Advertising will shortly begin for the General Manager's position which will hopefully attract a strong field. We have had a number of vacancies especially in outdoor staff which has placed a lot of pressure on the works program, these are gradually being filled and we should be back up to full strength shortly. To those new employees that have joined us we welcome you and hope your stay will be beneficial. Congratulations also to Jesse Rapley on being elevated to the new Director Planning and Environment position. Speaking of new arrivals, I would also like to welcome Fr Justin Darlow as the new parish priest at The Rock.

As previously mentioned, this year is an election year and Council is looking to assist anyone who may be interested in nominating for Council by running some seminars on what's involved. Details are included in the newsletter. Council will also be seeking expressions of interest from section 355 committee members on a grant writing course.

Our works program is ratcheting up with significant rehabilitation works being undertaken on The Rock /Mangoplah Rd and Western Road. Solar panels have been installed at Lockhart and The Rock pools and soon at The Rock Sewerage works to help reduce electricity costs. The Flood Study consultant at The Rock is preparing material to go out to the community.

On Friday 23rd February Council in conjunction with Rotary will commemorate the 25th anniversary of Lockhart being proclaimed a Peace Town. There are more than 60 peace counties, cities and towns in 20 countries around the world, Lockhart was declared a Rotary Peace Town on 23rd February 1999.

In other good news the long running dispute between the Regional Library and Wagga City has been resolved with both parties agreeing on a settlement figure. In other news Council made donations to the Yerong Creek Public Hall Committee and The Rock Meals on Wheels.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT ELECTIONS

The next Local Government Elections will be held on 14 September 2024.

The Lockhart Shire Council elections will be conducted by the NSW Electoral Commission (NSWEC) which has a dedicated website at <u>elections.nsw.gov.au</u> that will be continually updated with information regarding the 2024 elections. The NSWEC will also be providing a series of webinars with information about each upcoming webinar to be published on its website. Each webinar will be recorded and published on the website for viewing at any time.

Council is considering engaging Local Government NSW (LGNSW) to conduct either online or in-person candidate briefings in 2024 to ensure that candidates for the upcoming elections are fully aware of the role and responsibilities of elected members. The aim of these Candidate briefings is to ensure that candidates are aware of:

- The role and responsibilities of councillors and the role of the governing body of a council under the Local Government Act 1993.
- The framework in which councils operate.
- The operational role of the General Manager and the strategic role of the mayor and councillors.
- The time commitment required of a councillor in terms of their participation in council meetings and other council activities, and more.

25TH ANNIVERSARY OF LOCKHART PEACE TOWN DECLARATION

Lockhart was declared a Peace Town on 23 February 1999 as part of a broader Rotary International initiative.

The concept of Rotary District D9700 Community Peace Cities/Towns was conceived in Wagga Wagga by Rotarian Tony Quinlivan. The City became the first Peace Community on 23 February 1993. There are now more than 60 peace counties, cities and towns in 20 different countries around the world.

Lockhart was declared a Rotary Peace town on February 23, 1999. The declaration of Lockhart as a Peace Town was commemorated by the unveiling of a plaque at Hodgson Park.

An event is being held at Hodgson Park on Friday 23 February 2024 to mark the 25th anniversary of the declaration. Representatives of Rotary Clubs in the region, specifically Wagga where this international movement was initiated, have been invited along with local parliamentarians and other guests.

ENGINEERING AND ENVIRONMENTAL SERVICES REPORT

Staff shortages have affected operational tasks particularly in parks and gardens and works. Recruitment is under way to fill vacancies.

Line marking of give way and stop lines has been undertaken at The Rock and Lockhart.

Council's Jetpatcher is back on-line after a short breakdown.

New footpath has been completed in O'Connell and Hayes Street, Lockhart under state government Get Active NSW funding.

Solar panels have been installed on The Rock and Lockhart Swimming pools which will reduce Councils electricity bills. Further installation to occur at The Rock Sewerage Treatment Plant.

A replacement program for sewer assets is being prepared on a criticality basis for future budgets.

Similarly, a program for Council's pools is also being prepared and costed.

The consultant for The Rock Flood Study is preparing consultation material to go out to the community. Flood model has been updated with latest rainfall and runoff data and incorporating flood works undertaken by Council. Floodplain management committee will meet following consultation period.

After dealing with the relevant insurance matters and sourcing quotes, a contractor has been engaged to repair and reinstall the Drummond Memorial at the corner of Green and Matthews Streets, Lockhart.

