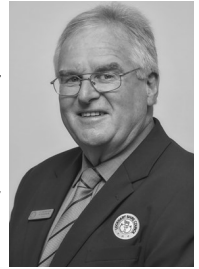

Mayoral Report

Hello everyone.

Well this would have been my last report as Mayor had the elections not been postponed due to COVID-19, so you have to endure this for another three months. Now that our state is in lockdown, many things have changed for all of us. I especially ask that you follow the health directives given by the state government as they and only they will determine when and in which areas restrictions may be lifted and for how long.



Limited gatherings and wearing of masks are especially important as the delta variant is very contagious and may well be spread by a person travelling through any one of our towns on their way to another destination. Make sure that you endeavour to get your COVID-19 jab to help ensure another hurdle is put in the way of this pandemic.

Council has been proactive in its approach to this pandemic by having office-based staff work remotely from home where practicable and outdoor staff, while still at work, actively observing the Public Health Orders.

Council's office is temporarily closed to the public but can still be contacted on 6920 5305 for any enquiries. During this time people are encouraged to transact business or deal with Council's administration over the phone or online. Appointments can still be arranged where a face-to-face meeting may be necessary.

While to many this may seem over the top and unnecessary as we are living in a COVID free area, we have to do everything we can to keep it that way. We are indeed fortunate to live here and not in an inner-city apartment where there is no space, and the restrictions are many. I'm sorry to give so much space to this issue but it is so important.

In terms of Council's operations, work is still continuing on our roads when rain allows, and the landscaping is underway at The Rock Observatory. Landscaping at the Yerong Creek Water Tower will recommence when weather permits and the caravan park refurbishment in Lockhart continues although it also has been held up somewhat by rain. Planning has begun for the development of a public toilet complex on the site of the former GrainCorp building which, when completed, will be of huge benefit to passing traffic and Lockhart locals alike.

A couple of weeks ago when showing our local Federal member Michael McCormack around our Shire, it struck me how fortunate we are in this Shire to have the facilities and infrastructure we do enjoy and how the Shire development is indeed attracting new residents to it.

In closing this report let me once again remind you that local government elections have now been moved to December 4th due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

These at the moment are difficult times but we will get through them. While under restrictions as far as possible keep an eye on your neighbour and each other to ensure everyone is ok and coping.

Council Snippets 16 August 2021

ENGINEERING AND ENVIRONMENTAL SERVICES REPORT

Works:

Wattles Road/Tinamba Lane: Final seal completed. TfNSW HAS approved final intersection designs. Construction to commence in late September subject to weather conditions.

Prichard Place: Extension of existing sealed section by 400 metres. Consultant appointed for design.

Lockhart-Kywong Road (MR370) North: The section starts at 1.25km North of Slocums Lane and ends short of Seberys Lane. Consultant appointed for design.

Lockhart-Kywong Road (MR370) North: The section starts at 170m North of Spanish Avenue and ends 520m South of Boree Creek Road. Consultant appointed for design.

Grading and minor gravelling of unsealed roads: Completed grading of Ryans Lane, Frank Westblade Lane and Spanish Avenue. Completed resheeting on Ryans Stock Route.

Lockhart Caravan Park: Approval to operate a caravan park and camping ground under section 68 Part F2 of the Local Government Act 1993 has been granted. Installation and testing of the water lines for the fire hydrant and hose reels are completed. New pedestals are installed. The disabled toilet building is demolished. Modus advised that production of the new disabled toilet is delayed and may only be installed at the end of August/early September. Works will continue into late August/early September subject to weather conditions. It is proposed to reopen the caravan park as soon as the internal roads and carparking works are completed.

Review of Road Classification: Council received several requests to review the classification of roads including Slys Lane (Unconstructed), Chaplin Lane (Unconstructed), etc. in lieu of 'spot' reclassification, a more strategic approach is proposed with a review Council's Local Roads Classification & Maintenance Policy 2.17 in the first instance prior to commencing classification of the road network.

Winning and Crushing of Gravel: Tenders have been invited for the winning and crushing of gravel within the Shire. The tender closes on Monday 30 August 2021.

Contract for Bitumen, Emulsions and Asphalt Materials and Services: Every year Council, in conjunction with Greater Hume Shire Council, invites tenders from suitably qualified contractors for bitumen, emulsions and asphalt materials and services. The tender for bitumen, emulsions and asphalt materials and services 2021-22 was advertised through Vendor Panel. The tender closed on Monday 02 August 2021.

