Mayoral Report

Happy New Year to all our residents and visitors, I hope your Christmas season was joyous and restful. To those who were sick or lost loved ones I hope 2024 brings better times. Our weather patterns continue to surprise us especially as we were supposed to be in El Nino, mind you I don't miss the 40 degree days however I am sure they are not far away.

This year brings us many new challenges, not only is it an election year, but we also have to find a replacement for our highly esteemed General Manager. Peter will be finishing in July so the process has begun to find his replacement. To this end Council has engaged Local Government Services Group to undertake the recruitment process. This is the same group who got Peter for us.



I must say I was pleased with the responses Council received in relation to the proposed Community Centre at The Rock. The great majority of them were positive with some good ideas. Some suggested the need for full kitchen and separate toilets, the reason it is attached to the existing building is to negate the need for a separate kitchen and toilets which would make the project unaffordable. The Project group will be meeting shortly to discuss the feedback. The Lockhart gymnasium group has agreed on a new logo and progress is continuing on completing this project.

Council has been frustrated by the delay of the Office of Local Government (OLG) to sign off on our list of projects under Local Government Recovery Grants Program, which includes Emily Street The Rock, Cole Street Yerong Creek and works at Lockhart. We have sought the assistance of our Local Member to try and expedite the process.

Council has also been successful in obtaining funding along with Wagga regarding the Regional Drought Resilience Program which aims to build capability and empower regional communities to better prepare and respond to drought risks.

Australia Day this year will be at The Rock Recreation Ground commencing at 8.00am. A free breakfast will be provided by the local RFS and free admittance to the swimming pool will be available after the official ceremony. Our Ambassador this year is Mr. Craig Goozee OAM; he is an ultra-marathon runner who has raised millions of dollars for children's cancer foundations. I look forward to meeting and listening to his story. I hope as many residents as possible will attend the ceremony to support Australia Day and Community Awards recipients.

Just a reminder that Covid 19 is still around and is impacting our health services, businesses and the elderly. I would recommend that you keep up to date with the vaccination program to ensure we reduce the seriousness of the virus. I know some people are skeptical of vaccinations but I would just say how many diseases smallpox, polio etc. have been eliminated thanks to vaccines.

Finally, I hope 2024 is a year in which we as a nation and Shire continue to prosper.

2022/23 FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

The Council's 2022/23 Audited Financial Statements were presented to the Council meeting held on 18 December 2023. The Council achieved a surplus in net operating result from continuing operations (including capital contributions) of \$3.86M for the year ended 30 June 2023. The net operating surplus for the year before grants and contributions provided for capital purposes is \$2.1M.

A summary of the 2022/23 Financial Statements against the performance measures and performance benchmarks set by the Office of Local Government (OLG) is set out below. Consistent with previous years, Council's financial results are above the industry benchmark for all performance measures with the exception of own source revenue.


Council received, for the second year, a qualified opinion and this was with specific regard to Council resolving to not recognise the Rural Fire Service (RFS) red fleet assets on Council's Balance Sheet. Refer to pages 75-76 of the Annual Financial Statements for more detail on the basis for the qualified opinion.

Operating performance ratio

The 'operating performance ratio' measures how well council contained operating expenditure within operating revenue (excluding capital grants and contributions, fair value adjustments, and reversal of revaluation decrements). The benchmark set by OLG is greater than zero percent.

The Council exceeded the OLG benchmark for the current reporting period.

The operating performance ratio increased to 11.70 percent (2022: 0.59 percent) due to the increase in operating grants received.



Own Source operating revenue ratio.

The 'own source operating revenue ratio' measures council's fiscal flexibility and the degree to which it relies on external funding sources such as operating grants and contributions. The benchmark set by OLG is greater than 60 percent.

Council did not meet the OLG benchmark for the current reporting period. This indicates that the Council is more reliant on external funding sources, such as grants and contributions.

The own source operating revenue ratio has decreased in 2023, due to the overall increase in grants and contributions revenue of \$1.9 million.



Unrestricted current ratio

The 'unrestricted current ratio' is specific to local government and represents the Council's ability to meet its short-term obligations as they fall due. The benchmark set by OLG is greater than 1.5 times.

The Council exceeded the OLG benchmark for the current reporting period.

Council's unrestricted current ratio has remained



Debt service cover ratio

The 'debt service cover ratio' measures the operating cash to service debt including interest, principal and lease payments. The benchmark set by OLG is greater than two times.