WORKS

Local Sealed Roads

Western Rd and The Rock Mangoplah Rd shoulder widening are now complete. Boree Creek Kywong Rd shoulder widening has commenced.

Drainage improvements and shoulder widening on the Yerong Creek Mangoplah Rd is now complete.

Culvert widening on the Mittagong Yerong Creek Rd is well under way, with the northern culvert completed.

Maintenance of Shire gravel roads has been conducted on: Carns Lane, Dan Gleesons Lane, McLellands Lane, McKintys Lane, Osborne Pleasant Hills Road, Thomas Lane, Jim McDonnells Lane, Pat Gleesons Lane, Pietchs Lane, Ferndale Road, Jack Blights Lane and Schneiders Lane.

Maintenance Crews

Bitumen crew have been kept busy with routine maintenance on our Local and Regional Roads.

Maintenance crews have been assisting with the shoulder widening on the Western Rd and The Rock Mangoplah Rd.

PARKS & GARDENS

Lockhart

Paving of 109 Green Street has been completed. Access has been opened and bollards at rear have been installed. Mowing of parks and entrances have been affected by staff shortages, watering activities for street trees and gardens maintained over the break.

The Rock

Staff shortages have also affected work at The Rock, watering and mowing undertaken with available staff. Concrete slab has been poured at the Avenue of Honour.

WEEDS

Control Program

Priority has been given to the control of St. John's wort (*Hypericum perforatum*) on roadside reserves and council managed land. Due to continued rainfall events, multiple germinations of St. John's wort have occurred.

The following roads were inspected for St. John's wort and herbicide application was administered where appropriate: Albury Road, Bakes Lane, Bankvale Lane, Bidgeemia Road, Clancys Lane, Clontarf Lane, County Boundary Road, Edgehill Stock Route, Fargunyah Lane, Fletts Lane, Forcks Lane, French Park Bullenbong Road, Henty Pleasant Hills Road, Henty Ryan Road, Edgehill Lane, Hollies Road, Jaegars

Lane, Klemkes Road, Krauses Lane, Lallarook Lane, Lockhart Kywong Road, Lockhart The Rock Road, Munyabla Road, Munyabla Munyaplah Road, Munyaplah Boundary Road, Ryan Stock Route, Scheetz Lane, Schneiders Lane, Scotts Lane, Seberrys Lane, Slocums Lane, Soldier Settlement Road, Tinamba Lane, Urana Lockhart Road, Wallendoon Access Road, Western Road, Wolters Lane, and Zwecks Lane.

Priority has also been given to the control of Silverleaf nightshade (*Solanum elaeagnifolium*) on roadside reserves and council-managed land. Also due to continued rainfall events, infestations have increased in density, area and population. Silverleaf nightshade was controlled on Albury Road, Barracluffs Road, Bidgeemia Road, French Park Bullenbong Road, Hendersons Lane, Lockhart Kywong Road, Old French Park Bullenbong Road, Urana Lockhart Road and Western Road.

Bathurst burr (*Xanthium spinosum*) was controlled on Farrells Lane, French Park Bullenbong Road, McRaes Lane, and Soldier Settlement Road.

Clockweed (Oenothera curtiflora) was controlled on Urana Lockhart Road.

Feathertop Rhodes grass (*Chloris virgata*) was controlled on Albury Road, Lockhart Collingullie Road, Lockhart The Rock Road, and Urana Lockhart Road.

Horehound (*Marrubium vulgare*) was controlled on Albury Road, French Park Bullenbong Road, Lallarook Lane, Lockhart The Rock Road, Schneiders Lane and Soldier Settlement Road.

Spiny burrgrass (Cenchrus spinifex) red guidepost sites were sprayed on County Boundary Road.

St. Barnaby's thistle (Centaurea colstitialis) was controlled on Jaegars Lane, Klimpschs Lane, and Yuluma Road.

Yellow-flowered devil's claw (*Ibicella lutea*) was controlled on Soldier Settlement Road.

Railway Corridor Weed Infestations

In November, Council's Environmental Officer contacted ARTC to discuss the weed infestations present on the main branch railway line within Lockhart Shire, from the shire boundary northeast of The Rock to the shire boundary north of Henty. Positive correspondence has occurred and control of priority weeds, as well as environmental weeds, has been established.

