## **Mayoral Report**

Hello again, well summer is almost upon us. The harvest is well underway with headers and trucks being kept busy. Speaking of which the number of trucks especially semis and B Doubles has increased significantly especially on back roads so it is important to be more vigilant when we are driving around. The weather has been kind and some good yields and quality grains have been reported which all goes well for our local communities.

This month I attended the Local Government Conference in Rosehill along with Crs Day and Sharp. This is where all the major issues confronting local government are discussed and motions put forward to better improve governance. At the conference I met with Andrew Cotterill the Regional NBN



Manager who advised of some significant improvements for NBN in the Shire. Along with new towers at Pleasant Hills and Yerong Creek, there will be enhancements to The Rock and a possible tower on Galore Hill which should significantly increase coverage, which is good news.

On a sadder note our General Manager Peter has submitted his resignation which is effective in July 2024. Peter and Leanne have indicated a desire to return to Albury and whilst our community will be the poorer we respect their decision. The process will now begin to select a new GM early in the new year so that a replacement can be in place prior to his departure.

Our Police and Community Consultation Group met this month at Pleasant Hills. Representatives from various towns attend and report on issues impacting their communities. Sgt Davies indicated that the command is at full strength and has been pretty quiet with no major incidents reported. I think this is a reflection of the great work our police do by being visible in and working closely with the community. Again if residents have any issues they should contact their local station or ring Crimestoppers.

An interesting outcome of Council's last meeting was the decision to trial a voucher system in place of the annual kerbside pickup. The issue was strongly debated and Council voted to initiate the trial. It will be interesting to see what residents think.

The first meeting of The Rock Flood Review Committee took place at The Rock where consultants WMA Water outlined the process going forward especially as it relates to engaging with the community such as information sessions, questionnaires and public exhibitions. The consultants will be keen to hear from anyone with videos, photos etc. There will be more information in the weeks ahead.

Also the first meeting to review concept plans for the new community centre at The Rock was held on 21 November. The plans and concept photos will be on display in various locations in The Rock including the Post Office, Club, Café and Foodworks. Please take this opportunity to review and forward any comments to Council by 15 December 2023.

As the school year draws to a close there will be many presentation nights and I wish all schools a successful end to the year. Also a big thanks to all teachers and support staff for the great job they do.

As this will be the last newsletter before Christmas I hope the holiday season gives everyone a chance to unwind and enjoy the company of family and friends.

#### LOCAL GOVERNMENT ELECTIONS

There is now less than 12 months before the next Local Government Elections which are scheduled for 14 September 2024.

The Lockhart Shire Council elections will be conducted by the NSW Electoral Commission (NSWEC) which has a dedicated website at <u>elections.nsw.gov.au</u> that will be continually updated with information regarding the 2024 elections. The NSWEC will also be providing a series of webinars with information about each upcoming webinar to be published on its website. Each webinar will be recorded and published on the website for viewing at any time.

Election updates will also be provided through the Council Newsletter. The key dates for the Council election are set out below.

#### INSTALLATION OF CCTV CAMERAS

Council has allocated grant funds received under Round 5 of the Stronger Country Communities Fund for the installation of CCTV cameras in the main street of Lockhart and The Rock as well as the main recreation grounds.

The CCTV system is aimed at the detection and conviction of offenders. Council recognises that the presence of CCTV can have a deterrent effect on crime and antisocial behaviour, whilst contributing to a greater sense of safety in the community. Accordingly it is intended that the images captured by the CCTV cameras once installed will be made available to assist NSW Police.

It is important that appropriate policies and procedures are in place for the management of the audio visual records having regard to the NSW Government Policy Statement and Guidelines for the Establishment and Implementation of CCTV in Public Places, the Privacy and Personal Information Protection Act 1998 and the Government Information (Public Access) Act 2009. With this in mind a draft CCTV policy has been developed and is currently on public exhibition.

#### ENGINEERING AND ENVIRONMENTAL SERVICES REPORT

As part of Council's on-going commitment to sustainability, a program of solar system installation has commenced on Council-owned buildings. The first site has been completed at The Rock swimming pool with the installation of a 15kW system which will significantly reduce Council's electricity bills associated with running pumps etc at the pool.

