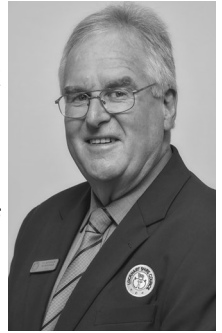
Council's Annual Report and End of Term Report which is available on Council's website provides greater detail of the achievements of this Council term.

2021/22 RATE NOTICES

The 2021/22 rate notices have now been issued following an initial delay. The delay occurred during the transition to e-Notices.

Transitioning to e-Notices will provide ratepayers with the option of receiving rate notices electronically and accessing their rate notices online.

If you wish to take advantage of this option and register for e-Notices, please refer to the e-Notices section on the bottom right hand corner of your rate notice and follow the instructions.

Due to the delay in issuing the rate notices, and to ensure ratepayers are not disadvantaged, both the first and second instalments are now due by 30 November 2021.

This did not prevent ratepayers from paying their first instalment earlier than the due date.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT ELECTIONS

Election Date

The next Local Government elections will be held on Saturday 4 December 2021.

The 2021 Local Government elections will be conducted by the NSW Electoral Commission.

The Commission has established a 2021 Local Government elections event page which is now live on the Commission's website at <https://www.elections.nsw.gov.au/lge2020>

The NSWEC will progressively populate the event website with useful information for all participants in the election.

Other Key Dates

LOCAL ELECTION WORK OPPORTUNITIES

Expressions of interest are now open to work at the local government elections in December. Working at an election is a great way for members of the community to earn money, learn new skills and deliver democracy by helping people to have their say.

There are positions available during the election period and on election day itself. More information, including position descriptions, pay rates, and the link to apply, can be found on the Electoral Commission's website at <https://eoi.elections.nsw.gov.au/EOI/?EEID=LG2101>

Local Government Elections and Council meeting Schedule

According to the key dates listed on the NSW Electoral Commission (NSWEC) website, the return of postal ballot papers will be received up until 17 December 2021 and the declaration of results will take place 21-23 December 2021. This means that the December Council meeting will not be able to proceed as scheduled on the third Monday of the month i.e. 20 December 2021.

In accordance with the Local Government Act, Councils that elect their mayor (as opposed to councils that have a popularly elected mayor) are required to hold a mayoral election within three weeks of the election results being declared.

In order to comply with the legislative timeframe a Council meeting will be held at 5.00pm on Monday 10 January 2022. The following matters will be dealt with at the first meeting after the election:

- All councillors will be required to take an oath or make an affirmation of office. Councillors are not permitted to participate in meetings until they have done so.
- An election for Mayor and Deputy Mayor will be conducted.
- Consideration to be given to passing a resolution declaring that casual vacancies occurring in the office of councillor within 18 months of the election are to be filled by a countback of votes cast at the election. Councils that do not pass such a resolution at the first meeting following an election will be required to fill any casual vacancies using a by-election.
- The Audited Financial Statements and Auditor's Report for the 2020/21 financial year will be presented. It is a requirement of the Local Government Act that the Audited Financial Statements and Auditor's Report be presented no later than five weeks after the Auditor's Certificate has been issued.

ENGINEERING AND ENVIRONMENTAL SERVICES REPORT

Works:

Wattles Road/Tinamba Lane: Final seal completed. Construction of the intersection at Lockhart-Collingullie Road is complete and construction of the Lockhart Kywong Road intersection has commenced.

Prichard Place: Extension of existing sealed section by 400 metres. The design is complete and currently with Transport for NSW for approval.

Lockhart-Kywong Road (MR370) North: The section starts at 1.25km North of Slocums Lane and ends short of Seberys Lane. The design is complete and currently with Transport for NSW for approval.

Lockhart-Kywong Road (MR370) North: The section starts at 170m North of Spanish Avenue and ends 520m South of Boree Creek Road. Council successfully secured funding through the Regional Roads Repair Program to upgrade this section of road. The design is complete and currently with Transport for NSW for approval.

Mittagong Yerong Creek Road: Council successfully secured funding through the Fixing Local Roads program to increase the capacity of two culverts and add additional width on Mittagong Yerong Creek Road. Construction of this project is scheduled to commence in August 2022.

Grading and minor gravelling of unsealed roads: Completed grading of Broughtons Lane, Schultz Lane, Haberechts Maffra Lane, Fargunyah Lane, Dunlevys Lane, and Slocums Lane.

