# Council Snippets 19 September 2022

## Engineering and Environmental Services Report

### Works

*Floods November 2021 and January 2022:* Emergency works for the November 2021 flood event is completed with emergency works for the January 2022 flood event nearing completion.

*Prichard Pl:* Minor drainage works will be carried out when weather permits to complete the project.

*Lockhart Kywong Rd – 1.25km North of Slocums Ln:* Three structures now completed. Minor roadworks will take place to complete the project, as weather permits.

*Mittagong Yerong Creek Road:* Funding secured through the Fixing Local Roads program to increase the capacity of two culverts and add additional width on Mittagong Yerong Creek Road. The culverts have been ordered with construction scheduled to commence in November 2022, weather permitting.

### *Unsealed Roads*

Maintenance of Shire gravel roads has been conducted on Ledheys Lane, Dick Knobels Lane, Robertsons Lane, Scheuners Lane, Wallace Brownes Road, Schneiders Lane, Osborne Pleasant Hills Road, Alf Freemans Lane, Wrathal School Lane, Illets Lane, Terlichs Lane, Fletts Lane, Vennells Lane Bankvale Rd, Neuhaus Lane, Janetskes Lane, Eulensteins Lane and Broughtons Lane.

### *Maintenance Crews*

The concrete crew have completed culvert extensions on Ryan Stock Route, installed awning at the Lockhart cemetery, the Pleasant Hills school pedestrian/bus stop is well under way a seal when weather permits will complete the project.

The bitumen crew have been kept busy with an increase of pavement failures due to the weather, routine maintenance has continued on our Local and Regional Roads.

### Parks & Gardens

#### *Athel Pine*

Athel Pine (*Tamarix aphylla*), a Weed of National Significance, is a fast-growing tree with serious impacts along waterways in arid and semi-arid Australia. It is regarded as one of the worst weeds in Australia because of its invasiveness, potential for spread, and economic and environmental impacts. It increases surface soil salinity changing ecosystems, shades and competes with desirable species.

This species was used as a street specimen by Council many years ago; most have been removed due to poor health and aesthetics but there are still a small number on Council-controlled land.

Athel pine is a declared weed in Lockhart Shire, removal is not required but seedlings must be controlled. While there has not been evidence of these specimens spreading, after full

consideration of their impact on the surrounding environment all Athel Pine on Council-controlled land including approximately 19 along East Street, Lockhart (Albury Rd) will be removed and replaced with a more suitable species when conditions and resources permit.

Enquiries regarding identification or control of this species on private property can be directed to Council's Manager Parks & Facilities or Environmental Officer.

## *Lockhart Caravan Park Entrance, Green St*

Replacement of the old granite path with paving has been completed and the pebble surface has been replaced with pea granite.

This area is already the home of the annual winner of Spirit of the Land sculpture and will also become the permanent home of the 'Spirit of the Land' Frame Sculpture, kindly donated by its creator David Fenwick of Weathered Garden Art, Mangoplah. The frame was very popular at the 2019 Spirit of the Land Festival with many visitors posing behind it for photos; its permanent inclusion in this position will allow visitors to take photos of themselves with the caravan park and creek backdrop throughout the year and can also be used during the festival.

## *Parks and Gardens*

Ongoing garden maintenance including weeding, spraying, pruning, deadheading, and mulching is being conducted to prepare Council facilities for spring and the event season.

## *Weed Control*

Weed control by mechanical and chemical methods is being conducted within urban areas as conditions allow. Pesticides commonly used are Glyphosate and Dicamba. Signage will be placed at property entrance when spraying is in progress.

Freehand herbicide has been trialled in several lawn situations to test its ability to suppress the germination of khaki weed and Caltrop (bindi/cathead) seed. Freehand is for pre-emergent weed control of annual grasses, susceptible sedge species and many small-seeded broadleaf weeds in ornamental landscape and warm season turf situations. The trial appears to have been quite successful; use will be extended in the upcoming season.

## *Mowing and Slashing*

Growth rates have started to increase; slashing in towns and villages is being conducted as required and where access for machines is available. Many roadsides are still quite saturated and difficult to get machines on without the risk of bogging.

Properties completed recently include Lockhart Airstrip, Milbrulong and Osborne Recreation Grounds, Clem Gooden Oval, Yerong Creek Cemetery and Lockhart Showground.