Also in November, Council's Environmental Officer contacted UGL Regional Linx Pty Ltd to discuss the weed infestations present on the regional branch railway line within the Lockhart Shire from The Rock to the shire boundary, southeast of Boree Creek. Council's Environmental Officer was informed that UGL Regional Linx Pty. Ltd. only spray weeds that are state priority weeds and regional priority weeds.

St. John's wort (*Hypericum perforatum*) is prevalent on this railway corridor, which is a local priority weed within Lockhart Shire. Landholders that are adjacent to this regional railway corridor were invited by Council's Environmental Officer to provide written correspondence, detailing the location and weed species of greatest concern, to be forwarded to UGL Regional Linx Pty. Ltd. Council's Environmental Officer will continue to seek advice on this matter, and continue communication with UGL Regional Linx Pty. Ltd. and Transport for NSW to resolve this matter.

Khaki Weed Control by Community Effort

With Khaki weed (*Alternanthera pungens*) being widespread in townships, Lockhart Shire Council encourages residents to be vigilant in its control. Bearing in mind that Khaki weed is not considered a priority weed in the Shire, Council does not have the resources to attend to all infestations with the townships of the Shire before the plant produces seed. If residents are attentive to their own property, as

well as the adjacent nature strip and back lanes, greater control can be achieved. On rural properties, regularly check directly under your mailbox and around electricity meters.

Weed of Concern – Bristly Ox-Tongue

Following the discovery of Bristly ox-tongue (*Helminthotheca echiodies*) on private property within the Shire, this species was chosen as the weed of the month in the December 2022 – January 2023 Council newsletter. Roadside inspections in spring of 2023 and summer of 2024 have shown that this species is quite widespread within the Shire, with small patches being present on many roads. It has the ability to remain undetected by looking similar to many other common weeds. To prevent this weed becoming a major problem within the Shire, locations will be monitored, and control methods will be investigated.

ENVIRONMENTAL MATTERS

Bird Sightings at Tootool Wetlands and Milbrulong Forest

Council's Environmental Officer would like to extend her appreciation to The Murrumbidgee Field Naturalists for providing a copy of their December 2023 newsletter, "The Murrumbidgee Naturalist'. During December 2023, members with expertise in bird identification, visited the Tootool Wetlands and Milbrulong Forest. The newsletter contains a list of species sighted at these locations.

At Tootool Wetlands, sightings included: Australian king parrot (*Alisterus scapularis*), Southern boobook (Ninox novaeseelandiae), Brown treecreeper (*Climacteris picumnus*), Fan-tailed cuckoo (*Cacomantis flabelliformis*), Yellow-billed spoonbill (*Platalea flavipes*) including a pair displaying synchronization behaviour, and over fifty sightings of Fairy Martin (*Petrochelidon ariel*), which were displaying behaviour suggesting nest building.

At Milbrulong Forest, sightings included: Brown treecreeper (*Climacteris picumnus*), Eastern yellow robin (*Eopsaltria australis*) and Jacky Winter (Microeca fascinans), one of which was an adult on a nest.

This is greatly appreciated information, which is essential in establishing the habitat health of these natural areas, as well as extending the native species list.

LEP Review Update

A draft Planning Proposal for the proposed changes to residential components of the Lockhart LEP was sent to the Department of Planning, Housing and Infrastructure and relevant agencies late last year for preliminary comments. Comments have since been received and several areas are required to be addressed prior to the submission of a Planning Proposal. Flooding and biodiversity at The Rock are the main areas of concern that need further investigation and reporting prior to the submission of a Planning Proposal.

With the review of The Rock Flood Study due to be completed later this year, this will address the additional information that is required for flooding. A draft Planning Proposal for the proposed LEP residential changes at The Rock will be resubmitted once the Flood Study Review has been completed. This will also give time for the biodiversity concerns that were raised to be addressed also.

In the meantime, a draft planning proposal will be completed and sent to the Department and relevant agencies for the proposed residential amendments for Lockhart. This is due to the flooding and biodiversity concerns being minimal for the proposed Lockhart residential amendments. This draft Planning Proposal will be presented to a council meeting in the coming months, prior to it being placed on public exhibition.

