Mayoral Report

Another month has almost come and gone and still the rain persists. I never thought I would say that we have had enough rain but a break of a month would be greatly appreciated to enable a start for harvest. Complaints aside it has been a busy month with Cr Sharp, the General Manager and myself attending the Local Government Conference in Cessnock. This provides a great opportunity to network and hear from the government and opposition on their plans for the future. Of course the major focus was the floods that are severely impacting many parts of the State and the horrendous cost of repairs and restitutions of road networks, community facilities and in some cases whole communities. So widespread is the problem that 126 out of128 local governments have had disaster declarations in the last 12 months. It will take an enormous effort and a substantial injection of funds to overcome these issues.



On 11 November Remembrance Day was observed across the Shire and I thank all those who took the time to remember those who paid the ultimate sacrifice and all those still serving in overseas missions. On Sunday 13th November I attended The Rock Show which managed to proceed despite the wet weather. It was unfortunate that a number of events couldn't proceed due to the conditions of the ground but it was still well supported.

During the month we also had a visit from the Local Government Grants Commission which distribute Financial Assistance Grants from the Federal Government. They explained how the monies are distributed and the formulas used. I am pleased that Lockhart will be receiving an increase to assist with its programs.

Our quarterly Police and Community Consultation Group meeting took place in Pleasant Hills and I am pleased to advise that a new Sergeant has been appointed to the District and will commence in the New Year. We thank Sgt Ged Horsley for his service to the Shire. Police have again requested that people continue to report incidents especially vandalism to enable them to focus their efforts.

The GM and myself also attended the Country Mayors Association (CMA) meeting in Sydney recently where Mayor Jamie Chaffey of Gunnedah was elected Chair to replace Mayor Ken Keith from Parkes. Temora's Mayor Rick Firman was elected Deputy Chair. With the state election rapidly approaching the CMA were keen to identify local government priorities to be put to the major parties. These include health, more trade apprenticeships, roads, telecommunication, transport bottlenecks and housing.

On a sadder note the Shire has been shaken by the death of 2 young people. This has been devastating for family and friends and our heartfelt thoughts and prayers go out to them. Just remember there is help available and don't be afraid to reach out if you are struggling.

Finally, as this will be my last report for the year I would like to take this opportunity to thank all volunteers and groups that go that extra mile to make the Shire a good place to live in. Special thanks to the GM and staff for their efforts throughout the year. Thanks also to my fellow councillors for the collegiate way in which they conducted council business and assisted me throughout my first year. Special thanks to the SES, RFS and Police for their outstanding contribution to the welfare and safety of residents.

In closing I wish you all a happy, safe and blessed Christmas. I hope you enjoy time with family and friends and a well-earned rest. Also please remember those doing it tough and those less fortunate.

ENGINEERING AND ENVIRONMENTAL SERVICES

WORKS

Stormwater

Ongoing rain is causing minor flooding throughout the Shire affecting works programs. Council crews have been working outside normal hours to attend to issues including closing roads. Council crews have undertaken works at Emily Street, The Rock and planning minor work at Cole Street, Yerong Creek. Engineering designs are being sought for these locations to improve drainage and provide budget estimates noting previous work done as part of Councils flood studies. Council has also received notification of approved works from Transport for NSW for flood damaged roads.

Prichard Place Lockhart

Minor drainage works will be carried out when weather permits to complete the project.

Lockhart Kywong Rd – 1.25km North of Slocums Lane

Work has commenced on the realignment of pavement over the new culverts.

Mittagong Yerong Creek Road

Culverts have been ordered and construction is scheduled to commence in February 2023, weather permitting.

Unsealed Road Maintenance

Maintenance of gravel roads has been conducted on Tara Road, Amerys Lane, Tootool Mittagong Road, Edgehill School Lane, Edgehill Stock Route, McReadies Lane, Seberrys Lane, Bankvale Road, Fletts Lane, and Long Park Road.

