

# **Mayoral Report**

Hello again, it appears the wet and cold weather is determined to hang around a bit longer but I must say it didn't dampen the enthusiasm of Yerong Creek community who turned out in large numbers to commemorate Victory in the Pacific Day on 15 August. The event commemorated those who served in World War 2 along with a dedication of plaques honouring those who paid the ultimate sacrifice.

The march was led by the Kapooka Army Band along with the Catafalque Party and Bugler and the keynote address was given by Group Captain Jeff Howard of RAAF Wagga Wagga. Local members Michael McCormack and Dr Joe McGirr were also in



attendance along with descendants and relatives of the fallen. It was a magnificent day and Yerong Creek Anzac Committee should be commended for the time and effort that went in to make the day an outstanding success. Special thanks also to Inland Rail and the NSW Government for their sponsorship and to staff from Council whose assistance was greatly appreciated.

On Monday 1 August the GM and I met with representatives of Transgrid for an update on Project Energy Connect. They advised that early works will commence in mid to late August on the eastern section of the project. They also advised that a company named Voconiq will be conducting a longitudinal survey to measure community sentiment about the project.

On the 4/5 August the GM and I attended the Country Mayors Association meeting in Sydney, highlights included an address by the national Commissioner for Rural Education, NSW Minister for Skills and Training along with his Opposition counterpart. There was also an address from NBN who have big plans to improve connectivity throughout the state including \$750m to extend the range of fixed wireless towers and extending the services of Sky Muster plus. The NSW government is also allocating \$70m to address health worker accommodation.

Council also considered projects for Round 5 of Stronger Country Communities Funding (SCCF) and reallocation of funding from Local Government and Community Infrastructure Fund. An additional \$50,000 has been allocated to Yerong Creek for improvements to Stanley Galvin Park and completion of watering system at the Cricket Ground. SCCF funds were allocated to the proposed Community Centre at The Rock, Brookong Creek Master Plan, Pleasant Hills tennis courts and new decorative lighting for Lockhart, Yerong Creek and The Rock.

### Project EnergyConnect

EnergyConnect is a Transgrid project involving the construction of an above ground transmission line between Robertstown in South Australia and Wagga Wagga in NSW.

Transgrid has advised that the contractor, SecureEnergy JV, will be commencing early works in mid to late August on its new 700km electricity transmission line on the NSW-Eastern section of the project alignment.

These activities will affect the local government areas of Wentworth, Balranald, Edward River, Federation, Hay, Lockhart, Murray River, Murrumbidgee and Wagga Wagga. These works are expected to be completed by mid-2023, weather permitting with most works being undertaken on private landowner properties.

A longitudinal survey measuring community sentiment about Project EnergyConnect and Transgrid more broadly referred to as "Local Voices" is being conducted by Voconiq.

The survey commenced in the Mildura area in early August and will continue across Local Government Areas (LGA) along the alignment for the remainder of August and then at 6 month intervals for at least the next 2 years.

#### Inland Rail – Albury to Illabo EIS

The Australian Rail Track Corporation (ARTC) is seeking approval from the NSW Government to construct and operate the Albury to Illabo section of Inland Rail. The Inland Rail project proposes the construction of new railway lines and the upgrade or enhancement of existing railway lines to accommodate double stacked freight trains running between Melbourne and Brisbane.

The Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) for the proposal is on public exhibition for a period of 28 days from 17 August 2022. Submissions are to be made directly to the NSW Department of Planning and Environment. #### 2021 Census

Information regarding the 2021 Census has been publicly released by the Australian Bureau of Statistics (ABS). There will be more staged releases of Census information by the ABS in the coming months.

The Shire's estimated population as recorded in the 2016 Census was 3,119. The 2021 Census figure of 3,319 represents a 6.41% for the five year Census period or an annual average population growth of 1.28%.

Notably the Department of Planning, Industry and Environment (DPIE) has released its population projections and has forecast that Lockhart Shire's population will grow to approximately 4,500 by 2041 representing an average annual population growth of over 1.5%.

#### Electric Vehicle (EV) Charging Stations

Council has resolved to apply for grant funding to install EV chargers at Lockhart, The Rock and Yerong Creek. Under the funding guidelines the chargers will have to be installed offstreet which limits the number of locations that meet the funding criteria. The sites must also be specific types such as a caravan park, landmark or recreation ground. Benefits of EV

chargers include attracting new visitors to the shire and increasing the length of time visitors spend in the area. All chargers will be dual servicing i.e. two cars can charge at the same time.

### Round 5 Stronger Country Communities Fund – Grant Program

Community organisations are advised that the NSW Government has announced a fifth round of funding under the Stronger Country Communities Fund.

The funding available under Round 5 for projects in the Lockhart Shire Local Government Area is \$1,252,640. Of this amount \$861,190 is available to Council as the applicant with the balance of the allocation open only to eligible community organisations i.e. community organisations registered as incorporated associations and not-for-profit community organisations registered as public companies.

