

CLOCKWEED



Oenothera curtiflora

Other Common Names: Velvetweed, Velvetleaf Gaura, Lizard-tail Gaura, Willow Gaura, Small-flowered Bee-blossom, Downy Gaura, Velvety Gaura

Description: An annual garden escape that has become an invasive weed particularly along roadsides, creeks, and waterways.

An annual hairy herb growing to 1 m high. Native to North America, except for Canada and the Northeast.

Stems: Erect and usually unbranched, softly hairy with both glandular and long simple hairs.



Leaves: Oval shaped, up to 12 cm long and 4 cm wide and have tiny teeth along the margins.

Flowers: White flowers are very small with petals only 2-3 mm long. They open around sunset and last less than one day. They become reddish or yellow with age. Flowers in summer.

Fruit: A stiff capsule, 10 mm long and 2 mm wide. The fruit is dry but does not split open when ripe.



Priority weed: Clockweed is considered a priority weed in the Lockhart Shire.

This plant should not be sold in parts of NSW.

For All of NSW: General Biosecurity Duty: All plants are regulated with a general biosecurity duty to prevent, eliminate or minimise any biosecurity risk they may pose. Any person who deals with any plant, who knows (or ought to know) of any biosecurity risk, has a duty to ensure the risk is prevented, eliminated or minimised, so far as is reasonably practicable.

Mayoral Report

Hello again and what a wonderful sound it was the rain on the roof bringing an end to a long dry spell and providing a great tonic for our trees and pastures. There appears to be an average of around 30ml throughout the Shire which was greatly appreciated. Whilst it may not be the autumn break we are all seeking it is certainly a good start.

Council has certainly been busy with a number of strategic plans being adopted. Firstly, the Brookong Creek Masterplan was adopted by Council after a long and positive round of public consultation. The plan provides a blueprint for nature based visitor experiences that cater for a range of visitors. It will also enhance and protect conservation of endangered species, indigenous heritage and enhance the health and wellbeing of Shire residents. Special thanks to all those involved especially the Tourism and Economic Development Steering Committee and all those who made submissions.



The second major issue was the adoption of the Integrated Water Cycle Management Strategy. Much discussion took place on this issue and following strong representations from residents of South Lockhart a caveat was put in place that any decision on sewering South Lockhart requires full and open consultation with the residents. I congratulate Steve and Amanda Matthews and the South Lockhart residents who attended the Council meeting to air their concerns.

Anzac Day will soon be upon us and Councillors have been allocated to attend services at The Rock, Lockhart, Pleasant Hills and Yerong Creek. This important day is always well supported by the community which clearly shows a great respect for the men and women who served and continue to serve our country.

Our works crews are continuing their role of repairing and improving the Shire roads. The Mangoplah Rd is looking good and work has commenced on shoulder widening of BoreeCreek-Kywong Rd and grader crews are pushing ahead with the maintenance of our gravel roads. Congratulations also to The Rock RSL Sub-Branch and Council staff regarding the installation of new seating in the Avenue of Honour. The seats really compliment the Avenue.

Council also held a prebudget workshop to identify projects for inclusion and the challenges arising out of recent and future cost increases. These include a 3.5% Award pay rise for staff, a \$30,000 increase in our external audit costs and additional \$53,000 for Internal Audit and Risk following changes to government requirements. These along with many other issues will be determined at future budget workshops.

I was privileged along with the General Manager to have sneak preview of the new Rural Fire Service facility at The Rock. This modern complex will greatly enhance conditions for our volunteers and will provide a great training facility. On 27 March I will be attending the launch of the History podcast of the Pleasant Hills Football Club which ceased in 1955. I believe some of the members of the last team will be in attendance which should make for some great stories.

With the Easter Season fast approaching I wish all residents a safe and blessed Easter and hope that you may find some time to reflect on the importance of the occasion.

Council Snippets 18 March 2024

Brookong Creek Masterplan

Council at its meeting held on 18 March 2024 adopted a Masterplan for Brookong Creek and surrounds in Lockhart to guide the development of passive recreation opportunities in the area.

Council has received grant funding totalling \$140,000 under Round 5 of the Stronger Country Communities Fund to implement the first stage of improvements under the Masterplan. Adoption of the Masterplan will enable the first stage of improvements to be scoped and implemented using this grant funding.