The Council exceeded the OLG benchmark for the current reporting period. This indicates that the Council has sufficient operating revenue to service its debts.


Council's debt service cover ratio has improved, due to the increase in operating grants and contributions revenue.





The 'rates and annual charges outstanding percentage' assesses the impact of uncollected rates and annual charges on council's liquidity and the adequacy of debt recovery efforts. The benchmark set by OLG is less than 10 percent for regional and rural councils.

The Council met the OLG benchmark for the current reporting period which is a reflection of sound debt recovery procedures at the Council.

The rates and annual charges outstanding percentage has increased from the previous year, but still remains below the OLG benchmark.









Cash expense cover ratio

This liquidity ratio indicates the number of months the council can continue paying for its immediate expenses without additional cash inflow. The benchmark set by OLG is greater than three months.

The Council's cash expense cover ratio was 16.21 months, which is above the industry benchmark of greater than 3 months. This indicates that Council had the capacity to cover 16.21 months of operating cash expenditure without additional cash inflows at 30 June 2023.

The cash expense cover ratio has increased due to increase in cash and cash equivalent and investment by \$4.8 million.

WORKS REPORT

Local Sealed Roads.

Heavy patching has continued on Western Rd, Bidgeemia-Urana Rd and The Rock-Mangoplah Rd.

Rehabilitation works have commenced on Western Rd and The Rock-Mangoplah Rd.

Shoulder grading on Boree Creek-Kywong has been completed.

Drainage improvements and shoulder widening on the Yerong Creek-Mangoplah Rd has commenced.

Roadside slashing has been completed on Bidgeemia-Urana Rd and Rand-Bidgeemia Rd.

Unsealed Roads:

Unsealed Road Maintenance of Shire gravel roads has been conducted on: Scheetz Ln, Munyabla-Munyaplah Rd, Zwecks Ln and Ryan Stock Route, Munyabla Boundary Rd and Spurrells Rd.

Maintenance Crews:

Bitumen crew have been kept busy with an increase of pavement failures due to the weather, routine maintenance has continued on our Local and Regional Roads.

Maintenance crews have been assisting with the heavy patching, Roadside slashing and sign installation.

PARKS & GARDENS

Mowing of park entrances and open areas continue as normal, weeding is being carried out both physically and chemically when the weather allows.

Watering of street trees and gardens continues during the hot weather.

Paving began in the week commencing 18 December 2023 at 109 Green Street Lockhart.

Contractors have been sought for slabs to be poured at the Lone Pine and cenotaph at The Rock for installation of Anzac remembrance seating.

Mowing and weeding of Yerong Creek continues as the weather allows.

Mowing of the townships of Pleasant Hills and Milbrulong will be taking place shortly when machine and transport availability is organised.

There have been staff shortages at The Rock over the Christmas period however we will continue to do our best with the staff we have on.

WEEDS

Property Inspections

Inspections were carried out on residential and rural properties. The majority of properties were selected due to a change in ownership.

The most commonly found weeds were Green cestrum (Cestrum parqui) and Privet (Ligustrum sp.) respectively.

Control Program

Priority has been given to the control of Horehound (*Marrubium vulgare*) and St. John's wort (*Hypericum perforatum*) on roadside reserves and council managed land.

The following roads were inspected for weeds and herbicide application was administrated where appropriate: The Rock Mangoplah Road, Jaegers Lane, Klimpschs Lane, Bulloc Hill Lane, Jarricks Lane, Weillys Lane, Old Trunk Road, The Rock Collingullie Road, Humphrys Lane, McGeachies Lane, Leitch Lane, Lagettie Lane, Bullenbong The Rock Road, Moores Bus Route, Hendersons Road, Boyds Road, Braithwaites Lane, Coman Street, Yerong Street, Semmens Road, Lodge Road, Nicholas Street, Olympic Highway, Rods Road, McRories Lane, Osborne Yerong Creek Road, Noskes Lane, Seeligers Lane, Finlayson Lane, Neuhaus Lane, Broughtons Lane, Janetskes Lane, Schultz Lane, Geddes Lane, Woodend Fiveways Road, Semmlers Road, Schneiders Lane, County Boundary Road, Figtree Road, Osborne Pleasant Hills Road, Wallace Brownes Road, Alf Freemans Lane, Wrathall School Lane, Grubben Road, Eulensteins Road, Vincents Road, Yerong Creek Mangoplah Road, Shaws Lane, Adams Lane, Plums Lane, Montagues Lane, Willis Lane, Mittagong Yerong Creek Road, Tootool Mittagong Road, Tuttys Lane, Old French Park Bullenbong Road, Lockhart The Rock Road, Curries Lane, Wetmores Lane, lletts Lane, Terlich Lane, Benders Lane, Bahrs Lane, French Park Bullenbung Road, Mortons Lane, Slys Lane, Vennells Lane, Henty Pleasant Hills Road, Edgehill School Lane, Browns Lane, Alma Park Road, and Spurrells Road.