Council was successful in obtaining a NSW Government Get Active Grant for new footpaths in Lockhart. Three-quarters of the work in Hayes Street and O'Connell Street has been completed in accordance with the adopted footpath masterplan.

#### Works

#### Heavy Patching Program

<u>Regional Roads:</u> Work has been completed on Lockhart Collingullie Rd, The Rock Collingullie Rd, Urana Lockhart Rd - a total of 36,019 m<sup>2</sup>.

<u>Local Sealed Roads</u>: The Rock Lockhart Rd is now complete along with The Rock Mangoplah Rd, County Boundary Rd, Urana Boree Creek Rd, Yuluma Rd, Lockhart Boree Creek Rd - a total of 68,742 m<sup>2</sup>.

<u>Local Sealed Roads</u>: Shoulder grading on Henty Pleasant Hills Rd, and Urana Boree Creek Rd has been completed. Slashing roadside shoulders has been completed on Urana Boree Creek Rd and Yuluma Rd.

<u>Unsealed Roads:</u> Unsealed Road Maintenance of Shire gravel roads has been conducted on Seeligers Ln, Schirmers Ln, Curries Ln, Hogans Ln, Spurrells Rd, Wallendoon Access Rd, Bakes Ln, Clancys Ln, and Munyabla Boundary Rd.

#### Maintenance Crews

Bitumen crews have been kept busy with an increase of pavement failures due to the weather, routine maintenance has continued on our Local and Regional Roads.

Maintenance crews have repaired the culverts on Urana Boree Creek Rd. Assisting with the heavy patching, roadside slashing and sign installation, backfill and remove spoils on Hayes Street footpath and attending to the back log of customer enquiries.

#### Parks & Gardens

The swimming pools at The Rock and Lockhart opened on 31 October with no problems reported.

A slab has been laid adjacent to the entrance of Lockhart Pool ready for installation of the motorbike sculpture donated by Ms Marie van Steyn.

The landscaping of 109 Green Street continues, with paving set to commence soon.

Mowing, watering of street trees and other general maintenance continues across the Shire's open spaces.

#### Spring Fox Baiting Program

Spring fox baiting commenced on 10 October with bait distribution occurring on the Galore Hill Scenic Reserve and Kincaids Reserve.

#### Flood Data Release

The Bureau of Meteorology released flood data confirming that southeastern Australia had the highest spring rainfall on record in 2022 including over 200 sites that have been recording for at least 100 years. Rain fell on catchments where water storages and river levels were high and soils were already wet after two years of above average rainfall. The three major climate drivers influencing this weather were La Nina, a negative Indian Ocean Dipole and a positive Southern Annular Mode.

#### Integrated Water Cycle Management Strategy (IWCM)

In November 2018 and subsequent years, Council was successful in obtaining grant funding for a scoping study of Lockhart Sewerage Treatment Plant and an Integrated Water Cycle Management Strategy (IWCM). The IWCM is Council's 30-year strategy for the provision of appropriate, affordable, cost-effective and sustainable water services that meet the community needs and protects public health and the environment.

As part of the IWCM an Issues Paper was developed which identified issues with Councils sewerage schemes. Following the completion of the Issues Paper, Council engaged Public Works Advisory (PWA) to undertake studies that evaluated and assessed options to address the issues.

After considering the PWA studies and various options Council has endorsed a Draft IWCM Strategy for public exhibition. The Draft IWCM Strategy considers issues including replacing the existing Lockhart Sewerage Treatment Plant (trickling filter) with a new oxidation pond with effluent reuse; and the sewering of south Lockhart.

The Draft IWCM Strategy will shortly be placed on public exhibition at which time further information will be made available on Council's website at <u>www.lockhart.nsw.gov.au</u>.



#### Brookong Creek Draft Masterplan - Have your say

Lockhart Shire Council has partnered with Habitat Planning and Yonder Landscapes to design a Masterplan for a section of the Brookong Creek in Lockhart.

The purpose of the Masterplan is to:

- Facilitate community led design outcomes and develop a coherent vision to develop Brookong Creek over the next ten years.
- Form the basis for Council to sequence and prioritise the works within the Masterplan; and
- Consider future budgeting and funding options.

In March 2023 Council appointed the Tourism and Economic Development Steering Committee (TEDSC) to be the lead project team along with Council staff and Consultants.