Integrated Water Cycle Management (IWCM) Strategy – Sewerage Schemes

Council publicly exhibited a draft IWCM Strategy which all councils that manage water or sewerage schemes are required to develop.

The main priority identified in Council's IWCM Strategy, which has a 30 year horizon, was the need to upgrade the Lockhart Sewerage Treatment Plant. The Strategy also included reference to the extension of the Lockhart sewerage scheme to South Lockhart. However after considering submissions received from residents Council adopted the Strategy with the inclusion of a caveat that any proposal to extend the sewerage scheme would be subject to further consultation.

Council's efforts will now be focused on securing government funding for the upgrade the Lockhart Sewerage Treatment Plant.

Works

<u>Local Sealed Roads:</u> Boree Creek-Kywong Rd shoulder widening has commenced. Culvert widening on Mittagong Yerong Creek Rd - the northern culvert completed and the southern culvert are well under way. Vegetation, drains and shoulder grading have been completed on the Alma Park Rd and Henty Ryan Rd.

<u>Unsealed Roads:</u> Maintenance of Shire gravel roads has been conducted on Meltons Lane, Murphys Lane, Hendersons Road, Crowes Lane, Browns Lane, Old French Park Road and French Park town streets.

<u>Maintenance Crews:</u> The Bitumen Crew have been kept busy with routine maintenance on our Local and Regional Roads. Maintenance crews have been assisting with the shoulder widening on Boree Creek-Kywong Road, extending box culverts.

Parks & Gardens

The Rock staff have installed remembrance seating in the Avenue of Honour and they do look amazing.

Staff have been busy hand watering street trees and non-irrigated garden beds. Staff are also preparing to close down our two pools for the off-season while also carrying out maintenance of buildings and the surrounds.

We have welcomed two new members of staff to our parks and gardens team in February and both have fitted in well and are having an immediate impact on work rosters.

Our sports fields will get some extra attention as the football season draws closer and preparations are in place to ensure our war memorials are ready for Anzac Day commemorations.

Biosecurity

Weed Control Program

Priority has been given to the control of Silverleaf nightshade (*Solanum elaeagnifolium*), Horehound (*Marrubium vulgare*), Bathurst burr (*Xanthium spinosum*), Feathertop Rhodes grass (*Chloris virgata*), and Purple-flowered devil's claw (*Proboscidea louisianica*) on roadside reserves and council managed land.

Bathurst burr (Xanthium spinosum) was controlled on Bahrs Lane, Benders Lane, Boyds Road, Crowes Lane, Dunleveys Lane, Frank Westblade Lane, Humphrys Lane, Jaegars Lane, Klimpschs Lane, Krauses Lane, Maffra Lane, Moores Bus Route, Richters Lane, The Rock Collingullie Road, Tuttys Lane, Vennells Lane, and Wide Lane.

Feathertop Rhodes grass (*Chloris virgata*) was controlled on Albury Road, Soldier Settlement Road, and Yuluma Road.

Horehound (*Marrubium vulgare*) was controlled on Albert Smiths Lane, Alma Park Road, Bankvale Road, Calare Lane, Carns Lane, Carrolls Lane, Clancys Lane, Dick Knobles Road, Dunleveys Lane, Ellis Lane, Figtree Road, Fletts Lane, Forcks Lane, Krauses Lane, Lehdeys Lane, Long Park Road, Lockhart Kywong Road, Maffra Lane, Munyabla Munyaplah Road, Osborne Pleasant Hills Road, Pleasant Hills Road, Richters Lane, Scheuners Lane, Scotts Lane, Semlers Road, Spurrells Road, Tara Boundary Road, Woodend Fiveways Road, Wolters Lane, and Zwecks Lane.

Purple-flowered devil's claw (*Proboscidea Iouisianica*) was controlled on Webbs Lane.

Silverleaf nightshade (*Solanum elaeagnifolium*) was controlled on Crowes Lane, Frank Westblade Lane, French Park Bullenbong Road, Hendersons Road, Mortons Lane, Old French Park Bullenbong Road, Urana Boree Creek Road, and Wide Lane.

St. Barnaby's thistle (*Centaurea colstitialis*) was controlled on Jaegars Lane and Klimpschs Lane.

St. John's wort (*Hypericum* perforatum) was controlled on Jaegars Lane, Klimpschs Lane, and Lockhart Kywong Road.

The back lanes of The Rock and Yerong Creek townships were also sprayed.