#### Works:

<u>Floods November 2021 and January 2022</u>: Emergency works for the November 2021 flood event is completed with emergency works for the January 2022 flood event nearing completion.

<u>Prichard Place</u>: Minor drainage works will be carried out when weather permits to complete the project.

<u>Lockhart Kywong Rd – 1.25km North of Slocums Ln</u>: three structures now completed. Minor roadworks will take place to complete the project, as weather permits.

<u>Mittagong Yerong Creek Road</u>: Funding secured through the Fixing Local Roads program to increase the capacity of two culverts and add additional width on Mittagong Yerong Creek Road with construction scheduled to commence in August 2022, weather permitting.

Unsealed road maintenance of shire gravel roads has been conducted on: Illetts Lane, Benders Lane, Clancys Lane, Dan Gleesons Lane, Doigs Lane, Erinvale Road, Forcks Lane, Klemkes Road, Jones Lane, Lieschkes Lane, Mount Ulva Road, Pietches Road, Stoney Park Road, Wallendoon Access Road, Munyabla Boundary Road, Ryan Stock Route, Ryan Lane, Spurrells Road and Wetmores Lane.

Gravel resheets have been conducted on, Soldier Settlement Road, Ryan Lane and Wetmores Lane.

The removal of vegetation on local rural roads has been conducted on County Boundary Road and Osborne Yerong Creek Road.

The bitumen crew have been kept busy with an increase of pavement failures due to the weather. Routine maintenance has continued on our Local and Regional Roads.

### Parks and Gardens:

#### Ave of Honour, The Rock – Kurrajong

Council has sourced advanced Kurrajong specimens for planting where trees were previously removed. Some planting has commenced where possible, a mini digger will be sought to excavate further holes and remove old roots.

Removal of dead trees, pruning of trees suffering from severe dieback, and removal of dead limbs has mostly been completed. The crown has been removed from dead trees, removal of trunks and stump grinding will be scheduled as resources become available. It is hoped that the pruning of the trees with dieback will help encourage new growth and prolong their lifespan, giving new trees time to establish before too many of the older trees succumb.

### The Rock Recreation Ground

The over mature peppercorn trees were recently removed as part of the boundary track upgrade. Eucalyptus eximia nana, dwarf yellow bloodwood have been planted thanks to a donation from The Rock Touch Football Association.

Lockhart Caravan Park Entrance, Green Street

Replacement of the old granite path with paving has commenced. Refurbishment will also include replacement of pebble surface with pea granite and the extension of the existing garden bed.

This area is already the home of the annual winner of Spirit of the Land sculpture and will also become the permanent home of the 'Spirit of the Land' Frame Sculpture, kindly donated by its creator David Fenwick of Weathered Garden Art, Mangoplah. The frame was very popular at the 2019 Spirit of the Land Festival with many visitors posing for photos behind it, its permanent inclusion in this position will allow visitors to take photos of themselves with the caravan park and creek backdrop throughout the year and can also be used during the festival.

#### Parks and Gardens

Along with the ongoing garden maintenance of regular weeding, spraying, pruning, deadheading, and mulching, the Shire's roses have also been pruned, fertilised and mulched.

Walter Day Park is also looking very open at the moment due to some hard pruning of some very leggy bottlebrush and melaleuca. These species should take the hard pruning well and recover quickly with fresh new shrubby growth to fill out the gardens.

#### Weed Control

Weed control by mechanical and chemical methods are undertaken regularly in urban areas. Pesticides commonly used are Glyphosate and Dicamba. Signage will be placed at property entrance when spraying is in progress.

Freehand herbicide has been trialled in several lawn situations to test its ability to suppress the germination of khaki weed and Caltrop (bindii/cathead) seed. Freehand is for preemergent weed control of annual grasses, susceptible sedge species and many smallseeded broadleaf weeds in ornamental landscape and warm season turf situations. The trial appears to have been quite successful; use will be extended next season.

#### Mowing and Slashing

Growth has slowed significantly; slashing in towns and villages is still being conducted as required. Many roadsides are quite saturated; it will be difficult to get machines on these areas for the foreseeable future.

Growth of irrigated lawns is being monitored and mowed as required.

<u>Trees</u>

Replacement trees have been planted on Prichard Place.

The tree maintenance program has continued. Council's priority has been high risk, dead, dying, or damaged trees. The bulk of these have been completed and the usual under pruning of street trees has commenced.

Watering of any trees planted in the last two years has ceased due to regular rain, cooler temperatures, and dormancy of many species.

Lockhart Shires Street Tree Policy 2.44 states: 'Council is responsible for the planting and maintenance of street trees, including the selection of species, regular health, and safety checks, pruning, and removal and replanting requirements.

Issues presented by residents regarding street trees, including species selection, maintenance and/or removal should be made in writing and addressed to the General Manager. Such issues will be resolved based on financial and time restraints.

### Biosecurity

Control Program

Priority has been given to the control of Bridal creeper (*Asparagus asparagoides*) and Horehound (*Marrubium vulgare*) on roadside reserves and Council managed land.