Zwecks Lane, Wolters Lane, Munyabla Munyaplah Road, McReadies Lane, Browns Lane, Dick Knobles Road, Seeligers Lane, Shipards Lane, Adams Lane and McRories Road, Janetzkas Lane, Schultz Lane, Klemkes Road, Strong Lane, Napier Road, and Gerhardt Hoffmanns Lane.

Major Projects:

Flood Mitigation Construction: Excel Gray Bruni has been appointed to undertake the flood mitigation works at The Rock, being the drainage works along Nicholas, Yerong and Urana Streets. Letters have been posted to properties directly impacted. The contractor has established on site. Site set out and the relocation of services are complete. Construction has commenced.

Lockhart Caravan Park: Construction is mostly completed with only the disabled toilet and laundry to be constructed and some minor works to be completed. Modus advised that production of the new disabled toilet is delayed and may only be constructed in November. The caravan park opened on Saturday 11 September. Council is in the process of procuring an on-line booking system for the caravan park.

Road Safety:

A part-time Road Safety Officer position is being advertised. Applications closed on Monday 15 November.

Compliance:

Letters were sent to property owners for overgrown properties at Lockhart, The Rock, Yerong Creek and Pleasant Hills. Half of the properties have been slashed and cleared to date.

Biosecurity and Environment:

Property Inspections

Inspections were carried out on residential, agricultural, and commercial properties, which were selected due a change in ownership.

The weeds most found were St John's wort (*Hypericum perforatum*), Prickly pear (*Opuntia sp.*), Privet (*Ligustrum sp.*), Horehound (*Marrubium vulgare*), Asparagus weeds (*Asparagus sp.*), Bridal creeper (*Asparagus asparagoides*), Green cestrum (*Cestrum parqui*), Blackberry (*Rubus fruticosus sp. aggregate*), Giant reed (*Arundo donax*), and Wild radish (*Raphanus raphanistrum*).

Control Program

Priority has been given to the control of Horehound (*Marrubium vulgare*) and Bridal creeper (*Asparagus asparagoides*), African boxthorn (*Lycium ferocissimum*), St John's wort (*Hypericum perforatum*), and Wild radish (*Raphanus raphanistrum*) on roadside reserves and council managed land.

Common White Snail Baiting Program

Snail baiting application occurred on Fairview Lane on 25 October.

Parks and Gardens:

Pools

Swim season commenced and both pools are open. Lockhart and The Rock Parks and Facilities teams worked diligently to ensure the grounds and gardens of both pools were immaculate before handing them over to our contractors for the season.

Yerong Creek Water Tower

Landscaping around the base of the tower is almost completed. The bulk of the planting was done with the assistance of local volunteers. The plants will be hand watered to aid their establishment over their first summer. All the paths have been constructed. The last of the planting and mulching is scheduled as resourcing allows.

Parks and Gardens

Routine garden maintenance is being conducted including regular weeding, spraying, pruning, deadheading, and mulching. Irrigation systems are being maintained and times adjusted for the spring growth season.

Weed Control

Weed control by mechanical and chemical methods is undertaken regularly in urban areas. Pesticides commonly used are Glyphosate and Dicamba. Signage is placed at property entrance when spraying is in progress. Freehand herbicide is trialled to test its ability to suppress the germination of khaki weed and Caltrop (bindi, cathead) seed. The active ingredient dimethenamid-P combined with pendimethalin in Freehand can be used in ornamental landscapes for pre-emergent weed control of annual grasses, susceptible sedge species and many small-seeded broadleaf weeds. It controls over 60 common weeds. If trial is successful application will be extended to other known problem areas.

Mowing and Slashing

The Spring mowing schedule is in full swing after recent rain events and warmer temperatures have accelerated growth rates. Access to some urban road reserves has been hindered by wet drainage areas. As growth rates increase, mowing of irrigated lawns returned to a fortnightly schedule. Some areas, including The Rock and Lockhart recreation grounds, require weekly maintenance.

Trees

Grinding of stumps from previously removed trees has been conducted this month. Watering of trees planted in the last two years will be conducted as temperatures increase.

Lockhart Shires Street Tree Policy 2.44 states; 'Council is responsible for the planting and maintenance of street trees, including the selection of species, regular health and safety checks, pruning, and removal and replanting requirements.

Issues presented to residents regarding street trees, including species selection, maintenance and/or removal should be made in writing and addressed to the General Manager. Such issues will be resolved based on financial and time restraints.