Maintenance Crews

Both the bitumen and maintenance crews have been kept busy with an increase of pavement failures due to the weather, routine maintenance has continued on our Local and Regional Roads.

PARKS AND GARDENS

Pools

Swim season is here again and both our sparkling pool facilities are open. Lockhart and The Rock Parks and Gardens teams maintained the grounds and gardens throughout the off season and ensured they were ready to be handed over to our contractors.

Athel Pine

Athel Pine (*Tamarix aphylla*) a Weed of National Significance, is a fast-growing tree with serious impacts along waterways in arid and semi-arid Australia. It is regarded as one of the worst weeds in Australia because of its invasiveness, potential for spread, and economic and environmental impacts. It increases surface soil salinity changing ecosystems, shades and competes with desirable species.

This species was used as a street specimen by Council many years ago; most have been removed due to poor health and aesthetics but there are still a small number on Council controlled land

Athol pine is a declared weed in Lockhart Shire, removal is not required but seedlings must be controlled. While there has not been evidence of these specimens spreading, after full consideration of their impact on the surrounding environment all Athel Pine on Council controlled land including approximately 19 along East Street, Lockhart (Albury Road) north of the railway line, will be removed and replaced with a more suitable species when conditions and resources permit.

Enquiries regarding identification or control of this species on private property can be directed to Council's Manager Parks & Facilities or Environmental Officer.

Gazania

Gazania (*Gazania linearis*) is regarded as an environmental weed in Victoria, Tasmania and South Australia and as an emerging or potential environmental weed in parts of Western Australia and New South Wales.

Gazania have been spreading in the Shire's towns and along the roadsides for many years and have the potential to be become a much bigger problem. Their seed is dispersed via wind and water. Storm water movement has resulted in a large infestation along Brookong Creek in Lockhart township.

Any assistance from residents to control this weed would be appreciated, including removing it from or not planting it in your garden or nature strip. Mowing before the flowers produce seed can also help slow the spread. Please do not cultivate or share these plants.

Gazania hybrids are very hardy and are still sold in nurseries; hybrids with sterile seed are now available, please ask the nursery before purchasing them.

For advice on controlling this weed or help with identification please contact Council's Environmental Officer.

Parks And Gardens

Ongoing garden maintenance including weeding, spraying, pruning, deadheading, and mulching has been conducted to prepare Council facilities for spring and the event season. Irrigation systems will be checked and turned on as required.

Weed Control

Weed control by mechanical and chemical methods is being conducted within urban areas as resources and conditions allow. Pesticides commonly used are Glyphosate and Dicamba. Signage will be placed at property entrance when spraying is in progress.

Freehand herbicide has been trialed in several lawn situations to test its ability to suppress the germination of khaki weed and Caltrop (bindi/cathead) seed. Freehand is for pre-emergent weed control of annual grasses, susceptible sedge species and many small-seeded broadleaf weeds

in ornamental landscape and warm season turf situations. The trial appears to have been quite successful; use will be extended in the upcoming season.

Mowing And Slashing

Spring growth rates are with us; slashing in towns and villages is being conducted as required and where access for machines is available. Council asks for your patience as regular rain and saturated roadsides are delaying customary scheduling. Resources have been concentrated around high-profile areas frequented during the recent shire and regional events. Growth rates of irrigated lawns have also increased, maintenance is returning to spring scheduling.

Trees

Some tree maintenance has continued with a focus on under pruning older trees and formative pruning of younger street trees.

Watering of trees planted in the last two years has not commenced, due to regular rain. Watering requirements will be monitored as trees come back into leaf and the weather continues to warm up.

Lockhart Shires Street Tree Policy 2.44 states; 'Council is responsible for the planting and maintenance of street trees, including the selection of species, regular health, and safety checks, pruning, and removal and replanting requirements.

Issues presented to residents regarding street trees, including species selection, maintenance and/or removal should be made in writing and addressed to the General Manager. Such issues will be resolved based on financial and time restraints.

