Mayoral Report

Whilst it is a relief from the cold the sudden onset of heat will be a concern for farmers and fire authorities as it won't take long for the vegetation to dry out. Let's hope we will receive the necessary rain to finish the crops.

On a brighter note, congratulations to The Rock Yerong Creek FNC on winning a double premiership in the Farrer League. This caps off a very successful season for the Club. Congratulations to players and administrators, your hard work has paid off. Also a special mention to a local farmer Mick Mazzocchi who coached Turvey Park to their first senior premiership in 21 years. Osborne will be well represented in both Football and Netball in the Hume League finals and Lockhart has teams playing as well. We wish them every success.

Adding to the good news our new Manager Planning and Environment, Jesse Rapley and his wife Michaela have welcomed a new baby girl so we extend our congratulations and best wishes. At our Council meeting on 18 September I had the honour of being re-elected Mayor for a further 12 months. I am extremely grateful to my fellow councillors for the faith and trust they have shown in me. Also, we have a new Deputy Mayor, Peter Sharp. Peter replaces Andrew Rockliff, who decided not to stand. I welcome Peter's enthusiasm whilst also recognising the tremendous support that Andrew gave me over the last two years.

During the last month we hosted a number of important meetings with NBN, Transgrid and Secure Energy along with a visit from the Deputy Secretary of the Office of Local Government. NBN outlined proposed improvements to its service which is good news for Yerong Creek and Pleasant Hills. Secure Energy provided an update on the new power lines and will also give Council a tour of the new accommodation site on County Boundary Road. The issue of the Red Fleet (RFS) is still high on the Auditor General's list of priorities.

At the time of writing the new State Government has released its first budget and as expected the claw back of expenditure during Covid has begun. Whilst the details are sketchy, it would appear that Councils, will receive, additional, funding, for, read, repairs, and

Councils will receive additional funding for road repairs and mprovements.

With the warmer weather comes a number of social and sporting events, starting with the Lockhart Show on 24 September, followed by the Lockhart Picnic races on the 29 September Then we have the Spirit of the Land on 7 and 8 October followed by The Rock Show on 21 October, a great opportunity to get out and support these community events.

Also don't forget on October 14 is the referendum on the Voice to Parliament. Please ensure you objectively review the issues and vote accordingly. Remember voting is compulsory.

Council Snippets 18 September 2023

ENGINEERING AND ENVIRONMENTAL SERVICES REPORT

Works

Rural Sealed Roads.

The Regional and Local Roads Repair Program (RLRRP) has commenced. Heavy patching is well under way. The Rock-Lockhart Road is now complete with 21 patches, or 10,560 square metres stabilised and primer sealed, a second seal will be applied when the weather warms up.

Unsealed Roads

Unsealed Road Maintenance of Shire gravel roads has been conducted on:

Edgehill School Lane, McCreadies Lane, Ellerslie Lane, Janetskes Lane, Tutty's Lane, Illetts Lane, Poverty Lane, Geddes Lane, Willis Lane, Jim Willis North Rd, McRories Lane, Shaws Lane, Benders Lane and Wetmores Lane.

Grading of Henty-Pleasant Hills Rd has commenced.

Maintenance Crews:

Bitumen crew have been kept busy with an increase of pavement failures due to the weather, routine maintenance has continued on our Local and Regional Roads.

Maintenance crews have repaired the culverts on The Rock-Lockhart Rd in conjunction with the heavy patching back filled and removed spoils on O'Connell Street footpath and continue attending to the back log of customer enquiries.

Parks & Gardens

Avenue of Honour Extension, The Rock

The hard landscaping, including granite surfaces, steel garden bed edging, drip irrigation, walk bridge and dry creek bed have been completed. Planting of the garden beds will be done by Council staff as resources are available.

A concreter will be employed to install pram ramps to allow wheeled access to the new gardens and to change the existing driveway on the opposite side of Urana Stret into pedestrian access only.

Esplanade Upgrade, Pleasant Hills

Construction of the granite footpath has been completed. Quotes have been received for furniture, including benches, rubbish bins, picnic table and shelter. Design and quotes for the bird hide have been considered and agreed upon.

Stan Galvin Park, Yerong Creek - New Footpaths

Quotes have been received for the construction of the new paths.

109 Green St, Lockhart - Landscaping

Alterations to the landscape plan have received approval. Quotes for supplies have been sort and ordered. Installation will commence upon arrival of materials.