Control of St. John's wort continued through December to all other roads within the Shire.

New laws for food businesses under Standard 3.2.2A

Changes to the Australia New Zealand Food Standards Code introduced new requirements for businesses that prepare and serve food in NSW.

Standard 3.2.2A introduces 3 tools for businesses handling and serving unpackaged, ready-to-eat food requiring temperature control, depending on their activities:

- have a qualified Food Safety Supervisor
- ensure all food handlers are trained
- be able to demonstrate safe food practices

The Standard applies to most businesses from 8 December 2023. School canteens, children's services providing food, supermarkets, greengrocers, delis, coffee vendors selling food, boarding schools and correctional centres have until 8 December 2024.

It does not apply to businesses licensed with the NSW Food Authority, businesses that only manufacture or wholesale food with no direct sale to consumers, or the handling of food for fundraising.

NSW Planning Portal

Lockhart Shire Council uses electronic lodgement of Development Applications (DA), Construction Certificates (CC), Complying Development Applications (CDC) & Section 68 through the <u>NSW Planning Portal</u>. Applicants will need to establish their own account and then lodge their DA's, CC's and CDC's. For further information or for assistance please contact our Planning & Building team.

This is the process that Council recommends you follow:

 Contact our Planning Team on 02 6920 5305 to discuss your application or to arrange a pre lodgement meeting if required.

Visit the <u>NSW Planning Portal</u> to <u>Register</u> for a NSW Planning Portal account to start your application. This will enable you to access your dashboard, view, manage, track and progress applications, pay state agency fees and submit documents. You will also receive email notifications at key stages of the application process.

Log in to complete the online application form.

- For DA's and CC's you will need to submit a State of Environmental Effects, owner's consent, cost estimate report as well as all supporting plans and documents.
- For CDC's you will need to submit a certificate of title, site plan, design plans, structural plans and building specifications.
- Once we receive your application, Council will do a preliminary assessment and contact you to arrange payment of fees or request additional information.
- Once Council is satisfied with the information provided and fees are paid, your application can be lodged.

Council encourages all applicants to arrange a pre lodgement meeting with the Planning & Building team to ensure all required paperwork is ready before lodgement.

In order to plan for the future, the NSW Government encourages Councils to review their sewer operations every eight years. This process is called Integrated Water Cycle Management (IWCM).

The IWCM reviews the current situation, then applies longer term projects to accommodate for future development, population growth and system demand. Longer term infrastructure needs are considered and a long term financial model is developed.

The draft IWCM can be downloaded from Councils website and submissions received before 29 February 2024 will be considered.

AUSTRALIA DAY Ambassador

Mr Craig Goozee OAM

Ultra Marathoner

Most people have problems getting their heads around running a 42.6km marathon. Australia's Craig Goozee has pushed beyond this and has now completed three ultra-marathons since 1998.

After his eldest daughter was diagnosed with cancer in 1997, Craig has been on a marathon mission to raise funds and awareness for children's cancer foundations.

In 1998, he completed a 16-day grueling ocean paddle from Avalon Beach in Sydney to Broadbeach in Queensland. Five-meter sharks, cyclones and constant head winds were just some of the elements he had to battle to complete the journey.

In 2000, Craig set off from Albany, Western Australia, to run, cycle and paddle across the continent. Covering over 5000km's, he completed the epic journey in 34 days. Part of the marathon was paddling against the current from South Australia to New South Wales on the Murray River.

In 2009, the ultimate challenge was completed with a 91-day ultramarathon around Australia. Craig averaged 150km's each day to finish the journey, which is equivalent to doing a half iron man event every day.

Craig's achievements have not only raised millions of dollars, but he has been recognised for his dedication by the Australian people.

Craig Goozee spent 23 years in the New South Wales Police Service and worked the last ten years as a plainclothes operative dealing with organised crime syndicates. He left the police in 2003 and has since completed his certificate 3 and 4 in fitness training. Craig is the published author of the non-fiction book, "For One For All". He has been recognised and utilised by the Australia Day Council for the past ten years as a motivational speaker. On the 14th October 2009 the Lithographic Institute of Australia wrote, "his presentation was one of the most touching and inspirational events the LIA Awards have ever witnessed."