WEEDS

Property Inspections

Inspections were carried out on residential, rural and commercial properties, which were selected due a change in ownership.

The weeds most commonly found were Green cestrum (*Cestrum parqui*), Horehound (*Marrubium vulgare*), Lippia (*Phyla canescens*), Bridal creeper (*Asparagus asparagoides*), Cape broom (*Genista monspessulana*), Prickly pear (*Opuntia sp.*), Giant reed (*Arundo donax*), Privet (*Ligustrum sp.*), and St. John's wort (*Hypericum perforatum*) respectively.

Control Program

Priority has been given to the control of St. John's wort (*Hypericum perforatum*) on roadside reserves, as well as fire hazard reduction of roadside shoulders.

PESTS

Common White Snail Baiting Program

Snail baiting application occurred on Fairview Lane on 18 October.

New Street Bins are Coming

Within the main streets of Lockhart Shire's towns, waste is collected in single waste-stream bins. As part of Councils commitment to sustainability and environmental enhancement it is proposed to introduce new bin enclosures to include both general waste and recycling and a larger 120L bin.

As Council's waste contractor already collects recycling, these bins will be added to the existing service. The existing bins are small requiring a higher number of bins compared to the proposed bins. This requires more regular emptying, maintenance and cleaning.

The new bin enclosures can be coloured red for general waste and yellow for recycling with the side slats made from recycled materials. It is planned to place bins near high traffic areas and adequately spaced through the main street.

The new bins and enclosures will be installed in the main street of Lockhart in the coming weeks following which, the replacement programme will be rolled out in the other towns and villages next financial year.

Annual Permits for non-desexed cats and dangerous/restricted dogs

From 17 November, changes have come into effect for the Companion Animals Register (CAR) and online Pet Registry to clarify the renewal process for annual permits for non-desexed cats and restricted and dangerous dogs.

Owners are only required to obtain an annual permit for a current 12-month term. When it comes time to renew an annual permit, if the owner failed to obtain one for the preceding 12-month period, they will not be charged the prior permit fee, only for the current permit.

The NSW Government introduced annual permits for non-desexed cats and restricted and dangerous dogs in July 2020 as part of its commitment to promoting responsible pet ownership and improving animal welfare standards across New South Wales.

Improving early age desexing rates also eases the burden on pounds and shelters and reduce euthanasia rates by reducing accidental litters as well as helping to address concerns about feral, stray and roaming cats and their effect on wildlife.

Owners of dogs of a restricted breed or formally declared to be dangerous are also required to pay an annual permit in addition to their one-off lifetime pet registration fee. Having a current annual permit is also a control requirement for these animals.

The rules for how annual permits are applied remain unchanged.

How can pet owners avoid paying for an annual permit?

Pet owners can avoid the annual permit requirement by:

- desexing their cat by four months of age
- desexing their cat at any time to avoid having to renew their annual permit
- request an exemption from their vet due to health risks.
 - Cats that temporarily cannot be desexed, must be desexed by the age specified by the vet.
 - o Owners whose cat cannot be desexed at any time of their life are exempt from paying an annual permit.
 - o A certificate from a vet is required to qualify for these exemptions
 - o not owning a restricted dog
 - o managing their dog's behaviour to ensure that it's not declared dangerous or seek a review of a dangerous dog declaration.
 - o cat breeders can join a recognised cat breeding body.

On Friday, Year 5 had their first photography workshop with f.Stop Photography. We learnt that "photograph" means "light drawing" and "camera obscura" means "dark room". Patrick explained that because the front part of our eye is curved, it bends the light, creating an upside-down image on the retina. Our brain flips the image so that we see things the right way up. Get Ready for Mosquito Season

Warmer weather and this year's higher-than-average rain make the perfect conditions for a big mosquito season. While mosquitoes are well known for their annoying buzz and itchy bites, many people don't know that in NSW they can also spread viruses such as Japanese encephalitis virus, Murray Valley encephalitis and Ross River virus to humans. While serious illness and hospitalisation from these viruses is rare, the more mosquitoes, the greater the risk. With summer on our doorstep, it's a good time to take the steps to prevent bites.