Weed Control

Weed control by mechanical and chemical methods is being conducted within urban areas as resources and conditions allow. Pesticides commonly used are Glyphosate and Dicamba. Signage will be placed at property entrance when spraying is in progress.

Council Snippets 18 September 2023

Trees

Under-pruning of Council's street trees and pruning of limbs protruding into urban lanes is being conducted as resourcing allows.

Lockhart Shires Street Tree Policy 2.44 states; 'Council is responsible for the planting and maintenance of street trees, including the selection of species, regular health, and safety checks, pruning, and removal and replanting requirements.

Resident concerns regarding street trees, including species selection, maintenance and/or removal should be made in writing and addressed to the General Manager. Such issues will be resolved based on risk and available budget and resources.

Biosecurity

Property Inspections

Inspections were carried out on residential and industrial properties, which were selected due to a change in ownership.

The most commonly found weeds were Lippia (*Phyla canescens*), Privet (*Ligustrum* sp.), Bridal creeper (*Asparagus asparagoides*), Horehound (*Marrubium vulgare*), and Wild radish (*Raphanus raphanistrum*) respectively.

Control Program

Priority has been given to the control of African boxthorn (*Lycium ferocissimum*), Coolatai grass (*Hyparrhenia hirta*), Horehound (*Marrubium vulgare*) and Wild radish (*Raphanus raphanistrum*) on roadside reserves and council managed land.

22nd NSW Weeds Conference

Council's Environmental Officer attended the 22nd NSW Weeds Conference in Dubbo. Notable interesting topics included:

Feathertop Rhodes grass (*Chloris virgata*), which was originally a winter dormant species, has evolved to both germinate and set seed in winter.

A biological control for Skeleton weed (*Chondrilla juncea*) has been released, which would explain why it is now predominately absent from the roadside reserve.

A biological control for African boxthorn (*Lycium ferocissimum*) is being developed, with extensive testing being carried out to ensure that the biological control does not impact the Australian boxthorn (*Lycium australe*).

A biological control for African lovegrass (*Eragrostis curvula*) has been released in New Zealand. Investigations for its application in Australia is being considered, although this biological control is expected to impact on Australia's native grasses.

Sowthistle (Sonchus sp.) has developed resistance to some herbicides.

Sticky nightshade (Solanum sisymbriifolium) is becoming a significant weed in Central NSW. Local residents are encouraged to report any sightings.

Pests

Common White Snail Baiting Program

Snail baiting application occurred on Fairview Lane on 1 August.

Greens Gunyah Museum Report

The last 12 months have certainly flown by quickly. It has been a year of consolidation with visitor numbers slowly rising from Covid years and our new set up with Management Committee meetings working well.

We started the year with the 50th Anniversary lunch and a reasonably successful Spirit of the Land Festival with numbers around the 500 for the weekend.

A number of projects have been completed this year. These include:

- New Fence on Green Street.
- Gravel yard (this is ongoing because of the winter weather)
- Repositioning of old machinery into attractive displays in the yard
- The ongoing clean-up of the yard with some excess steel going.
- Redesign of the media room into storage, which has included installation of six new shelving units
- And the replacement of sheeting on back wall in the machinery shed
- We also think we have solved the problem of birds in the billabong area

Our purchases during the year included:

- Shelving
- Boxing for garments
- Blinds for kitchen
- Signage on back fence
- Laptop
- And we received a grant for new display unit for trophies.

The redesign and clean up of our back yard and the management and conservation of our collections have been our main focus this year.

The reorganisation of the new storage rooms and the slow task of accessioning items has kept the Accessioning team busy with regular working bees with Margot. Thankyou to our team of Mandy Strong, Dorothy Creek, Liz Lane and Tracy Taylor for their work so far. We have a huge job to complete the digitizing of the collection but we have made a start on the process.

Our backyard workers of John Trevaskis, Jack Teasdale, Paul Creek, Graham Wright and Max Day have been working steadily towards the redevelopment of the machinery shed and yard. The yard is starting to take shape and is certainly more attractive to the eye.

Our roster volunteers are to be thanked for their continued support and commitment. We are fortunate to be able to open 7 days, 10-2pm. This has enabled us to see many

visitors – we may have missed a few but we don't seem to get too many calls to open up out of those hours.

I would like to particularly thank Mandy Strong who has really stepped up as Vice President this year. She and I attended an interesting workshop on Significance recently at Walla Walla. She also has a lot of enthusiasm and ideas which have certainly helped the Management Committee and Accession team.