Craig has appeared on Random Acts of Kindness, Today Program, A Current Affair, Wide World of Sports, News Programs, Who Magazine, Ultra-Fit Magazine, and multiple other media outlets. In 2009, he spoke on a regular basis as a guest with sports programs on 2GO, 2KY, Sky Sports, 2UE, 2SM and many ABC stations around the country.

- ☑ Clean drums, rinsed to the Agsafe standard
- Drums larger than 1 litre and up to 205 litre;
- ☑ Drums that have been used for agricultural and livestock production, pest and weed control;
- ☑ Drums that are not hazardous substances, used in agricultural production
 - ☑ All pesticides
 - ☑ Seed dressings
 - ☑ Drenches
 - ☑ Wetters/Stickers/Adjuvants
 - ☑ Foam markers

Previously

What will not be accepted

- Drums with any residue (including lid and neck)
- Drums containing more than 100mL of rinsate

Drums that packaged the following;

- Liquid chlorine
- Household disinfectants
- Petroleum products

Triple rinsing

- 1. Empty the contents of the container into the spray tank and allow the container to drain for an extra 30 seconds after the flow reduces to drops.
- 2. Fill the container with clean water to about 20% of its capacity and replace the cap securely.
- 3. Shake, rotate, roll or invert the container vigorously for at least 30 seconds, so that the rinse water reaches all inside surfaces.
- 4. Pour the rinsate (the rinsing water from step 3) into the spray tank. Let it drain for an extra 30 seconds after the flow reduces
- 5. Repeat until the container has been rinsed three times
- Containers should have caps removed for easy access by inspectors.
- No container will be accepted if they are crushed because it makes them difficult to inspect.
- Steel drums must be punctured.
- Please do not puncture plastics as some are reused
- All persons delivering drums to the drumMUSTER must sign a Container Cleanliness Declaration, noting the exact number of drums for delivery to drumMUSTER.

To ensure the **DrumMUSTER** operates efficiently and without time delay, drums will only be accepted at the facility by appointment. You may book a time to dispose of your properly cleaned chemical containers by calling Lockhart Shire Council on 02 6920 5305. Please count your drums and let Council know how many you have so the time allocated to you will be sufficient for inspecting.

Some residents are still placing nappies and adult continence pads in BioBags and then in the Green Lidded Bin. This is a NO NO.

Please place all nappies and continence pads and other contaminates in the Red Lidded General Waste Bin

Nappy management in general waste bins

Nappies must go in the general waste (red lidded) bin. Nearly all bins smell a bit and particularly bins containing nappies. Here are some ways to minimise odours:

- tip nappy contents into the toilet before you throw the nappy into the bin
- wrap nappy tightly into itself and use the tabs to secure
- tie nappy in a compostable bag, removing air
- store your rubbish bin in the shade
- make sure the lid can close properly
- add odour neutralisers such as bi-carb soda to your bin.

FOGO - Caddy Liner Bags

As part of the introduction of the Food Organics Garden Organics (FOGO) to Lockhart Shire Council's waste collection service in 2020 Council free caddy liner bags were available to residents during the three year transition period. This roll out was funded by a grant from the NSW Government

Moving forward, to encourage the use of the FOGO service, and in line with our sustainability goals, Council will continue to provide, free of charge, **two** rolls of caddy liner bags per year to residents upon request from April 2023. A record of the bags distributed will be kept to assist in monitoring the supply.

Rivering Water Restrictions in Lockhart Shire Water

During daylight savings each year, Stage 1 water restrictions come into effect.

Stage 1 is to remind you to be mindful of your water usage as the weather warms up.

Gardens and Lawns:

Domestic and Commercial Restrictions: Watering from 10am to 5pm is not allowed, unless you are using a handheld hose.

You must wait until after 5pm before using any other watering methods eg sprinklers, irrigation systems.

Outside of daylight savings, there are no water restrictions imposed unless otherwise specified. From time to time, certain areas may have temporary water restrictions due to emergencies eg bushfire or infrastructure issues.

Paved Areas:

Domestic restrictions: You cannot hose down paved areas between 10am and 5pm unless required as a result of an accident, fire, health hazard or other emergency.

Our water restrictions are triggered based on supply and usage. For full details, please see Riverina Water Water Restrictions Policy.
