Mayoral Report

Hello again, it appears that the predictions of an extended La Nina are proving correct with a lot of above average rainfall in the district. Whilst rain is generally always welcomed it is providing some challenges to our farming community in accessing their land to complete sowing. Those crops that are in are up and doing well and it looks like another good season.

By the time you read this the Federal Election will have come and gone, and we may or may not have a new government. The Local Government Association has been running a campaign to not let local communities be left behind. I hope which ever party is in power will look to ensure that Local Government is properly



resourced to provide safe roads and community infrastructure for the future. I would like to thank our local member for his support of Lockhart Shire.

The General Manager and I recently travelled to Sydney as part of a contingent of Mayors and General Managers from the Riverina to meet with various Ministers including the Deputy Premier at Parliament House. I must say we were warmly received, and they listened to our concerns about such things as rate pegging, housing availability, road funding, planning and the Emergency Services Levy. It is hoped that our issues which are common to most local government areas will receive favourable consideration in the State Budget.

It has come to Council's attention that Lockhart Shire is performing poorly when it comes to separating our rubbish. This does cause a problem for our recyclers and land fill operators who have to spend countless hours separating components. Please remember the green bin is for green waste and food scraps (no plastic bags), yellow for recycling and red for general waste. Plastic bags can only be placed in red bins. Your assistance in this matter will be greatly appreciated.

The wet weather is continuing to wreak havoc on our local roads, our crews are doing their best and we will be prioritising the worst affected. Be assured we will get to them all as per our schedule which is available from any Councillor. Our Operational Budget for 2022/23 is now on exhibition along with our new council meeting code.

In more exciting news our new observatory will be having its first viewing on Friday the 3rd of June at 7pm. Numbers are limited so please be sure to register your interest.

2022/23 Annual Operational Plan and Budget

Notice of Adoption of Local Orders Policy

Notice is given that Council has adopted Local Orders Policy No. 1 – Premises not in a Safe or Healthy Condition. The purpose of the Policy is to specify the criteria that will be taken into consideration when determining when premises are not in a safe and healthy condition and an Order under Section 124 of the Local Government Act may be issued. The Policy is contained in Council's Policy Register which can be found at https://www.lockhart.nsw.gov.au.

Policies Under Review and on Public Exhibition

In order to ensure that policies remain relevant a program of ongoing review of policies not later than every three years has been developed and maintained by Council.

It has also been Council's practice that any new or amended policies that, in the Council's opinion, may impact on residents and ratepayers and/or on the provision of services to the community, are to be placed on public exhibition for a period of not less than 28 days, and any submissions received will be considered by Council prior to adoption of the Policy.

In accordance with this practice the following policies are currently on public exhibition and submissions will be received up until 15 June 2022.

Policy 1.19 Local Preference Purchasing Policy

Policy 2.53 Mobile Garbage Bin Issue & Replacement

Code of Meeting Practice

NSW councils must, not later than 12 months after an ordinary election of councillors, adopt a code of meeting practice that incorporates the mandatory provisions of the model code prescribed by the regulations.

A new Model Meeting Code has been published in the Government Gazette and prescribed under the Local Government (General) Regulation 2021 (the Regulation).

Council has reviewed its Code of Meeting Practice in line with the new Model Code of Meeting Practice prescribed by the Regulation and the following changes to Council's Code are being recommended:

- A statement of ethical obligations as a reminder to councillors of their oath or affirmation of office, and their conflict of interest disclosure obligations, has been inserted into the Code.
- The new provisions that allow councils to permit individual councillors to attend
 meetings by audio-visual link and to hold meetings by audio-visual link in the
 event of natural disasters or public health emergencies have been incorporated
 into the Code.
- An acknowledgement of country has been inserted into the general order of business for an ordinary meeting of the Council in accordance with the template contained in the Model Code.

Council is required to place its revised Code of Meeting Practice on public exhibition for 28 days and allow up to 42 days for the receipt of submissions before formally adopting the Code.

Accordingly the revised Code of Meeting Practice is currently on public exhibition and submissions will be received up until 27 June 2022.

It is proposed to table the Code, together with any submissions received, at an Extraordinary Council meeting on 27 June 2022 for adoption.

Engineering and Environmental Services Report

Works

<u>Floods November 2021 and January 2022</u>: Emergency works for the November 2021 flood event is completed with emergency works for the January 2022 flood event nearing completion. Damage Control Project Management (DCPM) was appointed to manage the flood reconstruction works. Their project management fees are to be fully reimbursed.

<u>Wattles Road/Tinamba Lane</u>: Minor drainage works at the Lockhart Kywong Road intersection to be completed.

<u>Prichard Place</u>: Extension of existing sealed section by 400 metres. The design is complete and approved by Transport for NSW. Works commenced.

<u>Lockhart Kywong Road (MR370) North</u>: The section starts at 1.25km north of Slocums Lane and ends short of Seberrys Lane. The design is complete and approved by Transport for NSW. Culvert installation has commenced.

<u>Lockhart Kywong Road (MR370) North</u>: The section starts at 170m north of Spanish Avenue and ends 520m South of Boree Creek Road. The design is complete and approved by Transport for NSW. Works completed – line marking to commence week ending 20 May 2022.