Tourism & Economic Development

The year has started off to a flying start with meetings with both NBN and Telstra regarding upgrades to infrastructure and new towers across Lockhart Shire. Council has developed a strategy with both providers with the aim to increase connectivity, workshops/education forums on various topics, and how new technology can help Council operations. Since our Community Connectivity Survey back in 2022, we have had upgrades to both Lockhart and The Rock Mobile Towers, 4G Base Station installed at Yerong Creek, 5G towers to be installed at Yerong Creek and Pleasant Hills. 5G Towers to also be installed at Henty and Urana, which will feed into Lockhart Shire as well. Currently the Telstra infrastructure at Galore Hill Scenic Reserve is receiving an upgrade and will go from 13th February to 1st March. Residents and Business may be affected. Brookong Creek Draft Masterplan

Brookong Creek Draft Masterplan went on public exhibition over the Nov/Dec/Jan, thank you to all those who provided feedback. All feedback was presented to the Tourism Economic Development Steering Committee (TEDSC) for consideration in February. The TEDSC recommended several changes to Council, in which Council resolved to make. The final plan will be presented to Council at the March Meeting.

Regional Drought Resilience Planning Project

Lockhart Shire Council together with Wagga Wagga City Council have been successful in securing funding of \$450,000 under The Regional Drought Resilience Planning Program which is co-funded by the Australian Government's Future Drought Fund and the NSW Government

The funding deed has been signed, with work started on the procurement process for a consultant and creating a project group that will steer the project. Members of the project group will include Council Staff, Members of the Department of Regional NSW and two community representatives.

The aim of the program is to bring regional organisations, local government, communities and industry together to prepare for drought risks by planning.

- 1. Drug & Alcohol (Lifestyle and education)

- 3. Socio Economic factors (impacting on food security)

Lockhart LHAC's highlight for the year was being shortlisted as a finalist at the MLHD Excellence Awards.

Other key achievements included input into 'Growing Our Own' with potentially four school trainees starting in the next two years, supporting and engaging with schools to support initiatives and discuss health issues facing younger people.

"We are an enthusiastic team of volunteers and want to make a difference to help shape health services and achieving better health service outcomes in the Lockhart Shire," Lockhart LHAC Chair Fran Day OAM said.

"Of our many achievements, I am particularly proud of Lockhart LHAC's input into 'Growing Our Own' with potentially four school trainees starting in the next two years and we are looking forward to seeing this program come to life next year with Montana Aylett starting her training and what the next twelve months will bring," she said.

The Lockhart Local Health Advisory Committee is pleased to note the following initiatives being introduced at the Lockhart MPS:

- Access to the Needle Syringe Program (Safe Injecting Box) will be provided outside the building near the Emergency Department. This means it will no longer be necessary to enter the building for this purpose.
- An outpatient pathology service will be established, operating on Mondays and Fridays from 8.00am to 10.00am (noting that the Lockhart Medical Practice provides pathology services on Wednesdays). Whilst this will provide a more streamlined service, urgent cases will still be able to be attended to outside of these hours when required.

Residents urged to be aware of amoebic meningitis as water temperatures rise

With warmer air and water temperatures, the Murrumbidgee Local Health District is urging residents to take simple precautions around untreated or poorly treated water to protect themselves and their loved ones from a very rare but serious infection.

Amoebic meningoencephalitis is an extremely rare brain infection caused by an amoeba which lives in warm, fresh water and soil. While many people can have contact with the amoebas, only a small number develop serious illness.

According to MLHD people shouldn't be alarmed by primary amoebic meningoencephalitis, but in summer months it did present a risk that can be avoided with some easy precautions.

At particular risk are people in rural areas who have their own tank, dam or bore water supply, such as those living on farms, and people with poorly maintained swimming pools. Shallow wading pools are particularly at risk if they have been left in the sun for a long time.

Energy Efficiency Grants for Small and Medium Enterprises Round 2

Funding to purchase energy efficient equipment upgrades for small and medium businesses

What do you get?

A grant of up to \$25,000, to cover up to 100% of eligible expenditure. There is a total of \$41.241 million available for this grant opportunity.

Grant funding will be distributed between states and territories based on the distribution of small and medium sized businesses nationally. Refer to Appendix A in the grant opportunity guidelines for a breakdown of funding in each jurisdiction.

We expect that there may be a high level of interest for this grant opportunity, and it may be oversubscribed. This is a demand driven grant opportunity. Grants will be awarded to eligible applicants on a first come, first served basis until the funding is exhausted in each jurisdiction.

Who is this for?

This grant opportunity is for small and medium sized businesses with an employee headcount of 1 to 199 employees.