To John Alexander and Vicki Baudry who stepped up during the year to take on the roles of financial management. Thankyou! The financial management of the museum continues to be detailed and time consuming. We have been fortunate to have John and Vicki able to step into the position.

I would like at this point to specially thank David Read for the work he has done for the museum since 2007. Circumstance has taken him away from Lockhart but I'm sure he will be back in the future.

To Paul Creek and the Management Committee, thankyou. Once again you all stepped up and accepted the idea of regular Management meetings with Margot. We have achieved a great deal this year and our processes and work plans are working well. We have a lot of projects and work in the pipeline.

This year, we accepted the donation of Suzanne Sly's Golden Gown Collection and garments from Colleen Smith's Collection. The Accession group are in the process of cataloguing and storing these garments and accessories. We will be applying for Grants to enable us to purchase display units and mannequins for their future exhibition. This is very exciting work and we are honoured to work with such beautiful garments. Thankyou Suzanne and Colleen for your donations.

Our recent representation to Council concerning our parking difficulties resulted in a quick response. This is an example of cooperation between our committee and the Council staff and Councillors. Thankyou for your continued support and interest in our museum. I thank Matt Holt and Margot Jolly particularly for their hard work, ideas and expertise.

At the Spirit of the Land this year, we will be offering Devonshire Teas in our Showroom. Any members of the Historical Society or community members who would like to offer help on the day would be very much appreciated. This initiative will raise funds for the continued maintenance and upgrading of the museum, we are excited to be utilizing our wonderful kitchen facilities which were recently installed thanks to the generosity of the late Tim Fischer. Construction Notification

SecureEnergy and Project EnergyConnect

SecureEnergy led by Elecnor Australia, has been contracted by Transgrid to deliver part of Project EnergyConnect with the construction of 700km of new power lines from the SA border to the regional energy hub of Wagga Wagga . The project will connect the electrical grids of New South Wales, South Australia, and Victoria, improving reliability of our nation's energy supply.

As part of the EnergyConnect project, SecureEnergy has commenced construction activities on the Eastern section of the project including construction of access points, access tracks and clearing and grubbing activities, on multiple sites from Wagga Wagga to Buronga.

In order to carry out this work safely and minimise impacts to the community, SecureEnergy are planning to work outside approved construction hours from mid-September 2023 until mid-December 2023. The timing and type of work may change due to weather or other unforeseen circumstances.

New laws for local food businesses

Recent changes to the Food Standards Code have introduced new requirements for all businesses that prepare and serve food in NSW.

From 8 December 2023, businesses that handle unpackaged food requiring temperature control, and serve it ready-to-eat, must have a qualified Food Safety Supervisor and ensure all food handlers are trained in food safety and hygiene. Higher-risk enterprises must also be able to demonstrate their safe food handling practices.

While some businesses already require a Food Safety Supervisor in NSW, the requirement is new for school canteens, childcare services, charities and not-for-profits, correctional centres, delis and supermarkets, and some coffee vendors.

The NSW Food Authority has developed a range of resources to help businesses prepare for the new Standard, including free online food handler training. Businesses can also do a quick quiz to check if the requirements apply.

Placing nappies and other contaminates in FOGO is a NO, NO

Some residents are still placing nappies and adult continence pads in BioBags and then in the Green Lidded Bin. This is a NO NO.

Please place all nappies and continence pads and other contaminates in the Red Lidded General Waste Bin.

Nappy management in general waste bins

Nappies must go in the general waste (red lidded) bin. Nearly all bins smell a bit and particularly bins containing nappies. Here are some ways to minimise odours:

- tip nappy contents into the toilet before you throw the nappy into the bin
- wrap nappy tightly into itself and use the tabs to secure
- tie nappy in a compostable bag, removing air
- store your rubbish bin in the shade
- make sure the lid can close properly
- add odour neutralisers such as bi-carb soda to your bin.

NSW Planning Portal

Lockhart Shire Council uses electronic lodgement of Development Applications (DA), Construction Certificates (CC), Complying Development Applications (CDC) & Section 68 through the <u>NSW Planning</u> <u>Portal.</u> Applicants will need to establish their own account and then lodge their DA's, CC's and CDC's. For further information or for assistance please contact our Planning & Building team.

This is the process that Council recommends you follow:

 Contact our Planning Team on 02 6920 5305 to discuss your application or to arrange a pre lodgement meeting if required.