Here are five simple ways to prevent mosquito bites:

- 1. **Cover up while outside.** Wear light, loose-fitting long-sleeved shirts, long pants and covered footwear with socks.
- 2. **Wear and reapply repellent.** Repellent containing DEET, picaridin or oil of lemon eucalyptus should be used on any areas of exposed skin and reapplied regularly. Apply sunscreen first, followed by repellent, so you can stay safe from the sun and mosquito bites.
- 3. **Keep mosquitoes out.** Close doors and windows when indoors or install fly screens where possible to keep mosquitoes out.
- 4. Stop mosquitoes breeding. Mosquitoes breed in stagnant water. Remove items around your home that might collect water such as old tyres, children's toys and empty pots to lower the chance of mosquitoes breeding. Think about improving drainage around your home to ensure water doesn't become stagnant.
- 5. Ask your GP about the Japanese encephalitis virus vaccination. Japanese encephalitis virus (JEV) was detected for the first time in NSW earlier this year. In some cases, JEV can cause a rare but serious illness called Japanese encephalitis. If you live in some areas of NSW, you're eligible for a free JEV vaccine talk to your GP.

Following these simple steps will help to protect you and the community from mosquito bites and illnesses, so you can relax and enjoy the warmer weather ahead.

NSW Planning Portal

Lockhart Shire Council uses electronic lodgement of Development Applications (DA), Construction Certificates (CC), Complying Development Applications (CDC) & Section 68 through the <u>NSW Planning Portal</u>. Applicants will need to establish their own account and then lodge their DA's, CC's and CDC's. For further information or for assistance please contact our Planning & Building team.

This is the process that Council recommends you follow:

 Contact our Planning Team on 02 6920 5305 to discuss your application or to arrange a pre lodgement meeting if required.

Visit the <u>NSW Planning Portal</u> to <u>Register</u> for a NSW Planning Portal account to start your application. This will enable you to access your dashboard, view, manage, track and progress applications, pay state agency fees and submit documents. You will also receive email notifications at key stages of the application process.

<u>Log in</u> to complete the online application form.

- For DA's and CC's you will need to submit a State of Environmental Effects, owner's consent, cost estimate report as well as all supporting plans and documents.
- For CDC's you will need to submit a certificate of title, site plan, design plans, structural plans and building specifications.
- Once we receive your application, Council will do a preliminary assessment and contact you to arrange payment of fees or request additional information.
- Once Council is satisfied with the information provided and fees are paid, your application can be lodged.

Council encourages all applicants to arrange a pre lodgement meeting with the Planning & Building team to ensure all required paperwork is ready before lodgement.

COMMON EVENING PRIMROSE

Oenothera stricta subsp. stricta

Other Common Names:

Chilean evening primrose, evening primrose, fragrant evening primrose, sand primrose, scented evening primrose, sweet scented evening primrose

Description: Native to Chile and Argentina. Annual or



biennial herb to 1 m high. Herbicides may provide effective control of younger plants, yet older plants are considered tolerant of glyphosate.

Stems: Hairy stem. Simple or branched with curved lateral stems.

Leaves: Rosette and alternating leaves, 3 - 20 cm long, 3 - 10 mm wide, are oblong to lance-shaped with widely spaced serrations. Margins toothed, tips pointed. Conspicuous midrib.

Flowers: About 3 – 6 cm across. Fragrant flowers. Flowers single, yellow fading through yellowish pink and orange to red, with 4 petals, each 15 – 40 mm long. Flowers all year but mostly August to January.

Capsules: 3 – 4 cm long, cylindrical, sparsely-hairy and broadest in the upper part. Priority weed: Common evening primrose is NOT considered a priority weed in the Lockhart Shire. It is regarded as an environmental weed. Recently it has been found prolific on roadside shoulders where fire hazard reduction operations have occurred
