#### **Mayor's Report**

Our Values - Leadership; Integrity; Progressiveness; Commitment; Accountability; Adaptability



Hello everyone. We are now into September and still no worthwhile rain to speak of. As the year progresses I was giving some thought to the question of the ability of Local Government to function. I thought about the number of hurdles put in the way of Council to deliver the services you expect as ratepayers.

Hurdles such as compliance issues that all of us face. but being a level of government, you can multiply that effect by a factor of four. The staff that are constantly under the pump to meet deadlines on these issues. manage somehow only through great commitment. The workload every year seems to increase but they still deliver. Our Council this year applied for a Special Rate Variation which IPART, in their wisdom, chose to reject on the grounds we should use reserve funds. The rate cap stayed at 1.5 % while costs continue to rise. Here are some examples: The cost of road construction is rising year-on-year at approx. 2.6%; award wages growth 2.5%; RFS contribution 2.5%; CPI approx. 1.8%. Add to that an increase in guoted auditing costs of 41%, following legislative changes making the Audit-General the auditor for all councils, and you start to understand our frustration as a Council at being limited to a 1.5% increase in rates. Our role is to provide you, the residents and ratepayers, the services you have a right to expect and in the main we are achieving this, but it is getting harder and harder to achieve. We are fortunate in the Lockhart Shire that all of our staff, Directors and General Manager all punch above their weight to deliver those services you expect.

My question is where have the statesmen in politics gone who had the vision to look past the next election and have a plan that is achievable to deliver to the people what they have a right to expect. Stable government that doesn't engage in pointless point scoring and starts to deliver real benefits to people, not only in the cities but in the bush where business should be encouraged to decentralise and provide jobs and opportunities to those in rural areas.

Both sides of politics have been guilty of the above but it's time that changed and policies that encourage business to risk capital and create jobs and growth in our rural shires are to be applauded.

Lockhart Shire has been fortunate over the last few years with funds being directed to us via our Local Member's hard work and this is partly reflected in the facilities that are available throughout the Shire. I believe that State Government is trying to streamline the funding paths to rural Councils so that we can better fund our programmes, but not before time.

Local Government is the most relevant level of Government to the people because in the main we are the people you come to when you have a problem that requires fixing. We don't always get it right, but it could be made much easier for us to deliver the services you expect if we get back to the days when the decision makers thought a little more about the people they are supposed to serve.

Our Council has plans and a vision for the Shire that will hopefully see services and facilities enhanced and promote growth through the Shire, which in turn may provide developmental opportunities to those who may wish to invest in our Shire.

I know that I have put into this report my little 'Mayoral Tantrum', but I do think it is important that you all get the chance to understand the frustrations that we as a Council have. Our aim is to be the best Council we can and do the best possible for our Shire residents.

The sun came up this morning and it promises to be a beautiful day. Everything in the world is not bad, and we have much to be thankful for.

If you read down to this line, thank you. I hope I haven't spoilt your day or evening.

If it's any consolation I feel much better.

P.S. Don't forget to come to The Spirit of the Land.

#### Works Report:

Three grader crews are all undertaking maintenance grading. Construction projects are due to commence late September weather permitting. Concrete crew is continuing with maintenance of footpaths, drainage structures. kerb and gutter as well as signs maintenance throughout the Shire. PAMPS program for 2017/18 is the installation of shared path from Rio to Magnolia Lodge in Lockhart. Council has also been successful in securing a grant to install a new bus shelter at Lockhart Post Office and relocate the existing shelter donated by Rotary to Walter Day Park, with the existing information shelter at Walter Day Park to be relocated to Milbrulong as part of its heritage upgrade project.

#### **Major Projects Update**

Council is currently undertaking a number of major projects and the status of each of these is as follows:

- a) Swimming Pools Upgrade: Construction documents and engineering plans for The Rock pool buildings have been completed. Development Approval (DA) has been granted for the amenities upgrade at Lockhart pool, with The Rock pool currently being assessed. Council recently was advised it has been unsuccessful in gaining funding under the Building Better Regions Fund. Staff are looking at other funding opportunities via NSW Government's Regional Growth Fund.
- b) The Rock Sewer Extension: Mitchell Constructions from Albury has been awarded the tender for The Rock East Sewer Extension work. They are expected to be on site 11 September 2017 to commence work. Staff have been liaising with residents that are in the upgrade area to inform them of the upcoming work.
- c) The Rock STP Tertiary Ponds Upgrade: The security fencing has nearly been completed by LSC staff.
- d) Demolition of Voluntary Purchase Properties: Current grant funding allows for one more property to be purchased at each of

Lockhart and The Rock in 2017/18. An agreement with property owner in The Rock has been reached with funding confirmed. Negotiations with property owner in Lockhart is occurring including discussions with OEH regarding funding confirmation.

e) Flood Mitigation Construction: It is expected that staff will call for tenders for the construction works for the Lockhart Levee by September 2017. There is some administration works remaining regarding Aboriginal Land Claim on the Commons that need to be completed before construction works can commence. The Rock Strevens Street drainage works funding from OEH has been received, and is expected that staff will call for tenders for the construction works by October 2017.