Visit the <u>NSW Planning Portal</u> to <u>Register</u> for a NSW Planning Portal account to start your application. This will enable you to access your dashboard, view, manage, track and progress applications, pay state agency fees and submit documents. You will also receive email notifications at key stages of the application process.

Log in to complete the online application form.

- For DA's and CC's you will need to submit a State of Environmental Effects, owner's consent, cost estimate report as well as all supporting plans and documents.
- For CDC's you will need to submit a certificate of title, site plan, design plans, structural plans and building specifications.
- Once we receive your application, Council will do a preliminary assessment and contact you to arrange payment of fees or request additional information.
- Once Council is satisfied with the information provided and fees are paid, your application can be lodged.

Council encourages all applicants to arrange a pre lodgement meeting with the Planning & Building team to ensure all required paperwork is ready before lodgement.



Gazania Weed Control

Gazania rigens is listed as an environmental weed in some parts of NSW and have been spreading in Lockhart shire's towns and along roadsides for many years. Their seed is dispersed via wind; they also appear to be spreading via storm water which has resulted in quite a large infestation along Brookong Creek within Lockhart township.

Any assistance from residents to control this weed would be very appreciated, including removing it from or not planting it in your garden or naturestrip. Please do not cultivate or share these plants with your friends. Gazania hybrids are very hardy and are still sold in nurseries; many have now been breed with sterile seed so they do not spread, please ask the nursery before purchasing them.

A study by Wine Australia of approximately 30 chemical and mechanical treatments found the best overall treatment appeared to be a combination of 4 litres/ha of Glyphosate 450 spiked with Hammer® 400 EC. All the other treatments that performed relatively well required 8 litres of Glyphosate 450 per hectare, even when adding various spikes and adjuvants.

SILVERLEAF NIGHTSHADE



Solanum elaeagnifolium

Other common names: White horse nettle, Tomato weed, White nightshade, Bull-nettle, Prairie-berry, Stansbos, Silver-Bitter-apple, Silver-leaf leaf nettle. Trompillo, Silver nightshade, and Silverleaved nightshade.

Description: A deep rooted summergrowing perennial plant from the tomato family Solanaceae, native of North and South America. It is an erect, perennial, bushy plant growing 30 to 100 cm high. Seedlings emerge at any time from late spring until autumn, depending on rainfall. Stems are erect, branched, densely covered in fine hairs and with numerous slender orange prickles.

Leaves: Silvery white underside due to dense cover of minute white hairs, alternate, 5-10cm long and 1-2cm wide. Leaf margins are often scalloped, and often with orange prickles on the veins.

Flowers: Usually purple to violet. occasionally white, 2.5-4cm wide, with five pointed petals, and five yellow antlers which are 7-9 mm long. Flowers from practicable. November to April.

Seed/Fruit: The fruit is a smooth globular berry about 6-12mm in diameter. Initially green with dark striations, changing to For further information please contact vellow and orange mottled and becoming Council's Environmental Officer on (02) wrinkled when ripe. Seed is spread by 6920 5305 or visit www.dpi.nsw.gov.au/ birds, water, and livestock, particularly agriculture/pests-weeds/weeds sheep.

Root: Deep, much branched, vertical and horizontal roots. bearing buds which produce new aerial growth each year.

Toxicity: Stock poisoning from alkaloids contained in the silverleaf nightshade has occurred, but this is uncommon. Only moderately palatable to stock although it is toxic to eaten. Ripe fruit are the most poisonous part of the plant. Symptoms include profuse diarrhoea and profound nervous depression. There can be significant weight loss and eventually death, possibly due to heart failure, after 7 to 14 days of sickness.

Control: Silverleaf nightshade is verv difficult to kill. Plants can spread by plant propagules, such as by root pieces, by seed or by suckering. It is best to try and isolated plants smaller treated and patches as they appear. Good ground cover and competitive pastures can be a key element in controlling the spread of the plant.

Silverleaf nightshade is also declared as a Weed of National Significance.

Silverleaf nightshade is considered a priority weed in the Lockhart Shire.

For All of NSW: General Biosecurity Duty: All plants are regulated with a general biosecurity duty to prevent, eliminate or minimise any biosecurity risk they may pose. Any person who deals with any plant, who knows (or ought to know) of any biosecurity risk, has a duty to ensure the risk is prevented, eliminated or minimised, so far as is reasonably
