Mayoral Report

The New Year period came and went too quickly and now we are back into full swing with a big program of works to get through.

The year started with our Australia Day ceremony which was catered for by the Lockhart Football/Netball Club who did a fine job. Congratulations to Keith Edgerton on being awarded Citizen of the Year, Mick Flinn a Community Award, Aaron McCarthy Sportsperson of the Year and Nick Madden Young Citizen of the Year.

As you are aware this March the State Election will be held and we have been the beneficiaries of some additional funding. We have



received \$1m for disaster recovery, our priorities for this funding if approved by State Government are drainage works in Emily Street The Rock, Cole Street Yerong Creek and Pritchard Place Lockhart. Culverts for the Flood Detour Rd at Lockhart and sealing of access roads at our waste facilities. We have also received an additional \$2.4m to assist us with repairs and maintenance of our road system. Stronger Country Community Grants were also announced and these include \$120k for tennis courts at Pleasant Hills, \$140K for the Brookong Creek Masterplan and \$600k for a new Community Centre at The Rock.

The General Manager and I recently met with the new CEO of Telstra and senior managers to continue our push for improvements in mobile reception and connectivity issues. I will also be attending a Rural Forum in Sydney to discuss priorities for regional and rural communities in the upcoming election. In a further boost for local tourism Council was successful in securing funding for Electric Vehicle (EV) charging stations at Lockhart and The Rock.

Special thanks to Crs Day and Matthews for organising the recent Seniors Event in Lockhart. It was an impressive turnout from around the Shire and the feedback has been very positive. Thanks also to Dr Joe McGirr for taking the time to come out and address the group.

Councillors and senior staff will be undertaking a bus tour of the Shire on 20 March prior to the setting of our 2023/24 budget, this will assist us in determining priorities for next financial year. Also the exhibition time for the LEP has been extended until early March if you wish to make a submission.

Council would also like to welcome our new Police Sergeant Damien Davies who has commenced duty. Damien would be familiar to a lot of Lockhart residents as he was previously stationed here. I would also like to welcome my new granddaughter Ruby MacKillop Pedemont to the family.

On a sadder note the Shire recently lost some distinguished citizens namely Gary and Des O'Connell, former councillor Peter Wilson and our wonderful artist Doris Golder. These people have made a significant contribution to the Shire over many years and Council extends its condolences to family and friends.

Council Snippets 13 February 2023

ENGINEERING AND ENVIRONMENTAL SERVICES REPORT

General

Council was successful in receiving grant funding under the Electric Vehicle Fleet Incentives Program. Council has purchased two Plug In Hybrid Electric Vehicles (PHEVs) and one Battery Electric Vehicle (BEV), which are all FBT exempt. Council has also purchased an electric ride-on mower.

In addition to the funding received under the Fixing Local Roads (Pothole) program, Council has received further funding under the Regional and Local Roads Repair Program. Further claims are in progress for storm damaged roads as a result of recent events.

Works

<u>September Storm Event</u>: Emergency works for the September 2022 storm event are continuing on rural and unsealed roads.

Working with Damage Control Project Management (DCPM) regarding funding for weather affected roads. Ongoing.

<u>Prichard Place Lockhart:</u> Minor drainage works were completed in January. Project completed.

<u>Lockhart Kywong Rd – 1.25km North of Slocums Lane</u>: Work has commenced on the realignment of pavement over the new culverts. Pavement has been widened, gravel added and seal complete. Project completed.

Lockhart Kywong Rd – Fargunyah Lane: Survey and design to be completed by end January.

<u>Mittagong Yerong Creek Road</u>: Culverts have been ordered and delivery is under way. Construction scheduled to commence February 2023, weather permitting.

<u>Depot Improvements</u>: Security gates for the Lockhart works depot have been ordered and installation will take place early in 2023. Currently seeking quotes for an office/ lunchroom for The Rock depot.

Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Grants Program (LRCI)

Lockhart Recreation Ground: Sealing work in progress. Minor works to complete.

Henty Pleasant Hills Road: Clearing has been completed with work to commence early in 2023.

<u>Unsealed Road Maintenance of Shire gravel roads:</u> Maintenance has been conducted on Boyds Road, JR Smiths Lane, Dunlevys Lane, Jarricks Lane, Barracluffs Lane, Schirmers Lane, Slocums Lane, Amerys Lane, Carrols Lane, Ellis Lane, French Park Bullenbung Road, Henty Ryan Road, Tootal Mittagong Road, and Western Road.

Maintenance Crews:

Both the bitumen and maintenance crews have been kept busy with an increase of pavement failures due to the weather. Routine maintenance has continued on our Local and Regional Roads.

Gravel maintenance on Lockhart back lanes has been completed and maintenance on The Rock back lanes has been completed.

Parks & Facilities

<u>Australia Day</u>

The gardens surrounding Lockhart pool were tidied and mowing scheduled to coincide with the celebrations held at the facility.

