

Brookong Creek Masterplan Consultation

Lockhart Shire Council has partnered with Habitat Planning and Yonder Landscapes to scope and design a Masterplan for a section of the Brookong Creek in Lockhart. (See map below)



It is envisaged the Masterplan will guide the passive development the public areas of this section of Brookong Creek for the next ten years. It will provide a clear vision and recommendations for the future planning of the area to ensure its ongoing connection with Lockhart and relevance to both the community and visitors. It will thus enable residents and visitors to access a range of passive (Continued on page 6)

Mayoral Report

Hello and welcome to my July report on Council activities. How good was it to have a few days of sunshine, hopefully the wet weather may be receding, and we can enjoy the warmth of the sun for a while.

On Sunday July 9 my wife Marie and I along with the GM and his wife Leanne were guests of the Lockhart Lions Club for their annual changeover dinner. Lions do a great job in the community especially with recycling and we wish President Bill Hamson and his committee all the best for the ensuing 12 months. On July 10, I attended a meeting of the Lockhart Local Health Advisory Committee chaired by Cr Fran Day OAM and met with Jill Ludford and staff from the Murrumbidgee Local Health District (MLHD) for an update on health issues. Speaking of which Dr Joe McGirr addressed the recent meeting of REROC to



outline the proposed Health and Knowledge precinct for MLHD. The aim of the project is to bring together health partners, the education industry and local communities to design innovative and practical ways to provide rural people with exceptional health care.

Council is also commencing community consultation on the Brookong Creek Masterplan. Council has engaged Habitat Planning to prepare the plan so please check Council's website or social media for updates.

At our recent workshop Council identified priorities for funding under the Local Roads and Community Infrastructure grants program. Several items were submitted along with items leftover from previous programs. A significant amount of funds will be expended on 3 road projects including extending the sealing of Vincent's Road and improving the intersections at Davidson Hill and Figtree Road. Other projects identified as priorities include The Lockhart Gym, a new pavilion at The Rock Showground to improve the amenity of the Golf Club, Show Society and Observatory as well as a new shed at the Lockhart Golf Club and upgrade to the toilets at the Pleasant Hills recreation ground.

Council also agreed to assist the Yerong Creek Recreation Ground Committee with the purchase of a mower for the turf wicket and also repairs to its existing mower. Funds were also provided for Christmas decorations at The Rock, Lockhart and Yerong Creek.

Council has also received a draft set of recommendations from IPART in relation to rate pegging. The recommendation to abolish the Local Government Cost Index and replace it with something that actually reflects council costs will be welcomed. We hope the Government accepts the recommendations. The issue of ownership of RFS assets is ongoing with the Audit Office pushing the Office of Local Government to enforce Councils to include these assets in their financial statements. Council along with the Local Government Association continue to oppose this.

The Rock- Yerong Creek FNC will be staging a day in support of mental health against East Wagga – Kooringal on August 12. Proceeds will go to the Black Dog Institute so if you can support it, please do.

On a sadder note, Council extends its condolences to Rodger and Alison Schirmer on the recent passing of Alison's mum Nell Lynn.

ENGINEERING AND ENVIRONMENTAL SERVICES REPORT

Works

Storm Event: Emergency works for the September 2022 storm event are continuing on rural and unsealed roads. Working with Damage Control Project Management (DCPM) regarding funding for weather affected roads.

Sections of unsealed roads which have been identified as damaged as a result of rain events are under way. Marking out, repairs and gathering completion evidence will be time consuming but must be completed correctly to satisfy TNSW.

Mittagong Yerong Creek Road: Clearing works has commenced with the removal of several trees. All culverts delivered. Project extended out to 2024. Work to commence September/ October 2023.

The Rock Mangoplah Road: Completed.

Henty Pleasant Hills Road: Completed.

Unsealed Roads: Unsealed Road Maintenance of Shire gravel roads has been conducted on Brian Westblades Lane, Hollies Road, Finlayson Lane, Tinamba Lane, French Park Bullenbong Road, Spanish Ave and Fargunyah Lane.

Maintenance Crews: Both the bitumen crews have been kept busy with an increase of pavement failures due to the weather, routine maintenance has continued on our Local and Regional Roads. Maintenance crews have been attending to the back log of customer enquiries, and the extension of culverts on The Rock Mangoplah Rd.