Growth rates of irrigated lawns is also increasing and being monitored.

The September schedule will focus on town entrances and other high-profile areas in preparation for upcoming events.

# Council Snippets 19 September 2022

## *Trees*

The tree maintenance program has continued, with a focus on under pruning old tree and formative pruning of younger street trees.

Watering of any trees planted in the last two years has ceased due to regular rain, cooler temperatures, and dormancy of many species. Watering requirements will be monitored as trees come back into leaf and the weather starts to warm up.

Lockhart Shires Street Tree Policy 2.44 states; 'Council is responsible for the planting and maintenance of street trees, including the selection of species, regular health, and safety checks, pruning, and removal and replanting requirements.

Issues presented to residents regarding street trees, including species selection, maintenance and/or removal should be made in writing and addressed to the General Manager. Such issues will be resolved based on financial and time restraints.

## Biosecurity

### *Control Program*

Priority has been given to the control of Bridal creeper (*Asparagus asparagoides*), Horehound (*Marrubium vulgare*) and Wild radish (*Raphanus raphanistrum*) on roadside reserves and council managed land.

### *DrumMUSTER*

Expressions of interest to run the upcoming drumMUSTER collection events closed on 19 August. Council received two submissions from shire-based community groups, both of which have managed collection events previously. St Joseph's School is the successful applicant for managing the collection event at Lockhart on 13 September, and The Rock Mens' Shed is the successful applicant for managing the collection event at The Rock on 15 September.

### *WeedSCAN*

It is difficult to manage what you can't identify. WeedScan is being developed by the Centre for Invasive Species Solution, CSIRO and the NSW Department of Primary Industries to help overcome this barrier. WeedScan is an app and website for identifying, reporting and managing priority weeds in Australia.

This new tool will provide state and national governments, natural resource management groups, graziers, farmers and communities with an easy-to-use digital tool enabling priority weeds to be identified quickly without expert knowledge; easy access to best practice management information; and action either at the individual enterprise level or as part of a community-led regional WeedScan network.

## Local Environmental Plan Review

The *Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979* (EP&A Act), requires all councils to periodically review their local environmental plans (LEPs) and determine if those LEPs should be amended following such a review. Council has resolved to undertake a review of its LEP and has engaged consultants Habitat Planning to assist with the review.

Habitat Planning are preparing a Profile and Issues Report and a Residential Land Use Study as part of the strategic work required to support any changes to the LEP.

Prior to finalising the Residential Land Use Study Habitat Planning proposes to undertake community consultation with any feedback received from the community being incorporated into a Draft Residential Land Use Study that will be presented to Council.

**Updated Information for Households**  
**Food Organics Garden Organics (FOGO) Green-Lid Bins**

The NSW Environmental Protection Authority (EPA) is introducing new regulations that govern what can and can't be placed in the green-lid FOGO bins.

The change by the NSW Government prohibits disposal of many items previously allowed under the current FOGO organics recycling service.

Residents and businesses with a FOGO service will only be permitted to dispose of organic kitchen scraps and garden waste under the new regulations..

This means items such as food-soiled paper and cardboard packaging, certified compostable packaging and cups, teabags, tissues, coffee filters, vacuum cleaner dust, hair, animal droppings and cat litter will no longer be permitted.

These items must now go in the red-lid landfill bin. The only permitted exception is the use of certified compostable bags, or paper for lining kitchen caddy bins.

According to the EPA the reasons for the change relate to specific concerns that have been raised about the long-term impacts of accumulated bio-plastics and substances commonly used in the manufacture of compostable food packaging.

The only material that can be placed in the green-lid FOGO bins now is:

- Food
- Garden organics
- Compostable plastic kitchen caddy liners that comply with Australian Standard AS 4736-2006 (for commercial composting) used to collect and transfer food waste to the FOGO bin
- Fibre-based kitchen caddy liners (e.g. paper or newspaper) used to collect and transfer food waste to the FOGO bin.