So far, the group has consulted with stakeholder groups and community members throughout the development of the master plan, including.

Their input has been gathered via face-to-face meetings as well as an online survey which received 115 responses. The feedback has helped to iteratively guide the development of the Draft Masterplan.

In November, the TEDSC recommended to Council to place the Draft Masterplan on Public Exhibition in which Council has decided to do for 8 weeks from the 21 November 2023 to 15 January 2024.

#### New laws for local food businesses

Recent changes to the Food Standards Code have introduced new requirements for all businesses that prepare and serve food in NSW.

From 8 December 2023, businesses that handle unpackaged food requiring temperature control, and serve it ready-to-eat, must have a qualified Food Safety Supervisor and ensure all food handlers are trained in food safety and hygiene. Higher-risk enterprises must also be able to demonstrate their safe food handling practices.

While some businesses already require a Food Safety Supervisor in NSW, the requirement is new for school canteens, childcare services, charities and not-for-profits, correctional centres, delis and supermarkets, and some coffee vendors.

The NSW Food Authority has developed a range of resources to help businesses prepare for the new Standard, including free online food handler training. Businesses can also do a quick quiz to check if the requirements apply.

#### Placing nappies and other contaminates in FOGO is a NO, NO

Some residents are still placing nappies and adult continence pads in BioBags and then in the Green Lidded Bin. This is a NO NO.

Please place all nappies and continence pads and other contaminates in the Red Lidded General Waste Bin.

#### Nappy management in general waste bins

Nappies must go in the general waste (red lidded) bin. Nearly all bins smell a bit and particularly bins containing nappies. Here are some ways to minimise odours:

- tip nappy contents into the toilet before you throw the nappy into the bin
- wrap nappy tightly into itself and use the tabs to secure
- tie nappy in a compostable bag, removing air
- store your rubbish bin in the shade
- make sure the lid can close properly
- add odour neutralisers such as bi-carb soda to your bin.

#### FOGO – Caddy Liner Bags

As part of the introduction of the Food Organics Garden Organics (FOGO) to Lockhart Shire Council's waste collection service in 2020 Council free caddy liner bags were available to residents during the three year transition period. This roll out was funded by a grant from the NSW Government.

Moving forward, to encourage the use of the FOGO service, and in line with our sustainability goals, Council will continue to provide, free of charge, **two** rolls of caddy liner bags per year to residents upon request from April 2023. A record of the bags distributed will be kept to assist in monitoring the supply.

#### NSW Planning Portal

Lockhart Shire Council uses electronic lodgement of Development Applications (DA), Construction Certificates (CC), Complying Development Applications (CDC) & Section 68 through the <u>NSW Planning</u> <u>Portal</u>. Applicants will need to establish their own account and then lodge their DA's, CC's and CDC's. For further information or for assistance please contact our Planning & Building team.

This is the process that Council recommends you follow:

 Contact our Planning Team on 02 6920 5305 to discuss your application or to arrange a pre lodgement meeting if required.

Visit the <u>NSW Planning Portal</u> to <u>Register</u> for a NSW Planning Portal account to start your application. This will enable you to access your dashboard, view, manage, track and progress applications, pay state agency fees and submit documents. You will also receive email notifications at key stages of the application process.

Log in to complete the online application form.

- For DA's and CC's you will need to submit a State of Environmental Effects, owner's consent, cost estimate report as well as all supporting plans and documents.
- For CDC's you will need to submit a certificate of title, site plan, design plans, structural plans and building specifications.
- Once we receive your application, Council will do a preliminary assessment and contact you to arrange payment of fees or request additional information.
- Once Council is satisfied with the information provided and fees are paid, your application can be lodged.

Council encourages all applicants to arrange a pre lodgement meeting with the Planning & Building team to ensure all required paperwork is ready before lodgement.

#### Green's Gunyah Museum Report

Volunteering is the life blood of the community and the Greens Gunyah Museum is very much a volunteer organisation. There are lots of different ways people volunteer at your local museum.

People can join the Lockhart & District Historical Society which operates the Greens Gunyah Museum. They meet every second month on the last Thursday of the month at 7-30pm.

Every day a volunteer is needed to open the museum at 10am and close up again at 2pm. They welcome tourists seeking tourist information and collect payment for those wishing to look through the museum. Most volunteers do this once or twice a month.