#### Walter Day Park

Landscaping of the new public toilet site has commenced with excavation of the site for granite paths to the 'At the Dance' and 'Nine Martyrs' and the extension of garden beds. 'At The Dance' has been relocated to its approximate location and work has begun on the corten steel retaining wall. Steel edging has also been installed to define the new granite paths and garden beds. The Red Cross and CWA memorial roses have been transplanted to their new locations; the plagues will also be moved in the near future. New roses will also be added to the extended gardens around both the new and existing toilet blocks softening the overall structures, enhancing the sculptures and becoming a feature for visitors.

#### **Sculpture Trail**

The new granite and steel-edged path through Cowin Gardens is complete, linking Green St from the craft shop to the sculptures in Cowin Gardens and on to Walter Day Park. Some planting has also started, breaking up the large section of mulch running down Urana St; as this planting establishes the need for mulch will be greatly reduced.

#### The Rock Skate Park

#### **Regional Growth Fund**

The NSW Government has released its \$1.3B Regional Growth Fund to provide quality services and infrastructure to regional NSW. The Regional Growth Fund is split into two main streams: -

- (i) \$1B Economic Activation Fund projects of regional significance and have a Cost Benefit Ratio (CBR) >1.0. Grant programs under this stream are Growing Local Economies; Sport; Connecting Country Communities; and Resources for Regions. Unfortunately, Lockhart Shire does not qualify for Sport or Resources for Regions funding.
- (ii) \$300M Community Amenity Fund projects more local in nature to improve amenity in regional areas. These do not require a CBR >1.0. Grant programs under this stream are Stronger Country Communities; and Cultural Fund.

The Lockhart Progress Association has submitted an Expression of Interest (EOI) under the Cultural Fund for the Lockhart Museum Redevelopment project. In addition, a project proposal for improved internet services in rural areas is being considered under the 'Connecting Country Communities' funding stream

Stronger Country Communities grant program is specifically for infrastructure that improves the lives and amenity of local residents from parklands to health centres and community halls. The swimming pools upgrade at Lockhart and The Rock fall within the criteria for this funding. Council has allocated \$2M of its own funding in future budgets, and has consulted with the community and the project is shovel ready. Council will be making application under this program for funding that will enable the full refurbishment of the two swimming pools.

Part of the assessment process for "Stronger Country Communities" fund applications is that up to 100 community members will be

randomly contacted in a survey to ascertain if Council has liaised with the community on its nominated project(s), in this case being the swimming pools upgrade. Support from the community in the random survey will assist Council in its application to receive significant grant funding for the pools upgrade, thus reducing the financial burden on Council and rate payers. Council has consulted with the community regarding the swimming pools, being the last significant community facility project left to be completed by Council, via community information sessions, surveys, Community Strategic Plan consultation nights and the recent Special Rate Variation application process.

Growing Local Economies grant program aims to help regional communities capitalise on their strengths or broaden and reposition their industry base. Following a recent bridge assessment some bridges were found to be inadequate to carry multi-axel trucks let alone High Mass Limits (HML). The repair and upgrade to these bridges and culverts to allow HML access would provide significant economic benefit to our local agricultural industry. The cost of repairing/upgrading the bridges and culverts is \$1.6M of which Council has allocated \$612,000 in its 2017/18 budget. Council will be making application under Growing Local Economies funding program for the balance of the funds required. The average Cost Benefit Ratio calculated for these repairs/ upgrades is 75, well above the minimum required of 1, demonstrating significant benefit to local producers, grain receival points and transport operators. The project also aligns with State and Regional transport strategies and priorities, as well as being shovel ready.

#### **Local Heritage Grants 2017-18**

Council's Local Heritage Grant program is an event that aims to preserve, protect and/or identify areas or buildings of local heritage significance. NSW Office of Environment and Heritage (OEH) support the program by providing funding to support Council's commitment at \$1:\$1. This year, \$15,000 has been made available.

grant program to a particular town. Last year's very successful program saw to the restoration of verandahs on existing heritage recognised buildings in the village of Milbrulong, as well as some heritage display boards and signage.

