Mayoral Report

Well May is upon us and it appears that winter may be arriving early. The nights are certainly chilly but the days have been pleasant. All the local football/netball sides are doing well and patrons and players are enjoying the improved facilities. Our recreation grounds have been the beneficiaries of significant upgrades and it is great to see them fully utilized.

Council would like to welcome Jesse Rapley as our new Manager Planning and Environment. Jesse recently worked for Coolamon Council and we are sure he will make a positive contribution to the Shire. I would also like to welcome John Fox to Council as our new Project Officer.



At our recent Police and Community Consultation Group meeting Council were advised that the Police residence at The Rock Police Station has been fully renovated and a new officer Phillip Bitterlin will take up occupancy in July. He will replace Ryan Withers who has been transferred. We thank Ryan for his contribution to the Shire. This will mean we have four officers permanently living in the Shire. Police have also reminded residents that they should report any suspicious activity to their local police or Crime Stoppers.

Council has endorsed for public exhibition the Draft Operational Plan Budget for 2023/24 and Draft Delivery Program Estimates 2024/25-2026/27. The Draft Budget forecasts a deficit of \$ 72,366.00 which was the result of the State Government withdrawing its subsidy for the Emergency Services Levy (ESL) which means Council has to find an additional \$75,000. This advice was received well after the budget process had commenced and Council has written to the Treasurer, the Local Government Minister and Local Member strongly arguing that this impost is totally unreasonable and a continuation of cost shifting to local government. All rural and regional councils are impacted by this decision.

Council also received the results of our Community Survey which provided some interesting insights. It was disappointing that only 42 people completed the full survey however Council will be working to improve its communication with residents to keep them fully informed of developments. Council has budgeted for a more comprehensive independent survey for next financial year,

Congratulations must go to Cr Matthews and those involved in organising a public meeting to ensure the Lockhart Show continues. I am informed it was a successful meeting with a number of residents volunteering to assist. Special thanks to Dr Joe McGirr for attending. Also thanks to Cr Day for her enthusiasm in garnering support for a local gym.

Preliminary plans have been received for drainage works in Emily Street The Rock, these concepts are currently being reviewed prior to consultation with affected residents. Special thanks also to the Progress Association for arranging a meeting with residents impacted by overland flows. The information they provided will be valuable in our flood study review.

Council will soon be seeking Community feedback on the possibility of lowering the speed limit to 40km/h in Green Street Lockhart between Urana and Matthews Streets. This is about improving safety and access especially for elderly and people with disabilities.

Finally, special thanks to all the residents who turned out to strongly support our veterans and service personnel on Anzac Day. All ceremonies were well attended which is a testament to our respect for their service to our nation. The local RSL Sub- Branches do a great job in continuing this tradition.

WORKS

<u>Works September Storm Event:</u> Emergency works for the September 2022 storm event are continuing on rural and unsealed roads. Council is working with Damage Control Project Management (DCPM) regarding funding for weather affected roads. Ongoing.

Prichard Place: Quotations have been sought from engineering consultants.

<u>Lockhart Kywong Road</u>: Fargunyah Lane: Design in progress. A delay in the project will require resubmission in next year's program for construction works.

<u>Mittagong Yerong Creek Road:</u> Clearing works has commenced with the removal of several trees. All culverts have been delivered.

<u>The Rock Mangoplah Road:</u> Shoulder widening has commenced on The Rock Mangoplah Road east of Jaegers Lane.

Henty Pleasant Hills Road: The project has commenced.

<u>Depot Improvements</u>: Security gates for the Lockhart works depot have been installed. Office/lunchroom for The Rock depot has been installed with power and water services connected.

Reseal Program: The reseal program has been completed for 2022/23.

<u>Unsealed Roads</u>: Unsealed Road Maintenance of Shire gravel roads has been conducted on: Boyds Lane, Browns Lane, Humphrys Lane and Dick Knobles Lane.

Maintenance Crews: Both the bitumen and maintenance crews have been kept busy with an increase of pavement failures due to the weather whilst routine maintenance has continued on our Local and Regional Roads. Maintenance crews have been attending to the back log of customer enquiries.

PARKS & GARDENS

Easter and ANZAC Day:

Special consideration was given to high profile areas prior to the Easter long weekend. Maintenance of public areas visited during ANZAC Day activities was timed to ensure they were well presented for the day. The Victoria Cross sculpture by David Fenwick and purchased by the Lockhart & District Community Bank - Bendigo Bank was placed at the Lockhart cenotaph for the ANZAC Day ceremony. The permanent position has been agreed upon; works will be scheduled when resources are available.

<u>Walter Day Park</u>: The shade sail over the playground has been removed for repairs. A new style of swing has been installed at the playground thanks to the Lockhart Lions Club. The Tango face-to-face swing seat is a unique design

promoting interaction and communication between generations during play, allowing an adult (or older child) to swing face-to-face with the toddler which enhances positive interaction whilst of course, having fun.

Weed Control:

Weed control by mechanical and chemical methods is being conducted within urban areas as resources and conditions allow. Pesticides commonly used are Glyphosate and Dicamba. Signage will be placed at property entrance when spraying is in progress.

<u>Trees</u>: Removal of Athel Pines on East St/Albury Rd has been completed. Annual under-pruning of Council's street trees and pruning of limbs protruding into urban lanes will commence shortly.

BIOSECURITY

Weeds:

Property Inspections

Inspections were carried out on residential and rural properties, which contained Coolatai grass (*Hyparrhenia hirta*) in historical inspections, or which were selected due to a change in ownership.