All items donated to the museum are catalogued which involves recording information about the item and giving it a unique number. This is usually done in the room set aside for this purpose and often done with 2 or 3 others who assist anyone new to learn the process.

Hardly a month goes by when there is not a coach visiting the museum that requests a Tour Guide to go on the coach for a half hour town tour.

In the last year the kitchen in the Showroom has had a major upgrade to be able to meet catering requests from coach and other groups. Our Catering Team baked 400 scones for the Spirit of the Land Devonshire Teas. Being a part of the Catering Team is on an as needed basis.

The museum regularly receives requests for information about families or historical events or places. Research can be very rewarding for people with patience and an enquiring mind. Over the last 50 years the museum has acquired a lot of documents, maps, books and photos from the local area so we have a lot of information to access.

On the first Sunday of every month at 2pm a working bee is held to maintain the property and make planned changes to the exhibits.

Some volunteers undertake several of these tasks but most concentrate on one. Some tasks are dealing with the public while others are behind the scenes. The museum has a good number of volunteers that enable it to operate 7 days per week but as the older members find it difficult to continue it provides an opportunity for others to become involved in an area of interest to them. Drop into the museum one day or talk to Heather or Paul and discuss how you could help.

## ST BARNABYS THISTLE



#### Centaurea solstitialis

**Other Common Names:** Golden Star Thistle, Yellow Cockspur, Yellow Centaurea, Geeldissel, Yellow Star Thistle.

**Distribution:** St Barnaby's Thistle is native to southern Europe, North Africa and Western Asia. In its native Mediterranean habitat, the plant is generally kept in check by an assortment of natural enemies and other plants that have co-evolved with it. These native controls do not exist in Australia and the plant thrives, particularly on roadsides, neglected areas, in grain crops and range lands. St Barnaby's Thistle competes with desirable species in crops and pastures, through shading other species and competing for nutrients, as well as producing allelopathic compounds which inhibit the growth of other species.

**Description:** An annual perennial herb St Barnaby's Thistle prefers to grow in fertile soils in temperate regions. It likes full sun and is susceptible to frost when in flower. Its preferred place is in areas with an annual rainfall of around 600mm, but can survive in areas with much less rain.

**Livestock:** St Barnaby's Thistle is not palatable to stock unless the plant is very young. The spines on the plant can cause injury to stock, particularly to the eyes, mouth and feet, as well as restricting stock movement. The plant is toxic to horses and can lead to the fatal nervous disorder "chewing disease". The plant contains a poison that causes lesions on the brain.

Life cycle: Seeds germinate in autumn and seedlings develop into rosettes over winter. The

plant usually reaches about 30 centimetres in height by spring, when it produces woody branch stems. Flowering occurs from mid to late October, and continues through the summer.

**Stems:** This plant has several branching hairy stems that are greyish in colour. They can grow to a height of about one meter. The stems lack spines.

**Leaves:** St Barnaby's Thistle has juvenile and adult leaves. The juvenile leaves are clubbed shaped with toothed margins and together they grow forming a star shape on the ground. They have long hairs on the top side of the leaf.

The adult leaf that grows on rosettes and on the lower part of the stems, grow to about 20cm in size and are spear like in shape. The leaves on the upper part of the stems are smaller in size.

**Flowers:** The flowers are a typical thistle like in appearance. They are yellow with large spikes about 10-20mm in length coming out of the base of the flower. The thistle flowers from spring and into summer. One flower head can produce 35-80 seeds.

**Seed:** There are two types of seed produced on the St Barnaby's Thistle, an inner and an outer seed. The inner seeds have a circle of hairs that can easily be picked up by the wind. It is light fawn to grey in colour and small, 2-3mm in length. The outer seed is dark brown, 3-4mm in length and has little to no hair on them. These outer seeds are usually dropped around the base of the plant.

**Priority weed:** St Barnaby's Thistle is considered a priority weed in the Lockhart Shire.

For **All of NSW**: **General Biosecurity Duty**: All plants are regulated with a general biosecurity duty to prevent, eliminate or minimise any biosecurity risk they may pose. Any person who deals with any plant, who knows (or ought to know) of any biosecurity risk, has a duty to ensure the risk is prevented, eliminated or minimised, so far as is reasonably practicable.