Riverina Regional Weeds Committee Meeting

On February 7 Council's Environmental Officer attended the Riverina Regional Weeds Committee Meeting, held in Wagga Wagga. Issues raised included:

The use of social media for weed detection

Delegates reports showed most councils, including Lockhart Shire Council, have experienced multiple germinations of Silverleaf nightshade (*Solanum elaeagnifolium*) and St. John's wort (*Hypericum* perforatum) due to continuous rainfall events in spring and early summer.

CSIRO has begun African boxthorn (*Lycium ferocissimum*) biocontrol trials at Hay.

Alligator weed (*Alternanthera philoxeroides*) has been found in the ACT in waterways that feed into the Murrumbidgee River system.

Council Snippets 18 March 2024

Weed risk assessment of Sticky nightshade (*Solanum sisymbriifolium*) and proposed inclusion in the regional priority weeds list, with the category eradication.

Review of the regulatory status of Frogbit (*Limnobium laevigatum*) and potential removal from the prohibited matter list.

The use of drones in weed inspections.

Guest speaker was representative of Rapid Logix Technologies, regarding universal spray flow tracking, recording and mapping technology that may make record keeping and weed control activities easier.

Social media

Emphasis has been made of the use of social media as an avenue for weed distribution. Many discoveries of weed plant matter have occurred on Facebook, Gumtree, Ebay, and Buy, Swap, Sell sites. Weed plants and seeds have been found for sale, as well as offered for free. Searches on Facebook's Lockhart Buy, Sell and Swap Group did not lead to the discovery of any weeds but interestingly one resident who regularly applies for the firewood collection permit is selling firewood commercially. As such, future applications for firewood collection will be denied.

Lockhart was declared a Peace Town on 23 February 1999 as part of a broader Rotary International initiative.

The declaration was commemorated by the unveiling of a plaque at Hodgson Park.

Lockhart Shire Council uses electronic lodgement of Development Applications (DA), Construction Certificates (CC), Complying Development Applications (CDC) & Section 68 through the <u>NSW Planning Portal</u>. Applicants will need to establish their own account and then lodge their DA's, CC's and CDC's. For further information or for assistance please contact our Planning & Building team.

This is the process that Council recommends you follow:

 Contact our Planning Team on 02 6920 5305 to discuss your application or to arrange a pre lodgement meeting if required.

Visit the <u>NSW Planning Portal</u> to <u>Register</u> for a NSW Planning Portal account to start your application. This will enable you to access your dashboard, view, manage, track and progress applications, pay state agency fees and submit documents. You will also receive email notifications at key stages of the application process.

Log in to complete the online application form.

- For DA's and CC's you will need to submit a State of Environmental Effects, owner's consent, cost estimate report as well as all supporting plans and documents.
- For CDC's you will need to submit a certificate of title, site plan, design plans, structural plans and building specifications.
- Once we receive your application, Council will do a preliminary assessment and contact you to arrange payment of fees or request additional information.
- Once Council is satisfied with the information provided and fees are paid, your application can be lodged.

Council encourages all applicants to arrange a pre lodgement meeting with the Planning & Building team to ensure all required paperwork is ready before lodgement.



Some residents are still placing nappies and adult continence pads in BioBags and then in the Green Lidded Bin. This is a NO NO.

Please place all nappies and continence pads and other contaminates in the Red Lidded General Waste Bin.

Nappy management in general waste bins

Nappies must go in the general waste (red lidded) bin. Nearly all bins smell a bit and particularly bins containing nappies. Here are some ways to minimise odours:

- tip nappy contents into the toilet before you throw the nappy into the bin
- wrap nappy tightly into itself and use the tabs to secure
- tie nappy in a compostable bag, removing air
- store your rubbish bin in the shade
- make sure the lid can close properly
- add odour neutralisers such as bi-carb soda to your bin.

FOGO - Caddy Liner Bags

As part of the introduction of the Food Organics Garden Organics (FOGO) to Lockhart Shire Council's waste collection service in 2020 Council free caddy liner bags were available to residents during the three year transition period. This roll out was funded by a grant from the NSW Government.

Moving forward, to encourage the use of the FOGO service, and in line with our sustainability goals, Council will continue to provide, free of charge, **two** rolls of caddy liner bags per year to residents upon request from April 2023. A record of the bags distributed will be kept to assist in monitoring the supply.