The most commonly found weeds were Bridal creeper (Asparagus asparagoides), African lovegrass (Eragrostis curvula), Bathurst burr (Xanthium spinosum), Coolatai grass (Hyparrhenia hirta), Horehound (Marrubium vulgare), Prickly pear (Opuntia sp.), Privet (Ligustrum sp.), Silverleaf nightshade (Solanum elaeagnifolium), St. John's wort (Hypericum perforatum) and Willow (Salix sp.) respectively.

Control Program

Priority has been given to the control of African lovegrass (*Eragrostis curvula*), Bathurst burrs (*Xanthium spinosum*), Blue heliotrope (*Heliotropium amplexicaule*), Feathertop Rhodes grass (*Chloris virgata*), Horehound (*Marrubium vulgare*), Noogoora burr (*Xanthium occidentale*), Prickly pear (*Opuntia* sp.), St. John's wort (*Hypericum perforatum*) and Yellow flowered devil's claw (*Ibicella lutea*) on roadside reserves and council managed land.

Pests:

Autumn fox baiting is scheduled to begin on 2 May, with bait distribution occurring on the Galore Hill Scenic Reserve and Kincaids Reserve.

Snail baiting application occurred on Fairview Lane on 3 April.

This will enable you to access your dashboard, view, manage, track and progress applications, pay state agency fees and submit documents. You will also receive email notifications at key stages of the application process.

Log in to complete the online application form.

- For DA's and CC's you will need to submit a State of Environmental Effects, owner's consent, cost estimate report as well as all supporting plans and documents.
- For CDC's you will need to submit a certificate of title, site plan, design plans, structural plans and building specifications.
- Once we receive your application, Council will do a preliminary assessment and contact you to arrange payment of fees or request additional information.
- Once Council is satisfied with the information provided and fees are paid, your application can be lodged.

Council encourages all applicants to arrange a pre lodgement meeting with the Planning & Building team to ensure all required paperwork is ready before lodgement.



Nappies & FOGO - NO NO

Placing nappies in FOGO is a NO, NO

Some residents are still placing nappies and adult continence pads in BioBags and then in the Green Lidded Bin. This is a NO NO.

Please place all nappies and continence pads in the Red Lidded General Waste Bin.

Nappy management in general waste bins

Nappies must go in the general waste (red lidded) bin. Nearly all bins smell a bit and particularly bins containing nappies. Here are some ways to minimise odours:

- tip nappy contents into the toilet before you throw the nappy into the bin
- wrap nappy tightly into itself and use the tabs to secure
- tie nappy in a compostable bag, removing air
- store your rubbish bin in the shade
- make sure the lid can close properly
- add odour neutralisers such as bi-carb soda to your bin.

IT'S COMMON COURTESY & THE LAW TO PICK UP AFTER YOUR DOG

Picking up after your dog is not only common courtesy but your duty as a pet owner. When faeces is left lying in grassy areas, parks, and even the sidewalk the smell can become a health hazard. When you take your dog for a walk away from your home, you are entering public property. Because you own your dog, what waste your dog makes is responsibility to pick up. Under the Companion Animals Act 1998. the owner or person in charge of a dog that defecates in a public place must immediately remove the dog's faeces and properly dispose of them. This offence carries a maximum fine of \$880. Residents can report to Council any breaches. Plus, it's just good manners.

AFRICAN BOXTHORN



Lycium ferocissimum

Other common names: Boxthorn, Cape boxthorn, Boksdorn

Origin: Native to southern Africa, and introduced to Australia in the mid-1800s as a hedge plant.

Description: Weed of National Significance. A perennial shrub up to 5 metres in height and with a deep and extensive branched root system that will sucker and produce new growth when broken.

African boxthorn is an aggressive invader of pastures, roadsides, reserves, remnant bushland and waterways. It forms an impenetrable, spiny thicket that inhibits the movement of vehicles, livestock and people. It has large thorns which can injure livestock, native animals and people.

It provides shelter and food for pest animals including foxes, rabbits and starlings. It is a host for pest insects including fruit fly, the common house fly and the tomato fly, which breed in the fruit of this weed. Drought tolerant.

Leaves: Oval with a rounded tip. Smooth and fleshy. 10 – 40 mm long. Bright green. In clusters along the branchlets. Larger and more succulent on regrowth from damaged roots.

Flowers: White to purple with 5 petals. 1 cm in diameter. Tubular at the base with purple or pale blue markings. Fragrant. Single or in pairs in the

leaf axis. Usually present spring and summer but can occur year round.

Fruit: Round berries. Green when young. Orange -red when ripe. 5 – 10 mm in diameter containing 20 – 70 seeds. Usually present in autumn but can be present year round.

Seed: Light brown to yellow. Irregular-shaped. Flattened. Smooth with small raised dots. 2.5 mm long and 1.5 mm wide. Seeds are mainly spread by animals, particularly through birds and foxes eating fruit.

Toxicity: African boxthorn berries, leaves, stems and roots are toxic to humans.

Priority weed: African boxthorn is considered a priority weed in the Lockhart Shire.

For All of NSW: General Biosecurity Duty: All plants are regulated with a general biosecurity duty to prevent, eliminate or minimise any biosecurity risk they may pose. Any person who deals with any plant, who knows (or ought to know) of any biosecurity risk, has a duty to ensure the risk is prevented, eliminated or minimised, so far as is reasonably practicable.

For All of NSW: Prohibition on certain dealings: Must not be imported into the state, sold, bartered, exchanged or offered for sale.