<u>The Rock Mangoplah Road</u>: The section starts 400m west of Bulloc Hill Road and ends 630m east of Bulloc Hill Road and is complete.

<u>Mittagong Yerong Creek Road</u>: Council successfully secured funding through the Fixing Local Roads program to increase the capacity of two culverts and add additional width on Mittagong Yerong Creek Road. Construction of this project is scheduled to commence in August 2022.

Grading and minor gravelling of unsealed roads: Grading program has recommenced after being temporarily interrupted while crews were completing emergency works resulting from recent floods. The following roads have been graded: Hollies Road, Vincents Road, Boyds Road and Krauses Lane.

Parks & Gardens Report

<u>Easter and Anzac Day</u> - Special consideration was given to high profile areas prior to the Easter long weekend. Maintenance of public areas visited during ANZAC Day activities was timed to ensure they were well presented.

<u>Ave of Honour, The Rock – Kurrajong</u> - Council is currently sourcing advanced Kurrajong specimens for planting where trees were previously removed.

Removal of dead trees, pruning of trees suffering from severe dieback to encourage new growth and prolong their lifespan, and removal of dead limbs is also scheduled to be conducted this autumn/winter.

<u>Green Street, Museum Garden</u> - As part of the refurbishment of the Museum entrance the garden has been replanted as per the masterplan.

<u>Parks and Gardens</u> - There's plenty do in the gardens this time of the year. Some planting has been done, especially at Walter Day Park. Routine garden maintenance is being conducted including regular weeding, spraying, pruning, deadheading and mulching.

Most irrigation systems have already been turned off or times greatly reduced. This will be monitored as the weather cools.

Weed Control - Weed control by mechanical and chemical methods are undertaken regularly in urban areas. Pesticides commonly used are Glyphosate and Dicamba. Signage will be placed at property entrance when spraying is in progress.

Freehand herbicide has been trialed in several lawn situations to test its ability to suppress the germination of khaki weed and Caltrop (bindii/cathead) seed. Freehand is for pre-emergent weed control of annual grasses, susceptible sedge species and many small-seeded broadleaf weeds in ornamental landscape and warm season turf situations. The trial appears to have been quite successful; use will be extended next season.

There is no magic wand in controlling these weeds, a multi-pronged approach using appropriate chemical and mechanical methods and including education of the public regarding the identification and reporting are necessary to reduce the spread.

Assistance by property owners to vigilantly remove these weeds on their properties, nature strips and/or laneways as soon as they emerge is essential to prevent their spread and larger infestations.

<u>Mowing and Slashing</u> - Autumn brings in the second major turf growth season; mowing of most irrigated lawns is still being conducted fortnightly but frequency is being reduced as the weather continues to cool.

Trees - The tree maintenance program has commenced early this year and will continue throughout autumn and winter. Council's priority is high risk, dead, dying, or damaged trees. Once the bulk of these are completed the usual under pruning program will commence.

Watering of any trees planted in the last two years has been conducted as required.

Lockhart Shire's Street Tree Policy 2.44 states; 'Council is responsible for the planting and maintenance of street trees, including the selection of species, regular health, and safety checks, pruning, and removal and replanting requirements.

Issues presented to residents regarding street trees, including species selection, maintenance and/or removal should be made in writing and addressed to the General Manager. Such issues will be resolved based on financial and time restraints.

Weeds

Control Program - Priority has been given to the control of Feathertop Rhodes grass (Chloris virgata) and Horehound (Marrubium vulgare) on roadside reserves and council managed land.

Pests

Common White Snail Baiting Program - Snail baiting application occurred on Fairview Lane on 13 April.

Autumn Fox Baiting Program - Replacement of baits continued through April.





NSW Planning Portal

Lockhart Shire Council uses electronic lodgement of Development Applications (DA), Construction Certificates (CC), Complying Development Applications (CDC) & Section 68 through the NSW Planning Portal. Applicants will need to establish their own account and then lodge their DA's, CC's and CDC's. For further information or for assistance please contact our Planning & Building team.

This is the process that Council recommends you follow:

 Contact our Planning Team on 02 6920 5305 to discuss your application or to arrange a pre lodgement meeting if required.

Visit the <u>NSW Planning Portal</u> to <u>Register</u> for a NSW Planning Portal account to start your application. This will enable you to access your dashboard, view, manage, track and progress applications, pay state agency fees and submit documents. You will also receive email notifications at key stages of the application process.

Log in to complete the online application form.

- For DA's and CC's you will need to submit a State of Environmental Effects, owner's consent, cost estimate report as well as all supporting plans and documents.
- For CDC's you will need to submit a certificate of title, site plan, design plans, structural plans and building specifications.
- Once we receive your application, Council will do a preliminary assessment and contact you to arrange payment of fees or request additional information.

Once Council is satisfied with the information provided and fees are paid, your application can be lodged.

Council encourages all applicants to arrange a pre lodgement meeting with the Planning & Building team to ensure all required paperwork is ready before lodgement.

Community effort: With Khaki weed being widespread in towns, Lockhart Shire Council encourages residents to be vigilant in its control.