Parks & Gardens

Avenue of Honour Extension, The Rock: The hard landscaping, including granite surfaces,

steel garden bed edging, drip irrigation and dry creek bed, are near completion. Mulching has also commenced. Planting and installation of timber walk bridge will follow.

Esplanade Upgrade, Pleasant Hills: Construction of the granite footpath will commence when weather conditions allow. Quotes have been received for furniture, including benches, rubbish bins, picnic table and shelter. Design and quotes for the bird hide are being considered.

Stanley Galvin Park, Yerong Creek - New Footpaths: Quotes have been sort for the construction of the new paths.

109 Green St, Lockhart – Landscaping: Quotes for supplies have been sorted and ordered.

Weed Control: Weed control by mechanical and chemical methods is being conducted within urban areas as resources and conditions allow. Pesticides commonly used are Glyphosate and Dicamba. Signage will be placed at property entrance when spraying is in progress.

Trees

Annual under-pruning of Council's street trees and pruning of limbs protruding into urban lanes will be conducted throughout cooler months.

Lockhart Shires Street Tree Policy 2.44 states; 'Council is responsible for the planting and maintenance of street trees, including the selection of species, regular health, and safety checks, pruning, and removal and replanting requirements.

Resident concerns regarding street trees, including species selection, maintenance and/ or removal should be made in writing and addressed to the General Manager. Such

issues will be resolved based on risk and Silverleaf available budget and resources. elaeagnifo

Biosecurity

Property Inspections

Inspections were carried out on residential, rural and commercial properties, as well as Travelling Stock Routes and Crown Land.

The most commonly found weeds were Horehound (*Marrubium vulgare*), Bridal creeper (*Asparagus asparagoides*), African boxthorn (*Lycium ferocissimum*), St. John's wort (*Hypericum perforatum*), Privet (*Ligustrum* sp.),

Silverleaf nightshade (Solanum elaeagnifolium), African lovegrass (Eragrostis curvula), Green cestrum (Cestrum parqui), Sweet briar (Rosa rubiginosa), Scotch thistle (Onopordum acanthium), Sweet briar (Rosa rubiginosa), and Foxtail fern (Asparagus densiflorus) respectively.

Control Program

Priority has been given to the control of Feathertop Rhodes grass (*Chloris virgata*) and Horehound (*Marrubium vulgare*) on roadside reserves and council managed land.

The program will be delivered across five workshops with mentoring support available between workshops. Each session is interactive and includes a brief presentation (including a buyer presentation) followed by targeted support - both one-on-one and small groups.

recreational activities, enriching lifestyles while enhancing the visitor experience at the same time.

Council has received some funding to implement an initial stage of the masterplan. Implementation of subsequent stages of the Masterplan will be subject to Council securing additional funding however having a Masterplan in place assists in a planned and co-ordinated approach to any development as funding opportunities become available.

The objectives of the Masterplan are to:

- a) Provide the blueprint for nature-based visitor experiences that caters for a range of users.
- b) Protect and include Indigenous heritage values along Brookong Creek
- c) Protect the values of the area and ensure the ongoing conservation of the endangered species and ecological communities.
- d) Increase the health, wellbeing, and the liveability of residents in Lockhart.
- e) Attract people to the area to provide economic benefit.

It should be noted that the proposal to develop a Masterplan is not in any way connected to the Voluntary Purchase Scheme for flood affected properties for which some properties in Urana Street may be eligible.

The purpose of the Masterplan is to capitalise on the passive recreation opportunities that a natural asset like Brookong Creek offers due to its location in the town.

Connectivity

Council has worked with Telstra to develop Australia's First Action Plan for a Local Government Area to improve connectivity and services.

Connectivity Improvements to date and into the future with Telstra and NBNCo. include

- Four Free Wi-Fi points across the Shire including The Rock Hall and Museum, Lockhart Memorial Hall, Pleasant Hills Community Hall, and Milbrulong Recreation Ground.
- Small Base Station to be installed at Yerong Creek
- Upgrades to additional network capacity to the 4G/5G technology at The Rock Silos infrastructure
- Two 5G fixed wireless broadband towers to be installed at Yerong Creek and Pleasant Hills. Other Towers close by include Henty and Urana which may also overflow into Lockhart Shire.