Major Projects:

Flood Mitigation Construction-The Rock: Excel Gray Bruni has been appointed to undertake the flood mitigation works at The Rock, being the drainage works along Nicholas, Yerong and Urana Streets. Construction is scheduled to commence in September 2021 subject to weather conditions. Letters were posted to properties directly impacted.

Biosecurity and Environment:

Property Inspections

Inspections were carried out on residential, rural, and commercial properties, which were selected due a change in ownership, the detection of priority weeds being present from the property boundary, or to assess the effectiveness of applied control methods.

Weeds most found were Prickly pear (*Opuntia* sp.), Wild radish (*Raphanus raphanistrum*), Privet (*Ligustrum* sp.), Galvanised burr (*Sclerolaena birchii*), Horehound (*Marrubium vulgare*), Bridal creeper (*Asparagus asparagoides*), Coolatai grass (*Hyparrhenia hirta*), and Willows (*Salix* sp.).

Control Program

Priority was given to the control of Horehound (*Marrubium vulgare*), Bridal creeper (*Asparagus asparagoides*) and Coolatai grass (*Hyparrhenia hirta*) on roadside reserves. Known Spiny burrgrass (*Cenchrus spinifex*) sites were also sprayed.

Riverina Weeds Action Program

The end of year reporting for the Weeds Action Program (WAP) for 2020-2025 was completed in July. For the financial year of 2020-2021, not all targets were achieved due to restrictions resulting from the COVID-19 pandemic. Targets not achieved included public awareness events, school, and community education events, and attending workshops and field days, such as the Henty Machinery Field Days. These targets were partially met by other means, such as the continued inclusion of information packs to accompany priority weed inspection reports, and the publication of priority weed profiles in the Council newsletter.

Expenditure was slightly under budget. All other inspection and priority weed control targets were met. No new incursions were recorded within the shire which is encouraging.

NSW & VIC Weeds Conference

The NSW Weeds Conference, which is held biennially, was scheduled to occur in Albury in August 2021. Unfortunately, this event has been postponed until March 2022, due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

drumMUSTER

September drumMUSTER events were advertised in Council's newsletter. The Lockhart drumMUSTER event is scheduled for Tuesday 14 September, and The Rock drumMUSTER event is scheduled for Thursday 16 September.

Parks and Gardens:

The Rock Observatory

Landscaping of the Observatory surrounds is almost completed including installation of steel edging, preparation of the existing ground and placement of additional soil to raise the beds. A mix of exotics and natives was chosen for their hardiness and low water requirements. Mulch

and drip irrigation will be installed to help plants establish and to support plants through the harsh summer conditions.

Green Street Planter Boxes

Repairs to the planter boxes and installation of wicking beds have been completed. The boxes have been planted with prostrate rosemary, which while being very hardy should also quickly establish and be an attractive display.

Parks and Gardens

Pruning, fertilizing, and mulching of roses has been completed. Routine garden maintenance is being conducted including regular weeding, spraying, pruning, deadheading, and mulching. Weed control by mechanical and chemical methods are undertaken regularly in urban areas. Pesticides commonly used are Glyphosate and Dicamba. Signage will be placed at property entrance when spraying is in progress.

Mowing and Slashing

Mowing is scheduled as required due to slow winter growth. Mowing frequency will increase as the weather warms up coming into spring. Access to some urban road reserves is hindered by recent rainfall.

Trees

Seasonal tree maintenance is continuing along nature strips and in parks. Some tree planting was conducted.

Service Station Development at The Rock

The development application for a proposed service station at The Rock is still under assessment with additional information provided by the applicant on 7 July 2021 referred to Transport for NSW for consideration. Transport for NSW has assessed the additional information provided and requested further information.

Working at the Local Government Elections

The Local government elections have been postponed and will now be held on Saturday 4 December 2021.

The NSW Electoral Commission is now inviting people who would like to work at the local government elections to submit an application through its 'expression of interest' website.

Applicants can work on the day (Saturday 4th December) in a polling place, or for longer periods in a returning office or in one of the pre-poll voting centres.

Local Government Elections

Local Government Elections Postponed to 4 December 2021

The Minister for Local Government, by Order published in the Government Gazette on 24 July 2021, revoked the Order made on 26 June 2020 which postponed the election requirements of the Act for all councils in New South Wales to 4 September 2021. In the same Order the Minister appointed 4 December 2021 as the day on which the ordinary elections for all councils in New South Wales are to be held.