Council proposes to undertake the following works in 2017/18 to the Lockhart Heritage Conservation Area under the Local Heritage Grant project subject to consultation with property owners: -

- veranda gutters
- Provide painting, and where possible signage. to blend parapet and fascia areas
- Other minor works to restore shopfronts and verandahs as funding allows.

The Rock Pool Contractor - 2017/18 Season Council resolved at its meeting 18 September 2017 to award the lease of The Rock Swimming Pool for 2017/18 season to Ms Sally Hunter.

Please note the swimming season for both . Lockhart and The Rock pools commences Monday 13 November 2017 and closes Sunday 11 March 2018.

#### **Waste Collection Contract**

Council participated with Wagga Wagga City Council (WWCC) in a recent tender process for the Waste Collection Contract and resolved at its August 2017 meeting not to accept any tenders and to enter negotiations with the respective parties.

As part of the negotiations the introduction of a 3-bin system is being considered with the third bin being a 240L Food Organics Garden Organics (FOGO) service collected weekly. With the intention of the general waste collection going to fortnightly it is suggested to keep the current 240L bins, as well as introduce an additional pick up at Christmas and Easter. This will help reduce any concerns from residents that they will not have sufficient bin space for their waste, particularly at the busy times of the year. The FOGO bin can take any organic material including all food waste

Each year, Council have been dedicating the including meat and eggs, dairy products, all garden waste as well as tea bags, cardboard and paper towels. The recycling service would remain the same at a 240L bin collected fortniahtly.

> Staff have commenced negotiations with contractors and based on current negotiations a 3-bin system (FOGO service) can be introduced for nil extra cost to the community.

In addition, a short online survey of residents was recently undertaken to gauge support for a Provide new downpipes and spouts to FOGO 3-bin system in addition to the survey conducted in October 2015. Results of the most recent survey are as follows:

- 78 responses were received
- 60% supported introduction of a FOGO service
  - 69% supported existing 240L general waste service to go to a fortnightly pick up
- 69% did no support introduction of 140L general waste service
  - The survey did tell us that more education is needed on FOGO and waste collection services. Staff have already acknowledged this fact and if a 3-bin service was introduced it would also be associated with a significant education program.

In 2015 survey respondents (118 responses) marginally supported the introduction of a FOGO service - 55% to 45%.

Negotiations with contractors are continuing and a further report will be tabled at the Council's October 2017 meeting.





#### **BIOSECURITY IN NSW - PART 3**



Notification of intention to inspect a property: One significant difference between the Noxious Weeds Act 1993 and the Biosecurity Act 2015 is in regard to the notice of entry into a property for the purpose of noxious/priority weeds inspection.

Under the Noxious Weeds Act 1993, prior to performing an inspection, the local control authority (Council) was required to give the owner of a property a notice of intent to enter that property for the purpose of a noxious weeds inspection.

Under the Biosecurity Act 2015, there is no legislative obligation to notify property owners of an intention to enter a property for the purpose of a priority weeds inspection. An authorised officer may enter any property at any reasonable time, or in the case of an emergency, at any time. In regard to scheduled inspections, Lockhart Shire Council will continue to notify property owners as a gesture of respect, and invite property owners to accompany the inspector during the inspection, enabling awareness and education.

Following the inspection: If no priority weeds were discovered during an inspection, the property owner will receive a letter which states this. If priority weeds were discovered during the inspection, the owner will receive an inspection report, detailing the weeds that were found and the location of the weeds within the property. The property

owner then has an opportunity to provide Council with a biosecurity undertaking.

What is a Biosecurity Undertaking: A formal agreement accepted by an inspector, given by the property owner who is responsible for the control of priority weeds present on their property. Within the biosecurity undertaking, the property owner will state that they will take appropriate action to discharge their biosecurity duty, specifying the measures or actions the property owner has agreed to implement and the time period by which these are to be implemented.

In order to assist property owners, Council will provide a template of a biosecurity undertaking with the priority weeds inspection report. The inspector will be available to assist property owners in the preparation of the biosecurity undertaking. particularly the contravention, the measures that are required or are appropriate to remedy or prevent the contravention. Agreement needs to be reached about the measures to be undertaken and the timeframe. The property owner is bound by the undertaking and consequences will be incurred should they fail to comply.

The inspector may decide to either accept or reject the undertaking, bearing in mind the nature of the contravention and the significance of the resulting biosecurity risk. An inspector may refuse to accept a biosecurity undertaking from the property owner if the inspector believes the actions will be insufficient to mitigate, manage or prevent the biosecurity risk.