What will not be accepted

Triple rinsing

- 1. Empty the contents of the container into the spray tank and allow the container to drain for an extra 30 seconds after the flow reduces to drops.
- 2. Fill the container with clean water to about 20% of its capacity and replace the cap securely.
- 3. Shake, rotate, roll or invert the container vigorously for at least 30 seconds, so that the rinse water reaches all inside surfaces.
- 4. Pour the rinsate (the rinsing water from step 3) into the spray tank. Let it drain for an extra 30 seconds after the flow reduces
- 5. Repeat until the container has been rinsed three times
- Containers should have caps removed for easy access by inspectors.
- No container will be accepted if they are crushed because it makes them difficult to inspect.
- Steel drums must be punctured.
- Please do not puncture plastics as some are reused
- All persons delivering drums to the drumMUSTER must sign a Container Cleanliness Declaration, noting the exact number of drums for delivery to drumMUSTER.

To ensure the **DrumMUSTER** operates efficiently and without time delay, drums will only be accepted at the facility by appointment. You may book a time to dispose of your properly cleaned chemical containers by calling Lockhart Shire Council on 02 6920 5305. Please count your drums and let Council know how many you have so the time allocated to you will be sufficient for inspecting.

Some residents are still placing nappies and adult continence pads in BioBags and then in the Green Lidded Bin. This is a NO NO.

Please place all nappies and continence pads and other contaminates in the Red Lidded General Waste Bin

Nappy management in general waste bins

Nappies must go in the general waste (red lidded) bin. Nearly all bins smell a bit and particularly bins containing nappies. Here are some ways to minimise odours:

- tip nappy contents into the toilet before you throw the nappy into the bin
- wrap nappy tightly into itself and use the tabs to secure
- tie nappy in a compostable bag, removing air
- store your rubbish bin in the shade
- make sure the lid can close properly
- add odour neutralisers such as bi-carb soda to your bin.

FOGO - Caddy Liner Bags

As part of the introduction of the Food Organics Garden Organics (FOGO) to Lockhart Shire Council's waste collection service in 2020 Council free caddy liner bags were available to residents during the three year transition period. This roll out was funded by a grant from the NSW Government.

Moving forward, to encourage the use of the FOGO service, and in line with our sustainability goals, Council will continue to provide, free of charge, **two** rolls of caddy liner bags per year to residents upon request from April 2023. A record of the bags distributed will be kept to assist in monitoring the supply.

KHAKI WEED



Alternanthera pungens

Other Common Names: Creeping chaffweed, Khaki burr.

forms a dense mat over the ground surface. Its creeping stems are somewhat hairy and produce roots at their joints.

weed of disturbed sites, bare areas, roadsides, parks. lawns. waste watercourses. areas. turfgrasses, orchards, and occasionally also native pastures and grasslands.

Native to South America, particularly Venezuela, Brazil. Ecuador and Peru.

Stem and Leaves: The prostrate stems are mailbox and around electricity meters. produced from a tough and thickened central crown. They often have a reddish appearance and produce adventitious roots at their joints. These stems are covered with short, soft, hairs. Similar hairs are sometimes also present on the leaf stalks and leaf blades. The oppositely arranged leaves usually differ in size, with one leaf of the pairs being significantly larger than its partner. They are eggshaped or oval with margins that are entire or slightly wavy. These relatively small leaves (8-60 mm long and 6-30 mm wide) have rounded tips and are borne on very short stalks.

Flowers and Fruits: The inconspicuous greenishyellow or greenish-coloured flowers are grouped together in small globular clusters (8-12 mm long and 6-10 mm wide). These flower clusters are borne in the leaf forks and may become slightly elongated

as they mature. Flowering occurs from spring through to autumn. The tiny fruit is about 1 mm long and has a flattened top. It usually remains hidden inside the old, prickly, flower parts. Seeds are tiny, vellowish or orange in colour, and shiny in appearance.

Reproduction and Dispersal: Reproduces mainly by seed, though stem fragments may also take root after being dislodged from a plant. The seeds are contained inside a 'burr' which readily becomes attached to animals, clothing and tyres. Also dispersed by water movement and in contaminated fodder.

Priority weed: Khaki weed is NOT considered a priority weed in the Lockhart Shire.

Description: A long-lived, low-growing plant that **Community effort:** With Khaki weed being widespread in towns, Lockhart Shire Council encourages residents to be vigilant in its control. Bearing in mind that Khaki weed is not considered a Predominantly found in and around towns. It is a priority weed in the Shire, Council does not have the resources to attend to all infestations within the townships of the Shire before the plant produces seed. If residents are attentive to their own property, as well as the adjacent nature strip and back lanes. greater control can be achieved. On rural properties, regularly check directly under your