Economic Development News

EV Charges

Lockhart Shire Council has turned on eight electric car chargers, with six charges available to the public in the following locations.

- Lockhart Caravan Park (2)
- Behind 109 Green Street, Lockhart (access down laneway) (2)
- The Rock Recreation Ground (2)

These chargers can be operated by downloading the Exploren App on your phone or tablet.

These EV chargers were made possible with matched Co -Funding from the NSW Government Office of Energy and Climate Change with over \$17,000 provided to Council.

Location of the chargers had to meet strict criteria including off street parking, accessibility, and proximity to suitable powers sources.

The other two chargers (private) have been installed at the Lockhart Shire Council Offices to help charge Council's new electric cars for which it was successful in obtaining funding from the NSW Government's EV Fleet Incentive Program with \$7,900 going towards these and the renewal of Council's fleet upgrades.

Council's Director of Engineering and the Environmental Services, Dr Austin Morris, says this is an opportunity for Lockhart Shire, a small rural based Council in NSW to lead the way in reducing our emissions and at the same time, have the potential to attract environmentally friendly visitors travelling to Lockhart Shire and see what we have to offer.

FOGO – Caddy Liner Bags

As part of the introduction of the Food Organics Garden Organics (FOGO) to Lockhart Shire Council's waste collection service in 2020 Council free caddy liner bags were available to residents during the three year transition period. This roll out was funded by a grant from the NSW Government.

Moving forward, to encourage the use of the FOGO service, and in line with our sustainability goals, Council will continue to provide, free of charge, **two** rolls of caddy liner bags per year to residents upon request from April 2023. A record of the bags distributed will be kept to assist in monitoring the supply.

NSW Planning Portal

Lockhart Shire Council uses electronic lodgement of Development Applications (DA), Construction Certificates (CC), Complying Development Applications (CDC) & Section 68 through the <u>NSW</u> <u>Planning Portal.</u> Applicants will need to establish their own account and then lodge their DA's, CC's and CDC's. For further information or for assistance please contact our Planning & Building team.

This is the process that Council recommends you follow:

• Contact our Planning Team on 02 6920 5305 to discuss your application or to arrange a pre lodgement meeting if required.

Visit the <u>NSW Planning Portal</u> to <u>Register</u> for a NSW Planning Portal account to start your application. This will enable you to access your dashboard, view, manage, track and progress applications, pay state agency fees and submit documents. You will also receive email notifications at key stages of the application process.

Log in to complete the online application form.

- For DA's and CC's you will need to submit a State of Environmental Effects, owner's consent, cost estimate report as well as all supporting plans and documents.
- For CDC's you will need to submit a certificate of title, site plan, design plans, structural plans and building specifications.
- Once we receive your application, Council will do a preliminary assessment and contact you to arrange payment of fees or request additional information.
- Once Council is satisfied with the information provided and fees are paid, your application can be lodged.

Council encourages all applicants to arrange a pre lodgement meeting with the Planning & Building team to ensure all required paperwork is ready before lodgement.

Placing nappies in FOGO is a NO, NO

Some residents are still placing nappies and adult continence pads in BioBags and then in the Green Lidded Bin. This is a NO NO. Please place all nappies and continence pads in the Red Lidded General Waste Bin.

Nappy management in general waste bins

Nappies must go in the general waste (red lidded) bin. Nearly all bins smell a bit and particularly bins containing nappies. Here are some ways to minimise odours:

- tip nappy contents into the toilet before you throw the nappy into the bin
- wrap nappy tightly into itself and use the tabs to secure
- tie nappy in a compostable bag, removing air
- store your rubbish bin in the shade
- make sure the lid can close properly
- add odour neutralisers such as bi-carb soda to your bin.



What will be accepted;

- ☑ Clean drums, rinsed to the Agsafe standard
- Drums larger than 1 litre and up to 205 litre;
- Drums that have been used for agricultural and livestock production, pest and weed control:
- Drums that are not hazardous substances, used in agricultural production
 - All pesticides
 - ☑ Seed dressings
 - ☑ Drenches
 - ☑ Wetters/Stickers/Adjuvants
 - M Foam markers

What will not be accepted

- Drums with any residue (including lid and neck)
- Drums containing more than 100mL of rinsate

Drums that packaged the following;