# HOUSEHOLD SAFETY AND SECURITY TIPS

### HOME SAFETY

**Theft is by far one of the most opportunistic crimes. Back doors left unlocked, windows left open, and garages not secured are the top ways that thieves enter homes.**

- Secure doors and windows at night. Security locks can be installed to allow air flow if required.
- Security lighting and CCTV can assist in deterring thieves. Sensor lights can also alert you when something is going on. These do not have to be hard wired in and solar powered units can be purchased locally and installed easily.
- Keep keys to vehicles in a secure location. Not in vehicles in your garage or car port and not hanging on hooks next to the front door.
- Ensure all valuables such as laptops, mobile phones, GPS and wallets cannot be seen from outside.
- Ensure laptops, tablets and mobile phones have security apps installed, such as “find my phone”.
- Engrave removable property with your driver’s licence number.
- Keep detailed descriptions and photographs of items that cannot be engraved such as jewellery.
- Keep an eye on your neighbour’s property if they’ve gone out.

### VEHICLE SAFETY

**Stealing vehicles and property from inside vehicles is one of the most common forms of crime in Australia. There are measures that you can take to improve car security and reduce the risk of theft.**

- When you leave your car unattended, even for a short period, close all windows, remove the key from the ignition and lock all doors. Remember, it’s an offence under the Australian Road Rules to leave your car unlocked.
- Ensure that you have removed all property from view, especially mobile telephones, clothing, bags and money in consoles when you leave your car. Either take it with you or lock it in the boot.
- Modern vehicles generally have an engine immobilizer installed to restrict the theft of your motor vehicle. This is one of the most effective ways to prevent a vehicle being stolen, however vehicles can still be towed away or have windows and locks broken.
- Don’t leave personal papers such as licence or registration in your motor vehicle. They may be used by a thief to dispose of your motor vehicle.

# HAWKWEEDS



Hieracium species

**Origin:** Hawkweeds are native to the northern hemisphere, South Africa and South America. Four species are known to occur in Australia: Orange hawkweed in Victoria and NSW; King devil hawkweed in Victoria; Wall hawkweed in NSW; and Mouse ear hawkweed in Tasmania.

**Description:** Hawkweeds are in the daisy family and are similar to dandelion (*Taraxacum officinale*) or flatweed (*Hypochaeris* sp.). Hawkweeds are perennial herbs of variable height (15 - 40 cm), and have a milky sap which is seen when their stem or leaves are broken.

Hawkweeds have the potential to be serious weeds in the temperate areas of south-eastern Australia, including the Australian Alps and Tasmanian grasslands. Prompt treatment of known populations has limited their spread so far.

Hawkweeds are highly invasive plants forming dense stands of up to 3800 plants per square metre. As such, it is a major threat to biodiversity, pastures, roadsides and gardens. They are frost-tolerant and competitive across a wide range of soil types, preferring cool climates with an annual rainfall above 500 mm.

**Leaves:** are stalkless, hairy on both surfaces, with smooth or slightly toothed margins and are sometimes 'sticky' to touch. Leaves occur in rosettes.

**Flowers:** are yellow, orange or red and 'daisy-like'. The flowers may be solitary or formed in a cluster of 5 to 30 flower heads. The flowers are 10 - 20 mm in diameter with square-ended petals, and grow on stems up to 40 cm. The flower stems are covered in short, stiff hairs.

**Seeds:** are purplish-black and ribbed with a bristly tuft up to 6 mm long. Up to 40 000 seeds per square metre are produced in summer. Seedheads resemble those of dandelions. Seeds have tufts that enable them to attach to hair, fur, clothing and vehicles. Seed can also be spread by wind, water, in contaminated fodder and garden waste, as well as on ski or hiking equipment. Seed can survive in the soil for many years. Germination occurs in spring after rain, establishing readily on bare soil and disturbed areas.

**Vegetative reproduction:** Hawkweed can reproduce and spread both by seed and vegetatively. Vegetative spread of plants by rhizomes (underground stems) and stolons (above ground rooting stems) is common. Stolons arise from buds at the base of the leaves.

**Weed classification:** on the **National Environmental Alert List**.

**Biosecurity duty: All of NSW: Prohibited Matter:** If you see this plant report it. Call the NSW DPI Biosecurity Helpline on 1800 680 244.

**Control:** Please do not attempt to treat or dispose of this weed yourself. Report this plant if you see it anywhere in NSW by calling the helpline listed above. NSW DPI will lead an initial response for the treatment and disposal of the plant to stop it from spreading.