#### Henty Machinery Field Days

The Henty Machinery Field Days are scheduled for the 20 to 22 September. Council's Environmental Officer will represent the Riverina WAP (Weeds Action Program) in the 'Weeds Shed'. This is a great opportunity for interaction with members of the public to: assist with plant identification, discuss best control management practices, advise on new advancements in the biological control sector, and discuss issues regarding biosecurity obligations and land tenure.

#### Common White Snail Baiting Program

Snail baiting application occurred on Fairview Lane on 21 July.

Spring Fox Baiting

In preparation for the spring fox baiting program, advertisement in local newspapers will occur in August. Fox baiting on Galore Hill Scenic Reserve and Kincaid's Reserve is scheduled to begin on 6 September.

#### Council Pest Management Practices

BirdLife Australia has requested that councils review their pest management practices, to avoid the use of Second-generation Anticoagulant Rodenticides (SGARs), which are harmful to native birds and wildlife, as well as household pets. An action kit for councils has been developed to assist. This program has been implemented in response to the high number of birds of prey that died from secondary poisoning in the last mouse plague.

### <u>WIRES</u>

Following a recent collaboration between WIRES and Sutherland Shire Council, WIRES has contacted councils offering an opportunity to partner with WIRES to support native wildlife. WIRES is hoping to initiate similar programs across NSW to develop plantations that act as an ongoing harvestable food source for native wildlife in the care of WIRES.



### MyStep to Mental Wellbeing

MyStep to Mental Wellbeing is for individuals with mild to moderate mental health needs and provides a range of services aimed at supporting people wanting to improve their emotional and mental wellbeing.

MyStep offer short and longer-term counselling, provided by skilled mental health professionals. MyStep also offer team care services to support people with more severe mental health concerns establish independence through providing intensive support and close liaison with other professionals such as your GP. MyStep also offer in-reach services to residential aged care facilities to support residents entering and living in aged care facilities with issues including adjustment, grief and loss, depression and anxiety.

MyStep provides service both face to face and via telehealth so that they can connect with people in the way that suits them.

MyStep is a free service which can be accessed without a GP referral, although a GP mental health care plan is recommended. To access MyStep to Mental Wellbeing service please call the Murrumbidgee Primary Health Network on Ph: 1800 931 603.

### Farming Community Counselling

# **NSW Planning Portal**

Lockhart Shire Council uses electronic lodgement of Development Applications (DA), Construction Certificates (CC), Complying Development Applications (CDC) & Section 68 through the <u>NSW Planning Portal.</u> Applicants will need to establish their own account and then lodge their DA's, CC's and CDC's. For further information or for assistance please contact our Planning & Building team.

This is the process that Council recommends you follow:

• Contact our Planning Team on 02 6920 5305 to discuss your application or to arrange a pre lodgement meeting if required.

Visit the <u>NSW Planning Portal</u> to <u>Register</u> for a NSW Planning Portal account to start your application. This will enable you to access your dashboard, view, manage, track and progress applications, pay state agency fees and submit documents. You will also receive email notifications at key stages of the application process.

Log in to complete the online application form.

- For DA's and CC's you will need to submit a State of Environmental Effects, owner's consent, cost estimate report as well as all supporting plans and documents.
- For CDC's you will need to submit a certificate of title, site plan, design plans, structural plans and building specifications.

• Once we receive your application, Council will do a preliminary assessment and contact you to arrange payment of fees or request additional information.

Once Council is satisfied with the information provided and fees are paid, your application can be lodged.

Council encourages all applicants to arrange a pre lodgement meeting with the Planning & Building team to ensure all required paperwork is ready before lodgement.

# **Building & Planning Services**

### APPROVED DEVELOPMENT APPLICATIONS

# FOXTAIL FERN



Asparagus densiflorus

Other Common Names: Meyersii fern, Meyers fern, Foxtail asparagus, Plume asparagus, Basket asparagus

Weed National For All **Description:** of Significance. Native to South Africa. certain Grows dense foliage and root mats importing into the state, sold, bartered, that suppress other plants. It can become a serious weed of bushland. It is a spreading ground cover with upright stems. It has dense foliage that look like foxtails. The tubers below ground store water, so once the plants are established, they are drought resistance. They are also salt tolerant. Berries distributed by birds.

Stems: Triangular shaped.

Modified stems Leaves: called cladodes, are bright green, short and needle-like.

Flowers: Very small, white or pale pink and fragrant.

Fruit: Shiny round berries, initially green and ripening to orange-red. Up to 1 cm wide, with a single black seed.

Roots: Long and fibrous, with cream oval tubers and rhizomes. Tubers grow to the size of a man's thumb, and underground they spread out far from the plant. The tuber derives nutrients from the soil and choke out the surrounding plants. Their spread can be invasive.

For All of NSW: General Biosecurity Duty: All plants are regulated with a general biosecurity duty to prevent, eliminate or minimise any biosecurity risk they may pose. Any person who deals with any plant, who knows (or ought to know) of any biosecurity risk, has a duty to ensure the risk is prevented, eliminated or minimised, so far as is reasonably practicable.