- Liquid chlorine
- K Household disinfectants
- Petroleum products

- 1. Empty the contents of the container into the spray tank and allow the container to drain for an extra 30 seconds after the flow reduces to drops.
- 2. Fill the container with clean water to about 20% of its capacity and replace the cap securely.
- 3. Shake, rotate, roll or invert the container vigorously for at least 30 seconds, so that the rinse water reaches all inside surfaces.
- 4. Pour the rinsate (the rinsing water from step 3) into the sprav tank. Let it drain for an extra 30 seconds after the flow reduces to drops.
- 5. Repeat until the container has been rinsed three times
- Containers should have caps removed for easy access by inspectors.
- No container will be accepted if they are crushed because it makes them difficult to inspect.
- Steel drums must be punctured.
- Please do not puncture plastics as some are reused
- □ All persons delivering drums to the drumMUSTER must sign a Container Cleanliness Declaration, noting the exact number of drums for delivery to drumMUSTER.

To ensure the **DrumMUSTER** operates efficiently and without time delay, drums will only be accepted at the facility by appointment. You may book a time to dispose of your properly cleaned chemical containers by calling Lockhart Shire Council on 02 6920 5305. Please count your drums and let Council know how many you have so the time allocated to you will be sufficient for inspecting.

PARTHENIUM WEED



Parthenium hysterophorus

Other Common Names: Bitter weed, Carrot grass, Congress grass, False camomile, False ragweed, Gajar Ghans, Ragweed, Ragweed parthenium, Santa Maria, Santa Maria feverfew, White top, White head.

Description: Has been found in small patches in the Riverina. Weed of National Significance. One of the worst weeds in Australia due to its invasiveness, potential for spread, and economic and environmental impacts. It has a large and persistent soil seedbank, fast germination rate, can undergo seed dormancy, and is allelopathic, releasing chemicals into the soil to deter other plants from germinating near it. Is a host for crop viruses.

Native to Mexico, Central America, South America, and the Caribbean. An annual herb with a deep tap root and an erect stem that becomes woody with age. As it matures, the plant develops many branches in its top half, reaching up to two metres in height.

Prolific seed producer and aggressive competitor, which colonises bare, open ground on roadside, pastures and disturbed areas. The herb can mature and produce seed in a short period of time. Particularly if stressed, it can germinate and set seed in 4 weeks.

Leaves: Pale green. Lower leaves are 5 – 20 cm long with deep divisions. Upper leaves are less divided and smaller. Covered in soft, fine hairs. Alternate on stem. Most leaves die after the plant has flowered.

Stems: Grooved or ribbed, making stems look striped. Woody with age. Highly branched in upper half during flowering.

Flowers: Creamy-white. 4 - 6 mm in diameter. At the tips of stems. Made up of clusters of tiny florets in the centre. Star-like with 5 distinct 'points' – each point has a tiny petal. Can flower all year round. Each flower produces 4 to 5 seeds.

Seed: Dark brown to black. 2mm across. Flattened. Triangular with two thin, white, spoon-shaped appendages. Produces up to 25 000 seed in a growing season. Seed dormancy. Can germinate at any time during the year, but more common between October and January.

Toxicity: Toxic to cattle, and meat or milk from livestock that eat the weed can be tainted. Unpalatable to livestock unless no other feed is available. Causes kidney damage in cattle, sheep and goats. Young cattle most susceptible to dying from parthenium poisoning. Animals may also have allergic reactions including dermatitis. Parthenium weed can cause respiratory problems and severe dermatitis to humans, particularly if exposed to pollen.

For **All of NSW: General Biosecurity Duty:** All plants are regulated with a general biosecurity duty to prevent, eliminate or minimise any biosecurity risk they may pose. Any person who deals with any plant, who knows (or ought to know) of any biosecurity risk, has a duty to ensure the risk is prevented, eliminated or minimised, so far as is reasonably practicable.

For **All of NSW: Prohibited Matter:** A person who deals with a prohibited matter or a carrier of prohibited matter is guilty of an offence. A person who becomes aware of or suspects the presence of prohibited matter must immediately notify the Department of Primary Industries. **NSW DPI Biosecurity Helpline: 1800 680 244**.

If you have items for Council to pick up, you should leave them on the kerbside **clear of obstacles**, no later than a day prior to the pickup. Staff will remove the items from the kerb on the allocated day. If you are not prepared, you will miss out.