It was requested at the Ordinary Council Meeting held on 21 June 2021 that Councillors be updated on the progress of the service station at The Rock on a regular basis. The service station is still under assessment with additional information provided by the applicant on 7 July 2021 referred to Transport for NSW for consideration.

Customer requests:

More than 40% of all customer requests in the period 1 July 2021 to 30 September 2021 were for stray or barking dogs and trapped or feral cats. Approximately 19% of customer requests received during the same period were requests for works on unsealed roads.

Notice of Council Meeting

The December ordinary Council meeting will not be held on the scheduled date of 20 December 2021.

This is because the results of the Local Government Elections held on 4 December 2021 will not be declared until 21-23 December 2021.

Council is required to convene a meeting within 3 weeks of the election results being declared for the purposes of electing a Mayor.

Accordingly the next meeting of Council will be held at 5.00pm on Monday 10 January 2022 at which time a mayoral election will be held.

2021 NSW LOCAL GOVERNMENT ELECTIONS

SATURDAY 4 DECEMBER 2021

If you are an Australian citizen who is 18 years or older and lives in NSW you are likely to be enrolled to vote at NSW Local Government elections.

Every person whose name is on a council's residential roll for a NSW Local Government election must vote in that council's election in December.

You can check if and where you are enrolled to vote on the NSW Electoral Commission's website: elections.nsw.gov.au.

EARLY VOTING OPTIONS

*Subject to eligibility. Check your eligibility at elections.nsw.gov.au.

Voting by post*

You may be eligible to vote by post. COVID-19-specific eligibility criteria may apply to your circumstances. You can apply online for a postal vote from Tuesday 26 October. Find out more about postal voting at elections.nsw.gov.au or by calling 1300 135 736.

Your postal vote application must be completed and received by **5pm, Monday 29 November**.

Voting online*

Eligible voters may be able to apply to use the NSW Electoral Commission's technology-assisted voting platform, iVote, at these elections. Eligible voters can register online at elections.nsw.gov.au or by calling 1300 24 86 83.

Applications will open from 9am, Monday 22 November and applications close at **1pm, Saturday 4 December**. Voting using iVote closes at **6pm, Saturday 4 December**. If the 1pm application deadline is missed, iVote cannot be used to vote on the afternoon of election day.

Voting early in person

Pre-poll (early) voting begins on Monday 22 November and ends on Friday 3 December.

Early voting in person is available to all voters at these elections to help us stay COVID-safe.

Not all pre-poll venues are open for the entire pre-poll voting period. For specific operating dates, times and the locations of pre-poll venues, visit elections.nsw.gov.au.

VOTING ON ELECTION DAY

Polling (voting) places will open **8am – 6pm on Saturday 4 December**. On a Local Government election day, voting in person is available only at polling places set up for your council area and/or ward (if your council area has wards).

Visit elections.nsw.gov.au and enter your address to find out where you can vote.

Voting is compulsory.

Everyone whose name is on a residential roll for a NSW Local Government election must vote in that council's election.

You can check if and where you are enrolled to vote on the NSW Electoral Commission's website www.elections.nsw.gov.au.

There are penalties for not voting.

Voting is also compulsory for all voters included on the City of Sydney non-residential roll. Voting is not compulsory for voters included on the non-residential roll for other councils.

NSW Planning Portal

Lockhart Shire Council uses electronic lodgement of Development Applications (DA), Construction Certificates (CC), Complying Development Applications (CDC) & Section 68 through the [NSW Planning Portal](#). Applicants will need to establish their own account and then lodge their DA's, CC's and CDC's. For further information or for assistance please contact our Planning & Building team.

This is the process that Council recommends you follow:

- Contact our Planning Team on 02 6920 5305 to discuss your application or to arrange a pre lodgement meeting if required.

Visit the [NSW Planning Portal](#) to [Register](#) for a NSW Planning Portal account to start your application. This will enable you to access your dashboard, view, manage, track and progress applications, pay state agency fees and submit documents. You will also receive email notifications at key stages of the application process.

[Log in](#) to complete the online application form.

- For DA's and CC's you will need to submit a State of Environmental Effects, owner's consent, cost estimate report as well as all supporting plans and documents.
- For CDC's you will need to submit a certificate of title, site plan, design plans, structural plans and building specifications.
- Once we receive your application, Council will do a preliminary assessment and contact you to arrange payment of fees or request additional information.

Once Council is satisfied with the information provided and fees are paid, your application can be lodged.

Council encourages all applicants to arrange a pre lodgement meeting with the Planning & Building team to ensure all required paperwork is ready before lodgement.
