fees are to be fully reimbursed. Council's contribution to each of the flood events is \$18,113.

Wattles Rd/Tinamba Lane: Intersections have been completed.

Prichard Place: Sealing of the 400m section and culvert installation is complete. Minor drainage works are required to complete the project.

Lockhart Kywong Rd – 1.25km North of Slocums Lane: works are progressing, with two of the three structures now completed.

Lockhart Kywong Rd – 170m North of Spanish Ave: works completed.

Mittagong Yerong Creek Road: Funding secured through the Fixing Local Roads program to increase the capacity of two culverts and add additional width on Mittagong Yerong Creek Road with construction scheduled to commence in August 2022.

Unsealed Road Maintenance: Grading program has recommenced, after being temporarily interrupted while crews were completing emergency works resulting from recent floods. The following roads have been graded: Humphrys Lane, Hendersons Road, Ashcroft Cemetery Road, Moores Bus Route, Leitch Lane, McGeachies Lane, Montagues Lane, and Soldier Settlement Road.

Parks and Gardens

Ave of Honour, The Rock – Kurrajongs

Council has sourced advanced Kurrajong specimens for planting where trees were previously removed.

Removal of dead trees, pruning of trees suffering from severe dieback, and removal of dead limbs has been completed. It is hoped that the pruning of the trees with dieback will help encourage new growth and prolong their lifespan, giving new trees time to establish before too many of the older trees succumb.

The Rock Recreation Ground

The over mature peppercorn trees were recently removed as part of the boundary track upgrade. Eucalyptus eximia nana, dwarf yellow bloodwood, have been purchased and will be planted in the following weeks thanks to a donation from The Rock Touch Football Association.

Green Street, Museum Garden

As part of the refurbishment of the Museum entrance the garden has been replanted as per the masterplan.

Parks and Gardens

There's plenty do in the gardens. The Liriope under the plough at Walter Day Park have been lifted, divided and replanted around the outside of the plough garden, at Hodgson Park and in Green Street. Some planting has been done to fill gaps, especially at Walter Day Park. Routine garden maintenance is being conducted including regular weeding, spraying, pruning, deadheading and mulching. Most irrigation systems have been turned off.

Weed Control

Weed control by mechanical and chemical methods are undertaken regularly in urban areas. Pesticides commonly used are Glyphosate and Dicamba. Signage will be placed at the property entrance when spraying is in progress.

Freehand herbicide has been trialed in several lawn situations to test its ability to suppress the germination of khaki weed and Caltrop (bindi/cathead) seed. Freehand is for pre-emergent weed control of annual grasses, susceptible sedge species and many small-seeded broadleaf weeds in ornamental

landscape and warm season turf situations. The trial appears to have been quite successful; use will be extended next season.

Mowing and Slashing

Growth has slowed significantly with the first frost of the season. Slashing in town and villages is still being conducted as required. Many roadsides are now quite saturated; it will be difficult to get machines on these areas for the foreseeable future.

Growth of irrigated lawns is being monitored and mowing conducted as required.

Trees

The tree maintenance program has commenced and will continue throughout winter. Council's priority has been high risk, dead, dying, or damaged trees. The bulk of these have been completed and the usual under pruning program has commenced.

Watering of any trees planted in the last two years has ceased due to regular rain, cooler temperatures and dormancy of many species.

Lockhart Shires Street Tree Policy 2.44 states; 'Council is responsible for the planting and maintenance of street trees, including the selection of species, regular health, and safety checks, pruning, and removal and replanting requirements.

Issues presented by residents regarding street trees, including species selection, maintenance and/or removal should be made in writing and addressed to the General Manager. Such issues will be resolved based on financial and time restraints.

Biosecurity

Control Program

Priority has been given to the control of African boxthorn (*Lycium ferocissimum*), African lovegrass (*Eragrostis curvula*), Horehound (*Marrubium vulgare*) and Silverleaf nightshade (*Solanum elaeagnifolium*) on roadside reserves and council managed land.

Pests

Lockhart Shire Council uses electronic lodgement of Development Applications (DA), Construction Certificates (CC), Complying Development Applications (CDC) & Section 68 through the [NSW Planning Portal](#). Applicants will need to establish their own account and then lodge their DA's, CC's and CDC's. For further information or for assistance please contact our Planning & Building team.

This is the process that Council recommends you follow:

- Contact our Planning Team on 02 6920 5305 to discuss your application or to arrange a pre lodgement meeting if required.

Visit the [NSW Planning Portal](#) to [Register](#) for a NSW Planning Portal account to start your application. This will enable you to access your dashboard, view, manage, track and progress applications, pay state agency fees and submit documents. You will also receive email notifications at key stages of the application process.

[Log in](#) to complete the online application form.

- For DA's and CC's you will need to submit a State of Environmental Effects, owner's consent, cost estimate report as well as all supporting plans and documents.
- For CDC's you will need to submit a certificate of title, site plan, design plans, structural plans and building specifications.
- Once we receive your application, Council will do a preliminary assessment and contact you to arrange payment of fees or request additional information.

Once Council is satisfied with the information provided and fees are paid, your application can be lodged.

Council encourages all applicants to arrange a pre lodgement meeting with the Planning & Building team to ensure all required paperwork is ready before lodgement.

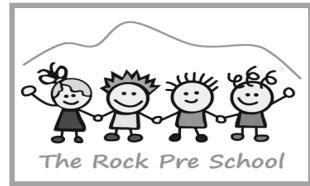

BLACKBERRY NIGHTSHADE



Solanum nigrum

Other Common Names: black nightshade, nightshade, potato bush, tomato bush, wild currants, black fruited nightshade, garden nightshade, and common nightshade.

Description: An annual or perennial soft wooded herb to 1 m high. It is usually upright in habit, but plants may become spreading with age.

Plant death is usually determined by environmental conditions rather than age, and death is generally caused by drought, cold or frost.

Native to north-western Africa, Europe, western and central Asia, China, and the Indian Subcontinent (i.e. northern India, Nepal and Pakistan).

Stems: Erect, stout, green or tinged with purple to quite dark with age. Rough in texture.

Leaves: Are alternate, with an undulate or entire margin, and measure up to 13 cm long and up to 7 cm wide.

Flowers: Small, star-shaped, white, clustered together in groups of 4 to 8, measuring 0.8 to 1.2 cm in diameter. Flowering occurs 5 to 9 weeks after germination and continues until the plant dies.

Fruit: Globular, 6 to 8 mm in diameter, green when immature, ripening to dark purple or black.

Seeds: 5,000 to 800,000 seeds per individual plant. Between 15 and 60 seeds are produced within each fruit of blackberry nightshade. Seeds are flattened, yellow to dark brown in colour, and generally around 1.5 mm in diameter. 90% of seeds remain viable 5 years after production. Some seed may remain viable for up to 4 decades under ideal conditions. Reproduction occurs by seed only.

Toxicity: Entire plant is considered toxic and mostly unpalatable to livestock. Plant produces alkaloids, glycosides and accumulates nitrates. Green berries are extremely toxic to livestock and humans.

Priority weed: Blackberry nightshade is NOT considered a priority weed in the Lockhart Shire. It is regarded as an environmental weed. Recently it has been found prolific amongst roadside vegetation, particularly under trees, where the seed is deposited by birds.