Parks and Gardens

Garden maintenance has been stepped up to get weed growth back under control, efforts have been concentrated around high traffic areas. Irrigation systems are being checked regularly and maintained as required.

Weed Control

Weed control by mechanical and chemical methods is being conducted within urban areas as resources and conditions allow. Pesticides commonly used are Glyphosate and Dicamba. Signage will be placed at property entrance when spraying is in progress.

Mowing and Slashing

The summer mowing schedule has continued; due to high growth conditions most areas have needed to be mowed again after the Christmas break. Extreme weather conditions will be considered when scheduling slashing. Fortnightly mowing and edging is being scheduled for most irrigated areas.

Trees

Athel Pines along East St/Albury Rd are scheduled to be removed in February.

Watering of trees planted in the last two years is being conducted weekly.

Lockhart Shires Street Tree Policy 2.44 states; 'Council is responsible for the planting and maintenance of street trees, including the selection of species, regular health, and safety checks, pruning, and removal and replanting requirements.

Resident concerns regarding street trees, including species selection, maintenance and/or removal should be made in writing and addressed to the General Manager. Such issues will be resolved based on risk and available budget and resources.

Control Program

Priority has been given to the control of Feathertop Rhodes grass (*Chloris virgata*), St John's wort (*Hypericum perforatum*), Bathurst burrs (*Xanthium spinosum*), St. Barnaby's thistle (*Centaurea solstitialis*), Silverleaf nightshade (*Solanum elaeagnifolium*) and Blackberry (*Rubus fruticosus* species aggregate) on roadside reserves and council managed land.

Local Environmental Plan Review



The Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979 (EP&A Act), requires all councils to periodically review their local environmental plans (LEPs) and determine if those LEPs should be amended following such a review. Lockhart Shire Council uses electronic lodgement of Development Applications (DA), Construction Certificates (CC), Complying Development Applications (CDC) & Section 68 through the <u>NSW Planning Portal.</u> Applicants will need to establish their own account and then lodge their DA's, CC's and CDC's. For further information or for assistance please contact our Planning & Building team.

This is the process that Council recommends you follow:

• Contact our Planning Team on 02 6920 5305 to discuss your application or to arrange a pre lodgement meeting if required.

Visit the <u>NSW Planning Portal</u> to <u>Register</u> for a NSW Planning Portal account to start your application. This will enable you to access your dashboard, view, manage, track and progress applications, pay state agency fees and submit documents. You will also receive email notifications at key stages of the application process.

Log in to complete the online application form.

- For DA's and CC's you will need to submit a State of Environmental Effects, owner's consent, cost estimate report as well as all supporting plans and documents.
- For CDC's you will need to submit a certificate of title, site plan, design plans, structural plans and building specifications.
- Once we receive your application, Council will do a preliminary assessment and contact you to arrange payment of fees or request additional information.
- Once Council is satisfied with the information provided and fees are paid, your application can be lodged.

Council encourages all applicants to arrange a pre lodgement meeting with the Planning & Building team to ensure all required paperwork is ready before lodgement.

What will be accepted:

- Clean drums, rinsed to the Agsafe standard
- Drums larger than 1 litre and up to 205 litre;
- Drums that have been used for agricultural and livestock production, pest and weed control;
- Drums that are not hazardous substances, used in agricultural production
 - All pesticides
 - ☑ Seed dressings
 - ☑ Drenches
 - ☑ Wetters/Stickers/Adjuvants
 - ☑ Foam markers

What will not be accepted

- Drums with any residue (including lid and neck)
- Drums containing more than 100mL of rinsate

Drums that packaged the following;

- Liquid chlorine
- K Household disinfectants
- E Petroleum products

- 1. Empty the contents of the container into the spray tank and allow the container to drain for an extra 30 seconds after the flow reduces to drops.
- 2. Fill the container with clean water to about 20% of its capacity and replace the cap securely.
- 3. Shake, rotate, roll or invert the container vigorously for at least 30 seconds, so that the rinse water reaches all inside surfaces.
- 4. Pour the rinsate (the rinsing water from step 3) into the sprav tank. Let it drain for an extra 30 seconds after the flow reduces to drops.
- 5. Repeat until the container has been rinsed three times
- Containers should have caps removed for easy access by inspectors.
- No container will be accepted if they are crushed because it makes them difficult to inspect.
- Steel drums must be punctured.
- Please do not puncture plastics as some are reused
- All persons delivering drums to the **drumMUSTER** must sign a Container Cleanliness Declaration, noting the exact number of drums for delivery to drumMUSTER.

To ensure the **DrumMUSTER** operates efficiently and without time delay, drums will only be accepted at the facility by appointment. You may book a time to dispose of your properly cleaned chemical containers by calling Lockhart Shire Council on 02 6920 5305. Please count your drums and let Council know how many you have so the time allocated to you will be sufficient for inspecting.