Set out below is a revised timeline and key dates for the electoral process based on the new election date of 4 December 2021

Mouse Control Rebate

If you've incurred expenses to combat the recent mouse plague in your home or business, you may be eligible for a rebate.

Households

If you've had to purchase bait, traps or cleaning products since 1 February 2021 to combat the mouse plague in your home, you may be eligible to claim up to \$500.

You can claim one rebate per address, and need to provide receipt/s. You can provide multiple receipts.

Small Businesses

If you're a small business, including primary producers and sole traders with less than 20 employees, you may be eligible to claim up to \$1000.

Your household, business or farm must be located in the following regions:

- **Central Tablelands**
- **Central West**
- **Western**
- **Northern Tablelands**
- **North West**
- **Riverina**
- **Murray**
- **Hunter** (Upper Hunter, Singleton and Muswellbrook areas only)
- **South East** (Hilltops, Upper Lachlan and Yass Valley areas only)

2021/22 RATES INFORMATION



**1st & 2nd Instalments due:
30th November 2021**

Council is transitioning to e-Notices which will provide residents with the option of receiving rate notices electronically and accessing their rate notices online if they choose to register for this option.

During the transition the provider of e-Notices has experienced difficulties with the barcode specifications needed to facilitate payment at Post Offices which has resulted in a delay in the issuing of the 2021/22 rate notices.

It is anticipated that the notices will be issued during the week commencing 23 August 2021.

Ratepayers will not be disadvantaged in terms of the time they will be given to pay the first instalment.

Whereas the first instalment is normally required to be paid by 31 August, the first and second instalments will now be required to be paid by 30 November 2021.

Development, Construction Certificate and Section 68 Application Lodgements Changes!

E Planning and Electronic Application Lodgement

The NSW State Government has introduced changes that now require all Development, Construction Certificate and Section 68 Applications (e.g. transportable dwellings & septic systems) to be lodged via the NSW Governments Planning Portal.

From the **1st April 2021** all Development, Construction Certificate and Section 68 Applications that were previously submitted to Council will now be required to be submitted / lodged via the NSW Planning Portal.

The NSW Planning Portal is an online platform where community, industry and government can work together to provide a digital experience that supports effective planning and decision making under the Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979.

From the **1st April 2021**, all development related applications and post consent certificates must be submitted with Lockhart Shire Council (LSC) through the NSW Planning Portal. These include:

- Development Applications (DA's)
- Applications to modify a DA, and
- Where Council is nominated to complete the assessment of a Complying Development Certificate, Construction Certificate, Occupation Certificate and Subdivision Certificate or appointed as the Principal Certifier for a development.
- Section 68 Local Government Act 1993 Applications

What will be accepted;

- Clean drums, rinsed to the Agsafe standard
- Drums larger than 1 litre and up to 205 litre;
- Drums that have been used for agricultural and livestock production, pest and weed control;
- Drums that are not hazardous substances, used in agricultural production
 - All pesticides
 - Seed dressings
 - Drenches
 - Wetters/Stickers/Adjuvants
 - Foam markers

What will not be accepted

- Drums with any residue (including lid and neck)
- Drums containing more than 100mL of rinsate

Drums that packaged the following;

- Liquid chlorine
- Household disinfectants
- Petroleum products

Triple rinsing

1. Empty the contents of the container into the spray tank and allow the container to drain for an extra 30 seconds after the flow reduces to drops.
2. Fill the container with clean water to about 20% of its capacity and replace the cap securely.
3. Shake, rotate, roll or invert the container vigorously for at least 30 seconds, so that the rinse water reaches all inside surfaces.
4. Pour the rinsate (the rinsing water from step 3) into the spray tank. Let it drain for an extra 30 seconds after the flow reduces to drops.
5. Repeat until the container has been rinsed three times.

- Containers should have caps **removed** for easy access by inspectors.
- No container will be accepted if they are crushed because it makes them difficult to inspect.
- Steel drums **must be punctured**.
- Please do not puncture plastics as some are reused
- All persons delivering drums to the *drumMUSTER* must sign a Container Cleanliness Declaration, noting the exact number of drums for delivery to *drumMUSTER*.

To ensure the *DrumMUSTER* operates efficiently and without time delay, drums will only be accepted at the facility by appointment. You may book a time to dispose of your properly cleaned chemical containers by calling Lockhart Shire Council on 02 6920 5305. **Please count your drums** and let Council know how many you have so the time allocated to you will be sufficient for inspecting.
